I was inducted into the World of Rotary in 1980 while on Kangaroo Island. Then inducted into Campbelltown in June 1983,

My year as President commenced on June 28th, 1998. I was inducted by immediate past President the late Joe Hudspith.

The theme for my year was.... Follow your Rotary Dream. World president James L Lacy issued his challenge to all strive to realise our dream of a world free from conflict, hunger, illnesses and a lack of education. Now we dream of a World that is free from Covid and its restrictions and loss of life.

DG was Geoff Simpson. The late David Tuckwell was my secretary and past member John Donaldson my Sergeant. John Schubert was my Vice President.





The Board also consisted of President Elect. past member Duncan Elsdon; Treasurer Brian Stevens ;Community Dean Fleming - the 1st time as a Director after 25 years in the club; International Reg Bennett ; Vocational / Youth the late Vic Agostinelli ; Fundraising Geoff Brett; Fellowship past member Peter DePalma; Joe Hudspith - Membership; the late Bob Northcote was Bulletin Editor; the late Des Elson Almoner; past member Josie Di Girolamo Attendance; Jeff Neale song leader generally with some form of musical instruments; David Richards - Programme; past member; Jim Everett – Historian.

Our annual subscriptions were \$165, **Some highlights of my year.**

We supported a total of 2 students to each of RYWELL, a YMCA Camp and Young Scientists of Australia Siemens Experience Programme. In addition, 1 student attended RYLA Seminar and was granted \$180. Plus 6 students were supported with TAFE fees and safety boots for a pre-vocational course.

First club assembly outlined the proposal for the toilets at the shed plus outlined the longer-term proposal of one large single shed to replace our then 2 smaller sheds on the block. The Lions Club owned the 3rd shed. Eventually they handed their shed to us. The end result is our one large shed.

The Club maintained District leadership in contributions to The Rotary Foundation, earning a PHF from the District Conference where the club's 'duck' won the Duck Race!

A banner for 100% FAIM membership was presented to our Club.

The City of Campbelltown established an Emergency Plan, and our Club supported the plan with Dean Fleming as the contact person in the case of an emergency. In the case of an emergency, eg bushfire, or earthquake our Club would be asked to act as support personnel to provide refreshments or do light work.

The Artshow - over \$22,000 worth of paintings, Aboriginal Art and Artefacts



and pottery were sold with an overall profit of \$8,072. In addition, we had Bowls and Bocce night, A Quiz night, Theatre Nights, Golf weekends, and 2 Weekends on Troubridge Island.



PNG had suffered a Tsunami - There was a Rotary appeal raising funds to help re establish communities. subsequently teams were sent to assist - past member Geoff Thorpe went from our Club... he volunteered his time, showing the perfect example of real 'service above self'. Our club then donated \$3,000 to the relief fund.

Denise Dinham hosted our exchange student Kristen at her farm at Tailem Bend.

\$1,100 donated to S.E.S. for new safety vests.

The Club unanimously agreed to having a major Auction in October combined with a Street sale, outside the shed premises,

this then to be followed by regular shed sales monthly from January to May. - the beginning of the now monthly sales.

Val took it upon herself to take the 1st items to Scammels Auction House, having identified that they appeared to be of value..... This has been continued from then on.

A Trailer and contents, all donated, was raffled at Christmas with tickets sold 4 days a week for 6 weeks prior to Christmas and the drawing of the raffle. 9,800 tickets were sold. Members were rostered on to sell tickets... really labour intensive. Over \$6,000 was raised.



Australia Day celebrations were held at Darrach House, then owned by past member Des Bowen. Some Australia Day Awards were handed out... all fun and tongue in cheek awards.

The last seats and picnic tables were installed on the Rotary Walk and handed to the Council. We used the BBQ recently for one our events.

Peter Rumbelow might not like to be reminded that in August 1998 he underwent an emergency appendectomy. As can be seen he recovered fully!! A November meeting was a blood donation evening with a BBQ to sustain donors. 30 of our, then, 72 members donated. This encouraged members to become regular donors

Milton Lewis was nominated as the GSE team leader to go to Denmark. We sold Akubra style hats, with 120 sold initially to 3 other Clubs, plus many sold to our own.

We had 4 Vocational visits to R.M. Williams factory. These were small groups each time. We also visited Townsend House and Oasis Griffiths Coffee.

A Progressive Dinner was held and voted a huge success, with 55 Rotarians and partners participating.

We set a fundraising budget at \$36,000 and achieved \$35,000 - this was deemed a great outcome.

Each "O" birthday was celebrated with a cake. We had a memorable birthday cake made and decorated by now District 9510 Deputy Governor Areas, Sandy Sumsion.

Our Annual Rotary 1998 Bush Trip was in the form of a cleanup of the Simpson Desert, with Rotarians and Friends from, Magill Sunrise, Morialta, Drouin (Vic) and our club. Val catered for 35 in total. Many tonnes of rubbish were picked up and loaded onto trailers and a large truck and taken out to a rubbish dump (photo) at Clifton Hills on the Birdsville Track. This included 3 abandoned trailers that were filled with rubbish In 1999 the 12th Annual 10-day Rotary Bush Trip was to the Flinders with 31 from 4 Clubs, including Drouin again. We held a Rotary meeting and raised \$240 from fines for RFDS, this was then boosted with \$500 from each Drouin and ours. We also had 5 guest speakers at the Flinders meeting.

We awarded 3 Paul Harris Fellowships, One Sapphire Pin, A Four Avenues of Service award, Certificate of Appreciation, Volunteer Service Award, Service above Self Award, 2 Community Service Awards, 2 Pride of Workmanship Awards and A Youth Leadership Award Our photographer was Paul Eliseo. The Perpetual Trophy for the most fines went to Reg Neale.

A total of 73 members. Of those 11 got 100% attendance. Although no new members were inducted, it was not because we were not trying...

We had 20 nominations for Membership, of those 15 were unable to accept and 5 were at various stages of processing.

I handed the Presidents collar to Duncan Elsdon. Dean Fleming as Director of Community Service - posed this question... Did you join Rotary just to come to the Monday meetings for the meal? or does the Rotary Motto "Service above Self' really mean something to you? I guess this question is still very relevant in today's Rotary.





The meeting was then formally closed by President Stephany and the singing of the National Anthem.

After a short break the Club Assembly followed.
