This Happened Last Monday Continued

750,000-900,000 sf of employment opportunity, 1,350,000-1,500,000 sf (1350-1500 units) of housing, 75,000—85,000 sf of retail/active use, 35,000 sf of community use space, approximately 8 acres of open space and 1 mile of new streets. The estimated number of jobs to be created withing the district is approximately



3,000 with an average salary of \$50,000. The only building that still remains from



the former Fairgrounds is the Roundhouse building it is secured and will be repurposed and will be the Centerpoint of Roundhouse Plaza. Canal Park will be a point of function and beauty as it will be where storm water is collected. Other features of the District will include the Bluff which will connect the District to Downtown, Think Dayton Building and Plaza, The Community Trail (connecting the District to the River) and Main Street which will be the connecting seam and support multi-

ple transportation modes.

Site preparation including dismantling Barn 17 for reconstruction at Carillon Park and securing the Roundhouse. Then moved on to demolition of 19 structures.

OnMain's Development Approach: set the stage for development and own the underlying land in perpetuity, establish the site layout and the design guidelines and create the platform for development, seek partners who share our vision and commitment and allow them to secure financing via long term leases.



A catalytic building, supported by each of the partners, serves as an anchor for the initial phase of development of the district and shows momentum. The building would reflect the interest and needs of each institution.





Housing units will be residential worker housing making some units affordable for entry level positions for those who work around the district. Housing units will come in the second phase however.



Funding and Timing: At this point due to the Corona Virus the timing is tentative as Premier and UD are delaying spending with the unknown how things will recover from the Pandemic.

Tips on How to Take a Screen Shot

For MAC users:

Take a screenshot on your Mac

You can capture the entire screen, a window, or just a portion of the screen.

How to take a screenshot on your Mac



- 1. To take a screenshot, press and hold these three keys together: Shift, Command, and 3.
- If you see a thumbnail in the corner of your screen, click it to edit the screenshot. Or wait for the screenshot to save to your desktop.


How to capture a portion of the screen



- 1. Press and hold these three keys together: Shift, Command, and 4.
- Drag the crosshair + to select the area of the screen to capture. To move the selection, press and hold Space bar while dragging. To cancel taking the screenshot, press the Esc (Escape) key.



- 3. To take the screenshot, release your mouse or trackpad button.
- If you see a thumbnail in the corner of your screen, click it to edit the screenshot. Or wait for the screenshot to save to your desktop.



For PC users:

Take a snip of what's on your screen

Press Windows logo key # + Shift + S to open the snipping bar, then drag the cursor over the area you want to capture. The area you snipped will be saved to your clipboard.
