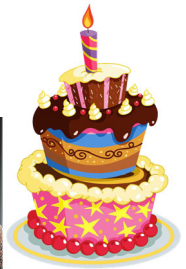

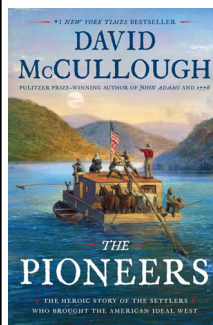

A momentum market means there is opportunity for impact in the market. Chris shared that he grew up in hospitality out in California however his wife is a native Daytonian. The Idea Collective moved to Dayton in 2016 to work on concept planning for the Fireblock Development.

They started a local Hospitality Company here Four Front Hospitality group under which they run the full service cocktail lounge, Tender Mercy which opened 3 days prior to being closed for the pandemic. Tender Mercy is unique as they have their signature cocktails on draft which allows for consistency and faster service. And he also shared with us renderings of Sueño a contemporary

Mexican restaurant that will hopefully open in the spring of 2021. When asked how he thought the pandemic would affect restaurants he shared that he thinks that 30-35% will not make it through this pandemic intact.
