Payment for the dinner will be collected at our next meeting on 22nd November.

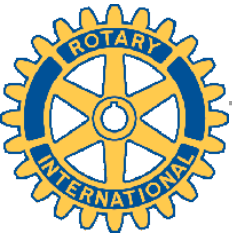

I was inducted as President by the outgoing President David Tuckwell on 1st July 1985 at a Changeover Dinner at the Reservoir Hotel.

The Office Bearers for the year ahead were Vice President Eric Webb, Secretary Joe Hudspith,

and the Treasurer John Whitfield.

District Governor was Kevin Parkinson – a member from the Campbelltown Rotary Club and as a consequence our Club was responsible for organizing and running a District Conference. Edward Cadman was Rotary World's President and his theme for the year was "YOU ARE THE KEY".

The year started with 55 members, 5 members were inducted during the year and 2 resigned with 58 members at the end of the Year.

Dinner Fees were \$7.50, and fines were 50cents for the 1st fine and 20 cents for the 2nd.

Fellowship – under Chairmanship of Peter Allen. Held various functions during the year with our Christmas Dinner held at Eagle On The Hill Hotel, bowls at Tranmere Bowling Club, Trots at Globe Derby, and barbecue after the Auction at Campbelltown Oval.

Our 20th Birthday Meeting was a night to remember, Charter Members together with their wives and our Past Presidents and their wives were all honoured – together with the Award of a Paul Harris Fellow to Gill Williams. Exchange student Karin's birthday was also celebrated.

A concert at Thorndon High School for 157 elderly folks in our Community- it was one of the highlights of the year for all that were present.

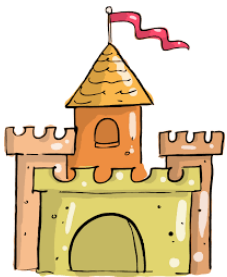

Behind the Badge -Dr Nigel Patrick Quadros- “Challenges that led to blessings”

- **Chair Tony Lagozzino introduced Dr Nigel Quadros who was inducted on 6 Sept 21**

Nigel is a physician who has specialised in Rehabilitation Medicine. He works at several public hospitals including the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Hampstead Rehabilitation Centre, Calvary Adelaide, and Griffith Rehabilitation hospitals. He is also a Senior Clinical Lecturer in Medicine at the University of Adelaide where he is involved in both undergraduate and post graduate medical teaching. His clinical interests are mainly in stroke and general neurological rehabilitation.

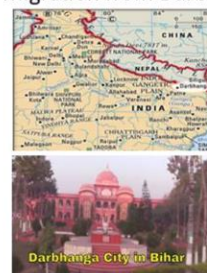
Today he is going to tell us about his personal life by sharing some of the challenges he has faced that have led to blessings.

- Nigel then spoke candidly about his life journey and some of the challenges he has faced, which in retrospect, has led to many blessings in his life. Usually, he talks about medical issues but tonight it is “behind the badge” & he has to speak about himself!

He was born in NE India with a Portuguese family background in [Darbhanga](#) but his parents originally came from Goa which had a strong Portuguese & thus Catholic heritage. His great Grandfather was Portuguese and a Colonel in the

Indian Army and married his great Grandmother who was English. His great Grandparents later farmed mangos & rice near Goa.

Nigel's father was a policeman & his mother a teacher. Nigel and his brother had a strong Catholic education & this continued when the family migrated to Perth Australia in May 71. The School in Perth was a Challenge as for the 1st time he and his brother were the only Asians attending at the time. They soon fitted in & he looks back to this era as a beautiful & fun time. In 1978 he enrolled at the Uni of WA and studied

Dentistry. (His brother has earlier graduated as an electronics engineer) He met difficulties in his 3rd year of the Course when he was subjected to discrimination because of his non-Anglo heritage and was twice failed and thus excluded from continuing.

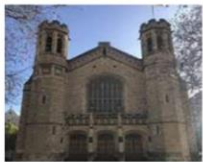

This was devastating but another sympathetic lecturer suggested to move to Adelaide to continue with the course there. This he did in 1978 and completed his Dentistry with Honours in 1984. He resided at Lincoln College and told some amusing stories about his student life. He also found his community spirit was nurtured there and he took an active role in starting a fellowship group for other foreign students, studying far from home without close family support. He was blessed at this time of developing more as a person & developing

his community engagement.

After finishing his Dentistry, he worked as research officer & was finding that he was looking to other fields to pursue his interests and passion. He realised he was more a people person than just technical.

He then enrolled in a medical degree and won a scholarship to do a PhD in Rheumatoid Arthritis. He was absorbed by his work and was aware, as the Skyhooks song, “all my friends were getting married...”

He met his future wife Judith at a party. She was also from India sponsored by her work, through ANZ, to move to Adelaide. They married in April 2000.

In Feb 2001, Nigel started feeling unwell which resulted in him being admitted to hospital on their 1st wedding anniversary 29 April 2001.

Biggest Challenge

Doctor has become a patient

The following day the Dr who he knew well found a lump on a scan, which was a tumor in his stomach.

After 9 hrs. of surgery, which should have been 4, he was told by the surgeon they were going to remove it, but it was too difficult, with a 40% chance of success so they could not do anything.

Hormonal treatment was the only other option, which he continues to this day. He recommended a book "Chicken Soup for the Cancer Survivor's Soul" "(A link is [HERE](#))"

The message of the book is to heal & motivate yourself, get yourself better, get down to a

healthy weight by following as best you can a healthy lifestyle, diet, exercise program & mindfulness. Avoid or manage stress whenever you can.

Alcohol is out, as it makes him very sick.

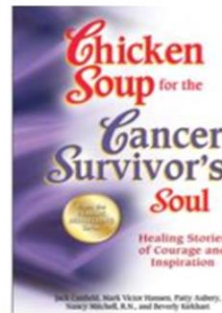
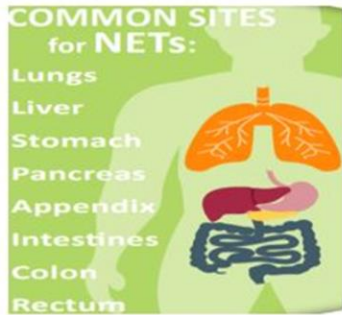
So, all these trials and challenges spurred him to help others & in 2004 Nigel qualified as a Rehabilitation Medicine Physician.

He specialises in Rehabilitating MS patients and Post-Polio syndrome sufferers.

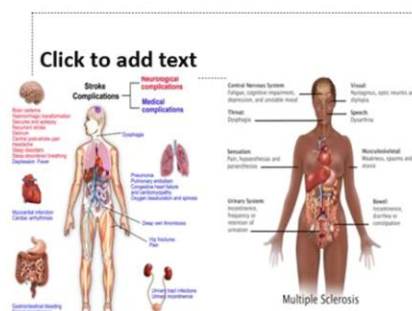
Nigel has learnt to live with his cancer which has, in retrospect, been a blessing.
