
Rotary Information –My year as President- Peter Allen 1990-1991



Guest Speaker -Mr. Martin Haese - Topic Business SA



• Chair Jane Gascoigne introduced Mr Martin Haese who is the current Chief Executive Officer of Business SA and has an impressive track record as a business owner and entrepreneur. Having previously owned his own national retail companies, Youthworks and Sole Shoes, Martin founded and then grew the business to achieve annual sales of \$25 million, employ several hundred team members and oversaw a global supply chain. Following the sale of Youthworks and Sole Shoes in 2005, Martin opened Retail IQ, a specialist advisory business working with local governments in Australia and Real Estate Investment Trusts in Southeast Asia.

Martin co-founded the Entrepreneurs' Organisation in South Australia and has taught entrepreneurship for MBA students across the nation. From 2010 to 2013, Martin headed the Rundle Mall Management Authority, a subsidiary of the Adelaide City Council, where he led Rundle Mall's upgrade. As General Manager of the Rundle Mall Management Authority, Martin provided advocacy and program support for more than 700 retailers and 300 business and commercial property owners. He deeply understands the challenges facing SMEs.

In 2014, Martin successfully ran for the office of Lord Mayor of the City of Adelaide where he successfully served a four-year term. As Lord Mayor, Martin delivered a number of key innovations to drive economic growth in the city, including Ten Gigabit Adelaide, Australia's fastest fibre optic data network. He is highly respected by the business and employer community, has extensive networks and is well-regarded by all sides of politics.

Martin was born and raised in Adelaide and South Australia has always been his home.



Martin is married to Genevieve who was born in Singapore and educated in the United States and United Kingdom. Genevieve worked for a global advertising agency in London before founding her own media and wellness businesses in Singapore and Southeast Asia.

Despite the heavy workload and frenetic pace of public office, Martin was able to forge relationships and strengthen ties with people from all walks of life. He is as comfortable in conversation with the Works Department staff as he is in the company of Prime Ministers and other world leaders.

Martin is an accomplished public speaker having addressed several thousand local government, retail sector and entrepreneurship events in Australia, Asia and Europe, throughout his career.

While 'free time' is often a foreign concept, Martin enjoys reading, writing, nature and the arts but particularly music which he enjoys both actively and passively. Martin is also passionate about historic motoring and especially British vehicles from the 1960's.

Martin speaks conversational French and is learning Mandarin and Bahasa.

• Martin then gave a most interesting and candid talk on his background & history. His first retail business was at the Brickworks markets & it was there he learnt how to buy & sell, & to look after your clients. He believes in the role of service, and it serves well both in business, public & private life. When he started business there were no rule books, but he always had mentors he looked up to, and always asked a lot of questions.

His strong retail background & philosophy took him to pursue other endeavours. ie to do his MBA & later teaching MBA and eventually Lord Mayor of Adelaide. He spoke briefly on his role on Council and as Mayor. It was challenging, exciting, busy but it was always an honour & a privilege to serve. You just have to get on with it and put yourself and your reputation on the line.

Between 2014 -2018 he was home for dinner with his wife about 4 nights a year!

He spoke on the different challenges facing the City Councils. Simply put, Suburban Councils are mostly residential with some business, but City Councils are mostly business with some residential. You have to be collaborative & ensure the Council Chambers are a place for rational, considered debate & make those tough decisions in a timely manner.

In the service of Council, he has met, many good people, who are motivated by service.

He then spoke on Business SA, formerly SA Chamber of Commerce & it's history as being the oldest such business organisation in Australia, that can be traced back to 1839 founded in SA. Business SA -is bipartisan & not for profit, is membership driven and advocates and provides client services for members.

Covid has caused havoc for many members, and they have had a torrid time. Some businesses however have done better with covid, either by circumstances, demand for their niche services or by reinventing their business model to adapt.

Like us all, Business owners crave certainty most, so they can make the right decisions for the future.



When he was 23yo and running his shop at the Brickworks he discovered motivational books by Paul J Meyer of the Success Motivation Institute. He still believes in that philosophy. "You have to have the heart of a servant". It is true in life and business.

Martin concluded by saying "Service is embodied in the DNA of every Rotarian. Thank you for what you do and do so well- SERVICE."

At the conclusion of his talk Martin answered some questions ranging from climate change & his thoughts on the energy path in SA for the future too the challenges of being a City Mayor.
