Israel is known as a Start-Up Nation. The Dayton Region's Connections with Israel are through: People, Education, and Economy. The DRITA Partnership was started in 2010 with Montgomery County, Dayton Development Coalition, and the City of Dayton. Industry targets include: Aerospace, Medical Technology, IT, and Advanced Manufacturing. Outcomes to date: 380+ business documents and agreements have been signed for close to \$8M in new business opportunities for local business. During the February 2020 Trade Mission there were 31 visits with companies, Rotary, Chambers of Commerce, municipalities, and organizations. Two take-a-ways from the trip for Carolyn:
