Guest Speaker – Esther Simbi Living well with disability



Chair Dr Nigel Quadros introduced Esther Simbi

Born in South Sudan to a poor peasant family and contracting polio as a child, Esther Simbi came to Australia in July 2005 as a refugee, and has resettled in the North Eastern suburbs of Adelaide, after living in extreme hardships in refugee camps in Uganda for 19 years. Esther is the youngest of six children and a single mother of two beautiful daughters. Since arriving in Australia, Esther has worked with Families SA and Disability SA in many roles. Esther worked with the Young Women's Christian Association in Adelaide as a Project Coordinator and she now works with Julia Farr Association, Purple Orange as a SKILL CALD Project Officer for people living with disability from CALD backgrounds.

Esther lives with post-polio syndrome which is associated with muscle weakening, headaches, fatigue, and general body exhaustion. With a strong belief that access to quality education gave her opportunities to establish a career as a Social Worker, as a Family Dispute Resolution Practitioner, and now as a published Author of the books Beyond Calamity and Blessed, through an emphasis on education, Esther now empowers others to understand that disability is not inability. Esther graduated with a bachelor's degree in Social Work and with a Master's degree in Mediation and Conflict Resolution from the University of South Australia. Esther is a motivational speaker, and she was also the Founder of, and the coordinator for, the Crossing the Bridge Project in 2014 which was aimed at supporting African Women with Disability in South Australia. Esther ran for Parliament with Dignity Party SA (formerly known as Dignity for Disability) in the Upper House as a Lead candidate for the 2018 South Australia's State Election in 2014 and she was also on the Dignity Party's Upper House ticket for the 2018 South Australia's State Election, representing people with disability in South Australia. Esther is a two-time community volunteer award winner for her work with African women with disability in South Australia and for leading African women from a refugee background in Australian politics.

Esther loves singing, writing, watching a good movie, catching up with family and friends for meals and Esther enjoys going for long drives.

Esther began "I live with a disability "

She recalled as a child, growing up in South Sudan after contracting polio and waking up one morning with a paralysed body. She grew up in a very poor family and her mother did all she could, to help her. Sometimes this was simply supporting her by tying her limbs between two poles so she could stand. At 7yo her family of 8, migrated to Uganda to a refugee camp & stayed for 19 years. She learnt English at the camp in expectation of a better life, which helped her when she arrived in Australia, but learning the Australian accent and slang was difficult at first but now she has mastered it. No worries, mate!

Living well with disability:- It is a choice. You can either be happy or sad .

She chose to be happy & to live a successful life.

As a child with a disability in her culture, she was considered by others as bad luck, but to her, it was good luck. Disability gave her strength!

"When you have a disability, it is not the end of you.

All that I am today is because of my mum, the people around me and my disability."

Practically she has to live with pain.

Post-Polio syndrome means her muscles get weaker as she ages. She wears a leg brace. She has a lot of pain in one knee, but she is still strong and can do a lot with her life & help others.

Esther then spoke on what she has achieved and her work in Australia.

"Against all odds, I was able to have children. I am working, contributing, and paying taxes.

How your story starts are not important, it is how your story ends that matters most."

Following question time John Gardner MP, spoke in support of Esther.

He knows Esther well and is inspired by how she works with and is committed to people with disability and

making a difference in the community, breaking down barriers & raising awareness.

"Esther also runs workshops, and the feedback is really good. Thanks to her many people with disabilities, their carers and loved ones, know more about what's available through the NDIS and what support services are available."

As this week is National Volunteers week, he spoke on the great works volunteers did within our community & thanked those who unselfishly gave their time and talents to help others.

Chair Dr Nigel Quadros thanked Esther for sharing her inspiring journey and wished her and her carer Jennifer all the best for the future.

He said it was profound for him reflecting on ANZAC day knowing that he and his son were looking at the sunrise and sharing the experience from their different vantage points. He confidently declared that his son is going to grow up to be an amazing man from all these experiences.





Since Tyler Copeland and Magnolia Gibbs, who we sponsored on the September trip of the Youth Sailing Challenge, were unable to attend the meeting, I read to the Club what they had written regarding their experience.

Tyler said that he learnt that he does not need cigarettes and that people are not too bad.

This is what Magnolia wrote:

What I have learnt about myself from this voyage is that when I ever start to doubt my abilities or lose courage, I have to remember that I'm not alone. There are always people who will want to help. I also learnt not to judge people straight up. For example, there's a boy on the boat who was very different from me, everything he did bugged me because he was just a normal, gross boy who just wanted people to laugh. The first few days he was really getting on my nerves. But, on the last day he made an amazing speech and confessed that he was struggling with suicide and depression a few weeks ago and this had changed his life. Thank you for giving me this experience!
