At the request of school nurses and administration, we also provided them with a wide selection of uniform khaki pants and youth underwear, apparently often-needed items. 

Safety Locator Signs for the Great Miami River Bike Trail

This project will improve signage and make the Riverway, particularly the bike trail, feel more inviting, comfortable, and safe. For many years, the Dayton area has invested in the development and promotion of bike trails to help our communities stay active and healthy. The Great Miami Riverway, a coalition of cities, counties, and park districts, is working with first responders and bike trail users to design and install a unified, regional safety locator sign program.

The emergency locator signs will be installed on existing bike trail signs to help first responders locate people who call 911 for assistance more quickly. The signs are 3" by 12" vinyl stickers that will wrap on the current bike trail sign posts. Currently, no emergency locators are installed on the Great Miami River Recreation trail, making it difficult for first responders to locate recreation users that need assistance. Trail users find it difficult to know exactly where they are on a trail because there are few location signs and jurisdictional boundaries are not marked. Emergency access and safety was identified as a top priority by the Great Miami Riverway stakeholders.

In order to ensure trail users know how to use the locator signs to receive emergency responder assistance, an outreach and education campaign will be conducted. Rotarians can get involved with this project by helping educate trail users at events like "Bike to Work Day", and "Trails Opening Day". Rotarians can also get involved by helping survey trail users at these events and ask questions about safety conditions,

known concerns, and perceived threats. The information gathered will help the Great Miami Riverway plan future safety projects.

The Rotary Wheel and club name will be displayed on promotion materials about the emergency locator sign program. The support of Dayton Rotary will be mentioned in media releases about the program.

Youth Water Safety Program

During the remaining months of the 2019-2020 Rotary calendar year, the Youth Water Safety Program is partnering with the City of Dayton and the Miami Conservancy District to provide water safety educational materials.

At the 2017 Rotary International convention in Atlanta, past Club President Sue Taylor and Kelly Lehman became interested in bringing a water safety program 🔼 being used by Rotary Clubs nationwide, "Josh the Otter," to our own community after a series of local drownings.

After a small trial run in 2018 & 2019, our Club, with the help of a matching grant from the District Grants Committee, was able to purchase 1,000 books, coloring books and stickers for pre-K through 5th grade students.

This year, the outreach with the City of Dayton recreational center pools will benefit young people in Dayton primarily. We had planned to conduct a teacher's workshop and distribute materials at The UD Children's Water Festival unfortunately the event has been cancelled for this year. However we will look for other ways to get the educational materials into the hands of our community.



The goal of the Josh the Otter Water Safety Program is to educate children with a fun and simple message: TO STAY AWAY FROM WATER UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT.

"Josh the Baby Otter" was created to help children comprehend and remember this important message. Ultimately, we want to create a water safety behavior for all children that will be passed on from generation to generation.
