This Happened Last Monday

President Brian Martin called the meeting to order at 12:00 noon and asked Bill Nance to lead the invocation, 4-Way Test, Pledge of Allegiance and share the news of the day. Bill's invocation focused on Better Letters, for instance both "love" and "hate" have four letters. Which do you choose?

Secretary Kim Bramlage then came to the virtual podium to introduce visitors. Visitors included Vineeta Reehl from India (Rotary District 326), JP Nauseef from Jobs Ohio, General Tom Owen from the Air Force, Major Greg Roth from the Air Force and Wendy Varhegyi from the Air Force. This week's birthdays were announced with a few childhood memories shared. Rotarians recognized for birthdays were Gary Gottschlich, John Kidd, Bill Weaner and Susie Weaver.

President Brian Martin came back to the virtual podium to introduce Jeff Hoagland as Chair of the Day. Jeff introduced our speaker, General Arnold W. Bunch Jr., Commander Air Force Materiel Command (AFMC), Wright Patterson Air Force Base. General Bunch graciously thanked Dayton Rotary for all of its efforts to build a support network for the airmen. General Bunch acknowledged that the Dayton area helps the airmen feel welcomed and at home when they are off the base. General Bunch described that his father-in-law was a Rotarian.

General Bunch's presentation covered 1) a general description of AFMC and 2) a description of the focus areas for the General since he came to AFMC.

AFMC was established in 1992 and is one of ten major commands in the Air Force. AFMC includes approximately 87,000 airmen operating at 173 installations around the world with a budget of \$67 billion. AFMC includes many units which support the other major commands in fulfilling the mission. On a combined basis the AFMC units cover a spectrum of services including procurement of assets, testing of assets prior to deployment into the field, supply chain management, information systems development and support services for the airmen such as living quarters, dining services, childcare and security.



Since assuming the command of AFMC, General Bunch has had two major areas of focus - a survey of the airmen and the pandemic response. The survey of the airmen has resulted in a renewed focus on facility improvements, information systems, supervisory training and connecting all airmen to the mission. During the pandemic AFMC has shifted work, where possible, to telework. Overall, this has led to some less efficient processes yet no decline in the effectiveness of fulfilling its mission. The pandemic has increased the pace of technological changes.

Other areas of focus for the General have been the privatization of housing to support the airmen and their families and the diversity and inclusion efforts of the command.

President Brian posed questions to the General that Rotarians had submitted in the Zoom chat box. The General graciously responded to all the questions.

Secretary Kim Bramlage asked for any Day Tens.
