ROTARY INFORMATION- The Role of the Treasurer – By Babu Kanagasabai

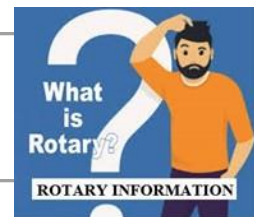
- **Treasurer Babu gave a detailed account of the treasurer's role .**

This is the second time that Babu has been the treasurer . His first was in 2019-2020 , taking on the role at short notice after the sad sudden death in August of the then treasurer Lee Alderhoven,

At the time Michael McCabe was a fantastic teacher and Babu a willing student !

Officially the Role of Rotary Club Treasurer is to :-

- Manage club funds
- Collect and submit dues and fees
- Report on the state of your club's finances
- Work with The Rotary Foundation
- Pay or view your club invoice.



A practical shortlist of the treasurer's role is :- Be responsible for the money in & out;record & book keeping in MYOB;banking; bank reconciliations; issue of authorised cheques; attendance at meetings , events & functions to perform treasurers duties;payment of bills once approved;providing a float, collection of moneies for events such as the Shed; fundraisers; pay the meeting venue (eg San Giorgio's) invoice based on meals & people attending as supplied by attendance officer etc

There are 7 Bank accounts and 4 signatories . All accounts are Audited.

A typical week :- Monday is the meeting , Tues-visit the shed & Banking ,Wed-enter into MYOB, every week bank statements and reconcile & must balance. Dean Fleming the auditor or Michael McCabe are a big help if there are any issues or queries. Thanks to them both.



Eg Before a Shed Sale-prepare float ,collect money, then Bank money.

Do bank balances every month & report to the Board meeting and Directors with regard to their spending and budget.



Guest Speaker – Mr. Michael Neale
Topic- Under the Bonnet, Bay to Birdwood



- Chair Jeff Blanco introduced guest speaker Michael Neale .**



Michael Neale was born into a motor industry family. Son of Reg and Shirley Neale, Reg a Charter Member of the Campbelltown Rotary Club, Michael (and his brother, District Governor Jeff) grew up attending Rotary family functions and he was heavily influenced by club members Tony Uren, Ian Reddy, Garth Holmes and Dave Richards.

Michael made a successful career for himself outside of the family business, Paradise Motors, in corporate marketing for companies in Australia and the UK with a specific focus on strategy. Yet he retained a love for cars his whole life.

In 1980, the first running of the Bay to Birdwood, Michael remembers being taken to stand on the side of the road to watch the passing parade. It was only for a brief while, perhaps 15 or 20 minutes as it was Sunday and there were church commitments. Yet in that short period of time, Michael fell in love with historic motoring and specifically the Bay to Birdwood. He couldn't wait to be a participant. In 2016, Michael became the Chair of the Bay to Birdwood; an honour that surpassed even his childhood dreams.

In September 2020, the Bay to Birdwood became the first public event in Australia (to our knowledge) to involve more than 50,000 people since the COVID-19 lockdowns. In the midst of the Delta outbreak, more contagious than previous variants, the 2021 parade and gatherings will not be able to proceed. The Bay to Birdwood has needed as much of Michael's strategy expertise as his passion.

Michael is Managing Director of strategy consulting firm Literally Brilliant, holds a master's degree by Research in Marketing, is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, a Fellow of the Australian Marketing Institute, a Certified Practising Marketer, a visiting fellow at the University of Adelaide Business School, and has recently had papers accepted into leading academic journals. He will share his insights from behind the scenes of the Bay to Birdwood, one of the world's great historic motoring events.

- Michael then spoke about the background and history of the Bay to Birdwood.**



The Bay to Birdwood Run was first held in 1980 when the Federation of Historic Motoring Clubs, SAS Channel Ten, and the National Motor Museum were invited to develop an event commemorating the issuing of the first South Australian driver's licence in 1906 to Dr William A. Hargreaves.

The original agreed concept was a biennial run for pre-1950 vehicles from Glenelg (fondly known as "the Bay")

to the National Motor Museum in Birdwood.



By 1990 the Run had established itself as Australia's premier historic motoring event and had earned Australia wide recognition by winning the National Tourism Award as the best special event or festival staged in Australia.

Because of its high survival rate of old vehicles, Australia has become internationally recognised as one of the world's major storehouses of historic vehicles. South Australia has the highest per capita rate of ownership of historic vehicles in the nation. The advantage of having the National Motor Museum in the Adelaide Hills, along with a well-established restoration regime, has resulted in the preservation of historic vehicles becoming an important part of the South Australian culture.



As the number of interstate and country South Australian entrants grew, it was decided in 1986 to introduce a range of motoring and social activities around the Run under the title of Motorfest. In 1997 the Bay to Birdwood Classic was introduced for later model historic vehicles, making the Bay to Birdwood a yearly stalwart of South Australia's event calendar.



Since celebrating its 40th anniversary in 2020, the Bay to Birdwood has been a joint celebration of historic motoring, open to all unmodified vehicles greater than 30 years of age (in line with historic registration regulations in South Australia). This annual celebration has now firmly established itself as an iconic event for both entrants and spectators alike. It is one of the world's great historic motoring events!



Due to covid the Bay to Birdwood will this year be a purely online event from Sat 25-Sunday 26 Sept.

Michael then shared some personal insights of the event for which he is so enthusiastic & proud.

In his personal opinion, it is the world's greatest motoring event; it is profoundly different ; it nearly always sells out and if it doesn't ,precovid ,the weather was to blame. It has a 1700 vehicle capacity ; cars entered can range from rare ,expensive cars to a \$500 historical classic . The event is embraced by the people of Adelaide;over 90,000 people line the route ; the winning vehicle must make the 72km journey to be eligible; the cars are driven by enthusiasts from all walks of life,means and ages with the knowledge and unique characteristics and history of each car passed down from generation to generation.



Michael's daughter Victoria , after some hesitation , is now proud to have learnt and driven a 1930's Hudson straight 8 . It has certainly made her appreciate older cars , their idiosyncracies and has certainly made her a better & more appreciative driver. She will now be able to pass down the craft to the next generation to come. We are just custodians of these historic machines that are part of our heritage and laid the foundations to motorised transport.

Michael reflected that the Bay to Birdwood Event is a significant Event . It is a celebration of a past era that is timeless & special, that we desire to celebrate , relive, enjoy and to pass on for generations. The greeks have two words for time, Kronos - chronos is quantitative,while Kairos has a qualitative, permanent nature. A brush with eternity ,a real sense of history as exemplified by the ...
