He urged all men to get a medical checkup and a PSA test - catch it early. Mal has had prostate cancer and speaks from experience.





Guest speaker Mr Richard Smith -The "City of Adelaide" Clipper Ship



• Chair Gus De Angelis recalled how he "had the pleasure of meeting our guest speaker Richard at a lunch meeting at the ADELAIDE CLUB some weeks ago.

During our discussion we discovered we had a strong synergy between us in construction and heritage.

Richard has expertise in strategic planning and constructionability issues.

His background Richard has undertaken PM and representative roles on larger projects, especially distress projects.

Richard has been a facilitator for various value management and strategic management workshops including for the Department of Building Management, Department of Defence, health and private clients, including Hansen and Yuncken and co-founding Director of Savant.


