

ROTARY INFORMATION John Schubert My Year as President 1987 – 1988



Member Athar Yagoub proudly introduced John Schubert.

John attended Burnside Primary school before going onto Pulteney Grammar, he started work in January 1956, in the family business of Schubert & Sons, Monumental Masons, becoming the 4th generation Schubert to enter the business, which was established in 1862 in the then village of Hahndorf.

He became a director in the company in 1970 and then Managing Director in 1976.



In 1997, after 41 years in the industry, John was recognised by the then Apprenticeships and Training Board as a Master Monumental Mason, qualified to train apprentices in all aspects of Monumental Masonry.

John's life in Rotary began in 1977 when he joined the Rotary Club of Campbelltown, he has served as Vice President (four times), Secretary (twice), Director (many times) and Sergeant. He became President of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown in 1987-1988.

He has also been very active in his Church, serving on the Church Council of the Flinders St. Lutheran Church for over 20 years.

John and his wife Gwenda are now both adjusting very well to retirement, enjoying fishing and relaxing at their holiday home on Yorke Peninsula, they have three children, eight grandchildren and two Great Grandchildren. Their son, Steven, is now managing the family business working with his elder sister as his Office Manager, which can sometimes lead to an interesting situation.

John then spoke on his year as RCC President 1987 – 1988

To try to get this year in to perspective, this was the year that Aaron Stobie was born! 34 Years ago, when I was 49 years old.



On the 29th June 1987 I was inducted by Past President Dean Fleming to be the 21st President of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown and the Board for this year consisted of my secretary Ted Fletcher, Vice President David Richards, President Elect Ian Reddy, Past President Dean Fleming, Treasurer Alwyn Shepherd and Director of Community Service PDG Kevin Parkinson, Director of International John Whitfield, Project Director (a bearded) Mal Hansen, Vocational Service Director Stan McFee and Youth Director Kerrin March. I also had Reg Bennett responsible for printing and posting the Bulletin every week, Duncan

Elsdon was in charge of Fellowship, **Reg Neale** was on Program and **Tony Uren** was my sergeant. To paraphrase from my report for the year – it is almost impossible to summarise a year in a brief report. As a Club we shared grief and sorrow, laughter, frustration, work, and more work.

Being President of our Club, a position that I had previously held awe, was a great honour and I would not have missed it for the world.



Under the Chair of Kevin Parkinson, the major project for the year was the building of a Secure Garden at the North Eastern Community Hospital. This was a project that was under the watchful eye of past member Kevin Hales and cost \$13,500-00, which was exactly half of the total money raised for the year. Most of the members of the Club attended the working bees at some time or other and we all had, I am sure, a sense of achievement and satisfaction in recognising that our reward of the many hours of work was knowing the benefit to the people and

patients of the Hospital. We also demolished a house at Scott Creek and raised \$2,366-00 from the sale of the materials. This amount just about covered the cost of the Band-Aids given out to members.

I would like to share a quote from Kevin Parkinson from his report on Community Service.

"This is a marvelous committee to work on. Other committees work hard to raise the money which we can spend in serving the community. Our thanks must go to the Project and Art Show Committees for, without their commitment to fundraising we would merely be a discussion group. The fact that the Community Service committee has had a year of solid achievement is a consequence of Service above Self of all of our Club members."



My personal high for the year had to be the celebration of our 1,000th meeting on the 30th

Nov 87. There were several reasons for this -1) it was the only meeting for the year that we achieved a true 100% attendance -2) We had a total of 162 members and guests in attendance -3) I had the pleasure of meeting and befriending Past World Rotary International President Clem Renouff, who as our guest speaker posed the question "Dare we Stand on our Record?"

Under the Chairmanship of Stan McPhee, the Vocational committee arranged a careers information night at Campbelltown High School (now Charles Campbell), we held a debate on whether women should be allowed in Rotary –

which was very informative and entertaining - and we visited some members' places of business with Peter Rumbelow (who was then Chief Manager of Property at the Bank of SA) arranging a visit to the new State Bank building and David Tuckwell organised a visit to Top Brand Fertilizer, we also visited Bennett's Pottery at Magill.

Mal Hansen was Chairman of the then Project Committee (now Fundraising) and was responsible for the Annual Auction and Jumble Sale. One of the traditions of that time was to have a Post Auction BBQ or Chinese, where we would swap stories of the day. (The later the hour the better the stories). We had many other fundraising projects including, District Governors Port, Theatre Nights, Pickled Onions Nights and Quiz nights. We trialed two Shed Sales in Benjamin Street, mainly to help reduce the clutter of the Shed, and it was recommended that these should become a regular event.

The Art Show was managed by Graham Wallis and we received a total of 860 entries. 162 paintings were sold and together with the sales



from porcelain and other funds achieved a gross profit of \$9,734-00. All together under Malcolm the committee raised over \$27,000-00 for the year, which was a fantastic result – although we actually managed to spend over \$28,000-00 on all our projects!



Another milestone was achieved under the guidance of David Richards who, as our Club Polio Plus Chairman, with his committee and the Fellowship Committee, organised a Woolshed Dance that was held in a shed on the property of Elliott and Pauline Musolino's at Houghton. The music for the night was Country and Western provided by Johnny Mac. This night along with sales of Raffle tickets, theatre and film nights successfully exceeded all fund-raising expectations in not only meeting but surpassing our Club target of \$10,000-00, when they raised \$10,500-00 making our Club the highest contributor to the Polio Plus campaign in the then District 952.

My Sergeant-at-arms was Tony Uren who confessed that he didn't always state "The Truth" and it wasn't always "Fair to all Concerned"

We received 4 resignations through the year and inducted 6 new members – including John Bennett.

Not all of the projects were winners, I quote from the late Gill Williams – who

reported on The Probus Club, was the Club Almoner, Historian and also held the ill-fated position of Librarian. "Our Club library, conceived in ecstasy, has been aborted by indifference. I recommend that this project be abandoned."

It didn't quite see the year out!

Following my year as President I was asked to be Assistant Governor to Group 6, which included Unley, Brownhill Creek, Mitcham, Eastwood and Hyde Park clubs,

I then served on various district committees for the next 14 years.

President Steph thanked John for such an informative & interesting talk on his Presidency & what went on in his year. He has rekindled fond memories for some and enlightened others who were not there those 30+ years ago. Thank you so much John .
