Deploying UAS in Response to the 2019 Dayton Tornados

The approaching first anniversary of the 2019 Memorial Day tornados provides an opportunity to review and consider the response and recovery efforts made possible through the employ-



ment of Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) during that trying time. This presentation highlights the efforts of the Sinclair College National UAS Training and Certification Center in the immediate aftermath and ensuing weeks following the storms as the community sought to assess the damage and recover from one of the worst natural disasters to affect the region since the 1913 flood. Examples of the types of missions, variety of aircraft and sensors, range of data analyses and products, and review of collaborating stakeholders and partners will be provided.
