After Sgt Aaron'ss invocation & loyal toast President Stephan welcomed all to the meeting with a special welcome to DG Jeff Neale & guest speakers Andrew Kyrianou & Helen Leach

Secretary & Board announcements by Damian Leach (Frank Orlando an apology) -

- o LOA approved for Netty & Manfred Heinrich from 15 April-28 Aug 2022
- o facilitate the request for transfer from Brad Silby to the RC of Northern YP.
- o Donations to RAWCS for the Qld & Northern NSW floods have now been paid as have the donation to the rotary Foundation Disaster Fund for Ukraine.
- o A survey has been sent to the club from PDG David Jones as the District Youth Exchange Chair to ascertain the number of students that could be accommodated through the program and asking for an indication of the club's willingness to support either an:-
 - ➤ An Inbound student from July 2022
 - Outbound student from January 2023
 - &/or an Inbound student from July 2023

The Board had concerns about whether we would have Rotarians that had similar aged children in the home of hosting the overseas student.

It was agreed that President Elect Michael & PEN Jeff would discuss this item and investigate further in relation to their year to see if we are able to assist in some way.

- o Agreed that the Raffle & Gold Pot at the meeting on 9 May would go to Ovarian Cancer.
- o It was agreed to sponsor a participant in the Rotary Sailing Challenge
- o It was agreed that a Finance & Legal Committee be established to look at the potential issues around establishing a charitable trust.
 - o From 10-14 April the Council of Legislation met in Chicago. The Council includes a delegate from each District globally and meets to make decisions on the documents which guide us as Rotary Clubs, and also can set policy. There were 92 proposals coming from 240 submissions. Some of those which were approved were: -
 - To amend when the minutes for Club Board meetings should be available from 60 days to 30 days.
 - Articulated the celebrating of equity, inclusion & diversity as peart of a well balanced membership..





- Removed the requirement that a member must work or reside in the locality of their club.
- Allowed active members to propose prospective members in any club, not just their own.
- Authorised the Board to suspend or terminate a club or Rotaract Club for initiating litigation against a district.
- > increased the percapita dues for the next four years by a total of \$7 US
- ➤ The approval of the regionalization pilot mentioned at a District Assembly. (See President Stephany for more info)
- Articulating that Rotaractors may attend a regular meeting of Rotary Clubs.
- Formalising the removal of the requirement to forward attendance reports to the DG, which is something our district hasn't done for 10 years.
- ➤ The process for being an exempt member has become easier with Board approval no longer required.

This month, I wish to highlight the great work of our amazing volunteers and Rotarians who work tirelessly at the Shed every Tuesday morning of the month to prepare for shed sales – no days off for these amazing people led by Renata Allen. One of our non-Rotarian volunteers, Alysse, works tirelessly (and I am sure she would not like to be singled out) in our book and stationary section and really needs a little help and if any Rotarians or partners have an interest in this area they would be very welcome.

Renata Allen often takes special donated goods to Scammells Auctions and this month she made \$600 (actually \$599 but I will give the sergeant a dollar). Val and Mal's daughter sold \$130 on line. Thankyou to Renata, Val and Sandy. Other sales during the course of the month, largely from our on-line sales amounted to \$2,538.

The on-line marketing (a big thankyou to David Richards and Val Hansen and all Rotarians who attend at the shed many times each week to finalise sales) has really raised awareness of not only our shed, but of Rotary. As an example, while one customer came to the Shed to finalise a sale for a lounge suite for \$150, he was able, as a recent migrant to our State, furnish his new home including refrigerator, for \$820. So many new regular customers, were once Marketplace customers and this is really fantastic!



By a strange coincidence I had 2 members from ASIC on the executive Board. I was not sure if they were there to keep me straight. But they were no second best. They were the best and my sincere gratitude was to Ralph Holmes who also volunteered to be Secretary and he also continued to be Secretary the following year when Benny Bosman was President.

Neale was presented with the Pride of Workmanship award. Another highlight was a visit to the Hindu Temple where we had a vegetarian dinner.

Paul Eliseo was Director of Vocational Services. The year began with the combined fellowship and vocational visit to Paradise Motors.

Jeff Blanco presented another pride of workmanship award to Michael Auciello of Chemist King at a later date. Paul also organised a visit to the Enfield Cemetery with the Director of cemeteries Robert Pitt as our Tour guide.

Veteran Tony Lagozzino was the Director of International Services and we spent \$21,000 in various projects including \$3,000 to Shoes That Grow, \$5750 to RAM and \$6,200 to Shelter Box.

John Russo was Director of Fund Raising. Approximately \$95,000 was raised. Shed sales were \$65,500 under the capable hands of Brian Stevens, Artshow raised \$11,000 under the capable work of Netty Heinrich and Porchetta night raised \$3,700 under the capable hands of the late Bryan Schell.

We raised a total of \$95,000 and spent \$72,000 with a surplus of \$23,000.

Brad Silby was Director Of Youth Services and \$16,000 in the various projects including RYLA, NYSF RYPEN and Sports Grants.

Elizabeth Gagliardi was our Membership Director and we had 5 new members inducted that year. Des Collinson, Tyler Lawrence, Bob Basedow, Hiep Nguyen and our only red hair Aaron Stobie. Sadly, we lost Vic Agostonelli, Chris Gascoigne and Ian Reddy who were called to higher services.



We bid farewell to Jenna Saxe who was our Long-Term Youth Exchange student and were fortunate to host the GSE team from District 6040 Missouri and Jane Gascoigne coordinated a visit to Parliament House to

witness a sitting of the House hosted by the then Speaker Hon Vincent Tarzia.

We also awarded the Paul Harris Fellow award to David Fenton and Enzo Piperone.





In conclusion, all this would not be possible without the behind the scenes assistance from Auditor Dean Crook , Attendance Officer Susan Harris , Bulletin Editor Bruce Barnes ,Historian Peter Rumbelow , Property Manager Bill Allan, Program John Bennett ,Photographer Enzo Piperone ,Public Relations Jeff Blanco, Sergeant Peter Allen.

Polio Survivors Guest Speakers - Andrew Kyprianou & Helen Leach-from Polio SA



Chairman Dr Nigel Quadros who is also involved with Polio survivors introduced guest speakers Andrew and Helen from Polio SA and spoke briefly on the history of Polio and how the first vaccine began in 1956.

Helen said that Polio SA has some 220 members on it's books. Not many GPs know the long-term effects of Polio, so Polio SA is there to provide support & assistance to Polio survivors.

It's objectives are

- 1) To maintain POLIO SA
- 2) To liaise and promote an understanding between the professionals in our field and the community
- 3)To have the late effect (post-polio syndrome) recognized as a legitimate medical condition.



Andrew as President of Polio SA also spoke and said there was no main specialist group to assist Polio Survivors other than Dr Nigel's Team who provide great support for which they are so grateful. It's no secret that we, the members of Polio SA are now entering our autumn and winter years and in 15 odd

years' time, unless migrants become active in maintaining the organization it will no longer be needed....



however, in the meantime it is up to us, the current members to try and keep survivors informed, understand what latest developments are out there to ensure the best quality of life, people with polio, can achieve and to keep the Medico's alert to our specific medical requirements . Polio survivors are often overlooked even for such simple matters as disability carparks where many have mobility issues that need special considerations.

Thank you very, very much for your donation of \$3000 to Polio SA which will be put to very good use to continue our work and assist our members many.

After the presentation of the cheque Andrew and Helen presented the Club with Certificates of Appreciation to both the Club and Dr Nigel Quadros.






