This Happened Last Monday

The Rotary Club of Dayton met virtually on Zoom starting at noon on Monday, June 22, 2020, with approximately 80 participants. This meeting had been planned by the Red Ribbon Committee as Red Ribbon Takeover Day and Wendy Lewis convened the meeting as Secretary for the Day. For the invocation, Nick Warrington offered a prayer of thanksgiving followed by the Four-Way Test and Pledge of Allegiance. Nick covered the news of the day including social media interference with signup for the Trump rally in Tulsa and the discovery of a 68-million-year-old fossilized egg in Antarctica believed possibly to be that of a mosasaur. He also provided the latest COVID-19 statistics.

Robert Woodhull welcomed guests and visitors. Although there were no identified guests at that point, later in the meeting Wayne Davis, City Manager of Centerville, introduced himself as a visiting Rotarian from the Centerville Club. Wendy Lewis invited Rotarians to participate in the Virtual Breakfast on Friday, June 28, at 8:00 A.M., and the Virtual Wine Social Event on Thursday, July 2, at 6:00 P.M. She also noted an upcoming Rotary Dines Out at the Carillon Brewing Company on July 16, at 6:00 P.M. Wendy then recognized birthdays of the following Rotarians: Lorna Dawes, Jim Gallagher, John Keller, Jessica Barry, Jeff Schiavone, Diane Welborn, and Mike Pabst.

Wendy invited Day Tens. The first was offered by Kim Bramlage to recognize Wendy's service as Secretary for the Day and also to announce that Five Rivers Health Centers will offer free COVID-19 testing at two popup locations this week. On Wednesday, the test will be offered from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. at the Greene County Health Center, 360 Wilson Drive in Xenia. On Thursday, testing will occur at the Samaritan Health Center, 921 S. Edwin C. Moses Boulevard in Dayton.

Many other Rotarians offered Day Ten contributions, including Alan Moscowitz, Iris Juergens, Lorna Dawes, Bill Nance, Mike Pabst, and Diane Farrell, who invited Rotarians to participate in the Big Read project of the Dayton Metro Library that includes a book on racism available for unlimited borrowing in ebook or audio format through July 31. The Dayton Metro Library and Dayton Daily News will sponsor a livestream panel to discuss racism on July 8, from 5:00 to 6:00 P.M. Panelists will include Rotarians Shannon Isom and Brian Martin. This Happened Last Monday Continued

Many of the Day Ten contributions were designated for the Red Ribbon Committee's project to raise \$10,000 for the Dayton VA Veterans Food Pantry. Other Rotarians offered donations to this project through the Zoom online chat or noted contributions already made to the project through the Dayton Foodbank Website. Wendy Lewis recognized the members of the Red Ribbon Committee and then introduced the guest speakers, Ryan Pleasants, Chief of Voluntary Services, and Vivian Akins, Voluntary Services Specialist, from the Dayton Veterans Administration Medical Center. They discussed how they worked with the Dayton Foodbank to identify food insecurity as a significant issue faced by veterans. Once the need was identified, it took five weeks to get the VA Foodbank into operation, identifying space in a multi-purpose area and repurposing refrigerators from VA Food Services for cold storage. They began operation in November 2018 and served 195 families during the first week. Distribution had occurred twice a month until pandemic considerations caused them recently to readjust to once a month distribution. Using the same questionnaire as the Dayton Foodbank, they discovered that most of the veterans had never used a foodbank before but feel more comfortable using the foodbank designated specifically for veterans and their families. Most of the veterans have been gracious and appreciative of the resource. The VA Foodbank personnel cooperate with some of the medical divisions of the VA to coordinate food distribution with client appointments. The staff has developed flexibility to get food to veterans who cannot come to the Foodbank due to disability, allowing proxies and using volunteers. In response to a question, the speakers indicate that they collaborate with social workers from the Montgomery County Veteran Services and other organizations.

Wendy Lewis thanked the speakers and invited other topics. Frank Scott noted that he had participated in the online Rotary International convention over the weekend and that 8,500 Rotarians around the world were present for the keynote addresses on Sunday. Greg Birkemeyer reminded Rotarians that the breakout sessions continue throughout the week and registration is free. One of the sessions this morning had covered the topic of conducting virtual online meetings.

President Jean Maychack noted that a survey will be distributed to Rotary members in the very near future and urged participation. Iris Juergens reported that contributions for the Dayton VA Foodbank so far total \$7,150, which is 71% of the Red Ribbon Committee's goal of \$10,000.

Wendy Lewis adjourned the meeting, noting that next week's meeting will include the Changing of the Guard at the end of the Rotary year.


