The first was the <u>1986</u>/87 year...the Theme ...ROTARY BRINGS HOPE. Club Secretary was Milton Lewis, the Vice President Tony Uren Fellowship was very high in our priorities.

In this year the Art Show started under the watchful eyes of Tony Uren and Peter Allen. The Art Show resulted in the sale of paintings worth \$21,339, which gave the club a profit of \$7,497. We also helped specific individual people ... ie Food Hamper, washing machine or home maintenance.

I had the pleasure of inducting into the club Kevin Day and Tom Mills. Karen Gunnerson, having completed her stay left to return to Sweden, as we welcomed a new Student Exchange Awardee Takato Funnabashi from Japan. Mark Pheiffer was our outgoing Student Exchange Awardee.

Included in overseas projects was help given to Past Rotarian John Zilm for the hospital in Zambia he was involved in.

During this Rotary Year planning was started to build a secure garden area at the NE Community Hospital so patients could enjoy the outdoors and the sun without the chance of them wandering off. Total Fundraising this year was \$18,548

Quiz Night, under the control of Quiz Master Tony Uren (and if you want a ripper of a quiz master, he is the man). The night raised money for Australian Rotary Health.

Past President Eric Webb together with Graham Wallis prepared a Video showing the Club's activities for the year Peter Rumbelow was President. This could be interesting viewing if we can locate it.

TOTAL MEMBERSHIP WAS 61 MEMBERS.

The second year that I was President was 2004/05, and the Theme was CELEBRATE ROTARY, being the 100th year of Rotary.

Again, Fellowship was very high on our agenda.

Club Secretary was Scott Nicholls with Graham Wallis as Vice President. I became President because a Family Member of the Elected President for the year was seriously ill.

6 new Members were inducted including Anthony Farrugia and Dean Crook, making a total membership of 77, with 2 Honorary Members.

This year's Fundraising resulted in a total of \$85,254 being raised. Paving in the shape and design of the Rotary Wheel was laid in Thorndon Park, with the installation of 3 electric barbecues thereon for the enjoyment of Park visitors. Project cost was \$27,283. Hard work, and a grant from the Rotary Foundation allowed for the provision of safe drinking water, toilets and kitchen facilities for 5 schools in Madras, India.

The Art Show was again well run with the total value of paintings sold being \$24,700 and a profit to the club of \$9350.

Kesab ... Clean up of Montacute Road undertaken by club members, being part of "Road Watch" The Stall at Carnevale, 2 days hard work, raised \$9,782.

CROE again enjoyed, well run by Mal and Val Hansen together with David Tuckwell. An Olympic Night saw the President (me!!!!) jogging in to light the cauldron. A LOT OF FUN

Thank you for allowing me to share a few facts of my years as president of this Great CLUB, and the Service given by Club Members.






It was heart warming to receive a message from Alina today thanking us and saying how they like the purchase. I think we have won over another customer and their connections.


