



- MC for the night was Aaron Stobie & the organ music for the carols, Stephanie Neale.
- A big thank you to Fellowship Director Denise Dinham and her committee for organising another great night and to celebrate Christmas.
- The only official function for the night was a presentation by Val & Mal Hansen on the history of CROE (Campbelltown Rotary Outback Experience) and most importantly a cheque for \$305,000 handed over to Kristen Newlyn from the RFDS representing the total money raised by the 10 CROE trips held since 2004.

Mal started his presentation with...- Firstly, let me explain the meaning of the acronym CROE, ....note.... this has nothing to do with the Football team, or even the bird. Tony Uren came up with CROE in 2003. Campbelltown Rotary Outback Experience.

then thanking sponsors for CROE 10, Paradise Motors, Colin Steinert and Di Watson (passed CROE attendee)

Then handed to me (Val) to do mine.....

Mal and I began organising CROE events in 2003, after doing Annual 10-day Rotary Bush Trips from 1987 to 2002.

Since 2004 we have organised and ran 10 such events.

It has been a great experience for everyone.

We both really felt that we wanted to raise much needed funds for RFDS, but also to enable Rotarians and friends to go out into the real outback and to see the beautiful country of ours, through our eyes e.g. not just sealed roads and high end Motels and hotels.

The decision was made to have everything provided for, eg. all meals, beds, entertainment etc. with Mal and I organising the route to be taken and the logistics of finding enough beds for all those that needed one and to find suitable caterers by doing this we felt we would be helping outback communities

As a result of all this planning and preparation we have....

Generally followed dirt roads, not the sealed road, that may even have run parallel with it. We have travelled on the Old Stuart Highway, potholes, bull dust and all. In addition, we have covered many kms on, the Oodnadatta Track, Birsdville and Strezlecki tracks. Followed the road that runs beside the Indian Pacific train line, enjoyed Googs Track, crossed the barren part of the Nullarbor, from north to south and parts of the old Eyre Highway, to name just some of them.



We have Been as far west as Cook, and as far East as Tibooburra in NSW.

As far north as the APY lands and as far south as Loxton.

We have stayed in various forms and standards of accommodation. From very nice cabins to not

much better than a mattress on the floor. Motels, Hotels, Shearers Quarters of various standards - even in what was to be a Glamping tent which turned out not quite glamping! Possibly the most talked about accommodation is the Gladstone Goal, where everyone got to choose their own cell to sleep in. a great night. Yes we always found a bed of some sort for those who wished to have one.

Campers have supplied their own swag, tent or camper.

We have eaten some very fine food, steaks, whiting, oysters, prawns: and some that I could only describe as "different" . eg Kangaroo tails, cooked traditionally at Mimili in the APY Lands and voted as quite good. But Not to



be outdone while at Iga Werta we were served Kangaroo cooked traditionally, but almost still

hopping complimented with raw baked pumpkin. This was despite, while doing a reccy, we were given assurance by the Elder that all would be perfect on the night - he must've forgotten!! We were given a Dingo Lunch while at Moomba.









(after a gourmet morning tea and tour of the plant!). This was a very large, packed lunch each, to have while on the Strezlecki Track.

We have had various types of Entertainment and visited various sites. - Singers such as Peter Coad and Coad Sisters on 8 of the 10 events.

We have been entertained by Mimili women dancing traditionally, A Recycling Depot,

The Moomba gas plant, Toured Maralinga Bomb site, Loxton Historical Village

Also, the Loveday Internment Camp (currently a private residence), Participants were privileged to tour it, it is the only habitable camp within Aust and is not open for tours.

We did a tour of the school of the air at Tibooburra in NSW, and Anlaby Historic house and gardens.

A boat tour on the Cooper Creek. and had an eerie tour of the Gladstone Goal, this is to name just a few of the things enjoyed.

Beer drinkers have been in the bar at the Tibooburra Pub, Packsaddle Pub both in NSW also Cameron Corner, William Creek, Mintabie Opal field, Underground in Coober Pedy, Innamincka and Nullarbor Pub.

We have auctioned or raffled such things as Air Flights, from west, to east. We have auctioned diving with seals and sharks, Balloon Flights, Fishing trips and various accommodation packages

As I have already said, we have been fed by many and dined in many different places.... including Nursing Homes, Hospitals, Hotels, CWA halls, Sports Clubs, Station properties, properties owned by other organisations, Maralinga Mess Hut, Self-catered in the bush, but always had a good feed of something.



We have experienced many types of 4x4 tracks, including sand, mud, water and mountain ranges and gorges.

While doing all of this our main focus is in raising funds, and would incorporate local people wherever possible, by providing entertainment to them, and holding auctions etc. We appealed to businesses to sponsor us with a donation to RFDS. Many business houses donated items for auctions, from small items to some very large ones.

We have donated money to other charities, in lieu of

paying directly to the station for a meal, e.g., Isolated Children & Parents Association, School of the Air, other RFDS Auxiliaries, Sports Clubs and CWA to name a few. Angel Flight and Australian Rotary Health has also benefited. We have also made many outback communities and groups not only aware of Rotary and what Rotary is, but also Campbelltown Rotary. The name of the Club has been spread far and wide.

We have taken Rotarians from many different clubs, including from clubs in Victoria and also Malaysia. Friends of Rotarians have always been welcomed.

One such couple from Victoria, Paula and Charlie, became a big part of CROE with Paula being one of













the sergeants and entertainment officer... But sadly, they could not join us this year, or for this evening. We took a District Governor on our first CROE and also on our 10th event.

So - it is with mixed feelings and emotions that I say this is the final CROE that Mal and I will arrange, naturally if anyone else wishes to continue them we would do our best to support them if requested.

We will continue to support the vital services of RFDS whenever possible.

Not only did it raise the profile of Rotary within the community and outback it raised much needed funds for the RFDS. It touched the lives of many people, away from the bustle of the big smoke and raised hope & strong bonds of friendship & goodwill wherever the CROE map took them. Mal & Val are to be congratulated. They shared their love & intimate knowledge of the outback with everyone, making the Campbelltown **R**otary **O**utback Experience true to its

name. A totally unique experience, a successful fundraiser, and a lot of fun!

On the following day Ralph Holmes added the following comments: -

Following some discussions about CROE and interest expressed to hear a little more, I thought I would add some more information regarding the dollars raised and contributed - let's leave the RFDS until last.

Participants on the CROE 10 trip contributed

- \$9,682 to drought affected stations owners by way of accommodation and meals
- \$1,780 to other not for profit organisations form meals and excursions

- \$3,298 to Flinders Ranges small businesses for food (not to mention fuel and other expenses not processed through the CROE account)

- \$2,500 to Australian Rotary Health.

The RFDS has received from Participants on CROE 10, the wonderful donors and Sponsors including our fantastic Paradise Mazda family, Rotarians of the great Rotary Club of Campbelltown and the wonderful people in the bush with whom we met on CROE 10 a grand total of \$46,364.68 (with the last RFDS fundraising tin to be counted).

A heartfelt thankyou to all involved, but particularly Mal and Val Hansen.


