Guest Speakers- Bob & Jenny Humphries -Their time in the RFDS

Chairman Peter Rumbelow introduced our guest speakers

Jenny and Bob Humphries moved into our retirement village some time ago and over drinks I discovered they both had an involvement with the RFDS, Jenny as a Nurse and Bob as a pilot.

As we support the service significantly through CROE we hear the RFDS story regularly through senior management. I thought it would be good to hear something of the nuts and bolts of the organization through staff on the ground.

We had firsthand experience with RFDS when Milton Lewis had a heart attack at Dalhousie Springs at 4am one morning. It had been raining so we had to test the airstrip before they would land.

Jenny was a RN and RM ((midwife) who started her nursing career at Riverton, then RAH and Queen Vic. She went to Oodnadatta with Australian Inland Mission in 1969 then had a period at Warawee, the AIM facility at Tennyson.

She then joined the RFDS at Pt Augusta

Bob joined the Air Force to become a pilot but resigned when he found that he was destined to become a Navigator rather than a pilot.

He learned to fly at the Royal Aero Club then became an instructor on graduating.

He then went to Pt Augusta with Pt Augusta Air Services who had the RFDS contract. They met during their time with RFDS.

He then became an Air Traffic Controller in 1973 and after retiring from this stressful occupation went back to flight training and lecturing at Uni of SA

Please welcome Jenny and Bob Humphries

Jenny & Bob both spoke proudly & fondly of their years of service with the RFDS. Bob spoke on the technical side & [history of the RFDS](#) how it developed to what we know today. It is an expensive operation to run and relies on both govt and private donations to exist. The spoke of the type of planes used in his career with the RFDS, the dedication of the mostly young pilots & their medical crew to perform their lifesaving and medical evacuations & /or visits to remote country areas. There wasn't as much red tape in those earlier days. They had to fly in everywhere often in difficult conditions, especially for mercy flights but now they have to be more aware. It was certainly exciting, especially for a young pilot, and it was deeply rewarding to use your skills and training to help others so directly and be part of such a great organisation & team.

Jenny spoke firsthand on her role with the RFDS as a flight nurse and the many emergency situations both she & the crew faced over the years. Most stations had an airstrip. In the early days the planes were equipped with just basic items, such as a medical kit, an oxygen cylinder and an IV drip. The planes were also not pressurized and unlike today would take much longer to do a round trip from their base. The RFDS would regularly fly to remote areas where they would hold medical sessions & would often be diverted to attend emergencies from there.



She fondly remembers how the RFDS were always supported very generously by those in the Outback. Local businesses, farmers, stations, individuals and organisations would all support them in whatever way they could. E.g. A station manager would say to the auctioneer – “Those 3 cattle are for the RFDS”; a farmer would donate the proceeds of grain or hay to the RFDS; Oodnadatta Hospital had a yearly fete & white elephant stall, which was a fundraiser for the RFDS where stockman would donate handmade leatherwork items.

At the conclusion of their inspiring talk many questions were asked but the feeling of the audience was well summed up by Rotarian Gail Casey when she said “We salute you. Thank you for coming here tonight and sharing your experience with the RFDS & your stories of bush medicine. You have our support.”

Chair Peter also thanked them for sharing their most interesting personal stories & journey with the RFDS, for which we have supported for many years as a Club, especially with our CROE (Campbelltown Rotary Outback Experience).

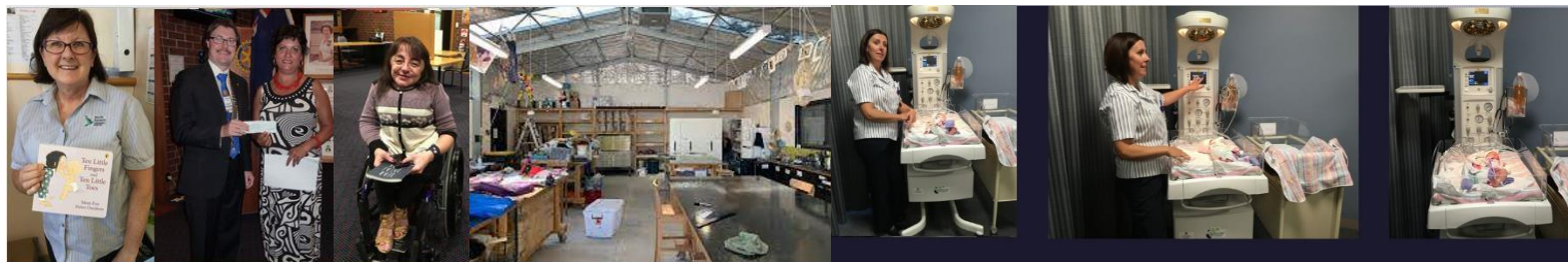

Community Service

Community Service – 50th Anniversary Project

Community Service : We supplied 50 books written by Mem Fox, Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes for all babies born during the latter half of February and the beginning of March. The books were distributed to the mums by club members, Gwen and John Schubert, Jane Gascoigne, Mary Vincent, Margaret Northcote, Brad and Helen Silby, Netty and Manfred Heinrich, Tony and Eunice Uren who attended the Hospital on a regular basis. Both the Hospital and the recipients were excited by this gift, and the volunteers also had a very rewarding experience.

We presented \$1,000 to Alison Menaud from the Eastern Adelaide Domestic Violence Service.

In recognition of our 50th year of Charter, we had some speakers about previous club projects. A significant one of these was hearing from Abby Burton about the significant improvement in her life she experienced when we donated a van for her transport in the late 1980s.

The second largest donation for the year, was made to the “Ripples Community Art Group” to assist in the development of the Community Arts Shed, in conjunction with a Federal Grant and the Campbelltown City Council at Lochiel Park. We donated \$10,000.

We also supported Kick Start for Kids after hearing from the founder, Ian Steel.

Also, in recognition of our 50th year, was the largest donation for the year of \$32,174 was made to the North Eastern Community Hospital for the purchase of a Panda Bedded Baby Warmer. This piece of equipment keeps delicate premature babies warm during the trying start of their lives. It sees them through X-rays, surgeries and day to day survival whilst providing doctors and nurses with better lighting and important information to assist the baby. The doctors, nurses and new parents were all so grateful for the new addition to the hospital to assist in the survival of these precious lives in the future.

Fellowship was very active in 2015-16, with fellowship gatherings in local pubs commencing in August. We had a visit to the Neale property in Swan Reach in September, and a Seafood night at the Molfetta Club in October. We also dressed up in medical attire to celebrate the visit of the District Governor, Dr Dick Wilson. We had our Melbourne Cup night on 2 November, with a sweep and Fashion Prizes.



We held a golf weekend from 11-13 November at the Berri Golf Club, as we headed in to the Christmas season.

We held our Club Christmas Dinner on 14 December arranged by host extraordinaire Stan McPhee, and Lynton Nicholas as MC. I invited the club to my home for a BBQ as a social event the following Saturday night with 30 members attending, and we had the Children’s Christmas Party that Monday.

As we welcomed the new year we had our Shed Meeting, where we also welcomed back Past Youth Exchange student Heini Lampela. Shortly after, we held our Australia Day Breakfast.

In February we held our Annual Bowls night, with awards going to Frank Orlando, Graham Wallis and Michael Dilena.

In March we held our annual Movie Night watching Bicentennial man, and later in the year had a brunch at Café Va Bene.

Fellowship: The Shed raised \$74,518 in addition to about \$1,500 donated to various local charities.

The Art Show raised just shy of \$10,000 under the leadership of Elizabeth Gagliardi. Our Porchetta Night, and involvement with Carnevale was coordinated by Vince Belperio and cleared \$7,700, and our wine sales raised \$3,500.



Fundraising

International Service & RI :

From the beginning of the Rotary year, we had planned to achieve our club's first Global Grant in the last 10 years. The project was to provide more adequate water and sanitation to a school in Fiji. We chose to work with the Rotary Club of Lautoka to provide a small school with suitable toilets for the rainy conditions (as they had no shelter between the toilet facilities and the school buildings), fix their septic tank, and provide them with separated boys and girls showering facilities.

Unfortunately, just before the final signoff for the project from Evanston, a Hurricane tore through Fiji, and the recipient club had to withdraw from the project given the competing demands. Tony Eddowes, Stephany, and David Fenton played a key role in this project.

We held our second International Women's Day event with over 300 people in attendance, raising \$12,000 for International projects.

We hosted the Polio Ute as well and sold raffle tickets at the Newton shops.

We also hosted South Australian of the Year, Gill Hicks speaking about her experience of the London Bombings and her advocacy for Peace.



International Service and The Rotary Foundation

Membership:

A total of 16 names were submitted by members to our committee for consideration through 2015 – 2016. The committee conducted 13 interviews of these proposals and we inducted 9 new members. Our growth for the year was three members, arresting four years of reducing membership. Rotary Information was managed by this committee by sharing their knowledge with the broader club in areas of interest. A successful Fireside Meeting was held at the home of Jeff and Jenny Neale. It was observed that it was most beneficial as much

more information on Rotary was conveyed in a relaxed and informal home setting. The committee introduced the concept of a casual badge for members and partners to use at Club activities held away from the Club.

Vocational: We hosted a couple of Vocational Speakers during the year, including the Small Business Commissioner, John Chapman, and two behind the Badge speakers in Lou Dimech and Brett Coombs. We did a Vocational Visit to the North Eastern Community Hospital, including a tour by the Chief Executive, and the club was recognized for our long and ongoing involvement with the Hospital. We did a tour of the Adelaide Oval followed by a dinner on the banks of the River Torrens. In addition, we presented two Pride of Workmanship Awards to Ninno's Smallgoods, and Java Lifestyles Coffee.



Vocational Service

Youth: We sponsored Amelie Peters, Shannon Austen and Thuy Kim Van to RYLA. Our Club sponsored Ross Monahan, and also supported the attendance of Mateus Nowak to the National Youth Science Forum. We hosted RYPEN sponsoring seven students from St Ignatius and Charles Campbell, and many club members attended to welcome the participants and enjoy a BBQ dinner provided by the club. We also supported the District program, Rotary Youth WELL being to the tune of \$2,000. We supported six Indigenous basketballers playing for North Adelaide. For the Sports Grants, we supported the Magill Church of Christ, Hectorville Football Club, Athelstone Football Club and Athelstone Cricket Club.



Youth Service

We catered for 1100 people at the Movies in the Park, which was a 50th Birthday celebration project. The movie shown was Jurassic World. We also supported Australian Diamond, Erin Bell for a netball masterclass for our local netball clubs. We also hosted Erin at the club, with 80 young netballers attending and hearing her speak.

50th Birthday: In preparation for our 50th Birthday Gala Dinner, we approached as many previous club members as we could locate and were delighted that, together with invited district personnel and members from other clubs, in excess of 80 guests attended. We had over 210 people in attendance on the night.

Apart from the food, the function was a success, and the late Eric Webb produced a video that was shown on the night of the history of the club. There was also a video created of the event including contributions made by Past Presidents and a number of members were awarded PHF's and sapphire pins, and we awarded the club's first Double Sapphire Pins to Reg Neale, Barry Donaldson, Eric Webb and David Richards.

Later in the year, we were feted at a Civic Reception hosted by the Campbelltown Council.

The Rotary Club Of Campbelltown- half yearly Subs are now Due & payable

For those who have chosen to pay in 6 monthly installments their next and final installment for the 2021-2022 year is now due and payable.

Normally, unless covid restrictions apply, the payment can be done with Babu directly at the meetings, either with cash or by EFT.
