
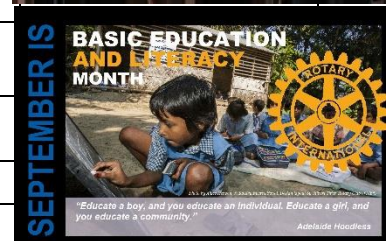

- **It was proposed and carried unanimously that member Dr Milton Lewis be honoured as an Honorary Member for all the service he has given to Rotary & this Club over the years. Milton joined the Club on Feb 1<sup>st</sup>, 1976, over 45 years ago.**

**Now for some background on our new Honorary Member Milton Lewis.**

Milton together with support from wife Janette gave many years of service to Rotary and served in many District Roles. Milton was passionate about fighting Malaria and served many years for RAM (Rotarians against Malaria). Milton & Jan are presently under care at the Helping Hand facility at Golden Grove. Milton is suffering from Alzheimer's Disease.

**Biography:**

- 1957 Territory of PNG as a Cadet Field Medical Assistant. Training included attending an intensive 6-week training in malaria control.
- 1959 medicine at the Adelaide University. Finished medical degrees in 1967. A year of residency at the RAH, returned to PNG for 2 years at Kieta, Bougainville. Then 1970 Otago University for diploma in Public Health.
- 1971 returned to PNG to be posted to Mount Hagen as the District Health Officer managing all government health services for 250,000 people.
- 1973 transferred to Lae as the Morobe District Health Officer. Repatriated to Australia, July 1975.
- 1975 worked in the SA Health Department and later the SA Health Commission. School doctor, then as the Director of Occupational Health. Redundant early 1990s and worked as private consultant.
- 1976 Feb 1<sup>st</sup> Joined Rotary Club of Campbelltown

- 21 Aug 2020 **Milton Lewis and the RAWCS Humanitarian Award**

RAM is very pleased to celebrate the presentation of the **RAWCS Humanitarian Award** to Milton Lewis, for many years of wonderful service to the people of PNG in general health and the control of malaria in particular, and for his contribution to RAM.

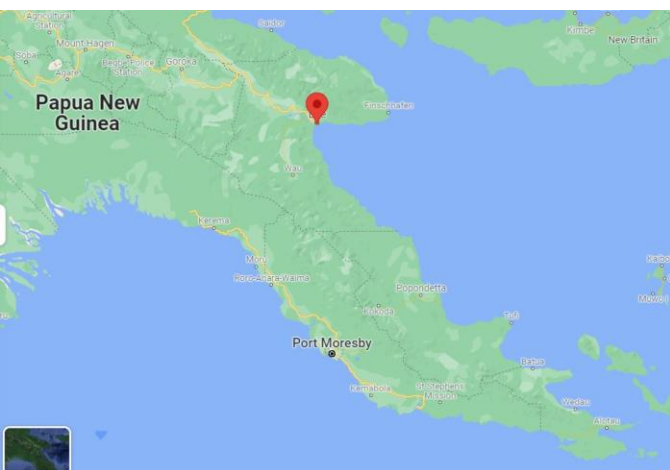
### **Milton himself recalls his career in PNG from the 1950s-70s:**

*I spent 2 years in my late teens and early 20s in Papua New Guinea. This included a specific period of training about malaria for 6 weeks in a group of Cadet Field Medical Assistants in Minj in the Western Highlands.*

*After 2 years of walking from village to village, checking on the incidence indicators of the severity of malaria, vaccinating the infants, giving all people in the village an injection of penicillin to rid them of a disease called yaws. I saved all my spare cash, with the intention to enrol in medicine at Adelaide University. There was some support from the PNG Public Health Department on the basis that I would return to work in the Health Department there.*

*I was appointed as the District Health Officer for Bougainville which had a population of about 80,000 and lived there with my wife and 2 daughters. I then further developed my training with some assistance from the PNG Public Health Department, to get a Dip Public Health at the University of Otago.*

*After graduating from that course, we returned to PNG, and I was appointed to [Mt Hagen](#) as the District Health Officer for the Western Highlands with a population of 250,000 people, responsible for oversight of the programmes of "Maternal and Child Health", TB Control, and Leprosy Control all carried out by provided staff. I also had to liaise with staff at 3 or 4 small mission hospitals and provide oversight of the staff at the base hospital and of 1 small sub-district hospital.*



*After a year or 2 at Mt Hagen I was transferred to [Lae](#), the main township in the Morobe District, with a slightly larger population as the District Health Officer. This was somewhat easier for me because I was familiar with the district from my earlier experience there. I joined the Rotary Club of Lae and served as Secretary for 1 year. On our permanent return to Australia at the time of independence for PNG (1975), I transferred my Rotary membership to RC Campbelltown (SA), where I have served as Secretary, President, Newsletter Editor, and have been awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship plus a sapphire.*





**So many years of service! PDG Jerry Casburn RAWCS Central Region Coordinator spoke of Milton's contribution:**



*Over a number of years Rotary has had the benefit of the experience and expertise of Milton Lewis, Campbelltown Rotary Club, to lead and motivate the 9500 and 9520 districts for RAM. Milton has put in long hours and travelled both Districts, with the support of wife Jeanette, to promote RAM and raise funds for the national activity. He has actively participated in many District Conferences providing information and support for all facets of RAWCS, including being the **principal author and technical writer for several generations of the RAM tri-fold leaflet** as well as an active contributor on technical aspects of RAM's project planning.*

*Milton was already resident in South Australia and a member of RC Campbelltown when RAM was first initiated in 1992, launched in 1995 and became a multi-district national activity of RAWCS in 1998. In 2016 Milton took over from Roshni Thattingat as RAM Regional Coordinator for Central Region.*

## Guest Speaker -Mr Fred Hamood- The New Reservoir Hotel

Chairman Bill Allan introduced guest speaker Mr Fred Hamood who spoke on his family's Rezz Hotel Redevelopment.

Nestled at the foot of the Adelaide Hills, "the local Rezz" is a local landmark that has been serving the people of the north east for more than 150 years. The original Reservoir Hotel was built as a watering hole for the mostly European workers who were employed to construct the Thorndon Park Reservoir. Not used to the unrelenting heat and harsh South Australian conditions, it was agreed that the hotel was a necessity for exhausted workers. Although back then it was a real working man's pub it still boasted a glorious backdrop and magnificent views to the picturesque Thorndon Park. An attractive opportunity for future owners and entrepreneurs Fred and Lorna Hamood.



The immigrant Lebanese Hamood family, took the reins in 1965, transforming the hotel into a modern bar, lounge and dining venue. Forty years later Fred and Lorna's children Fred Jnr, Richard and Sue-Anne, returned to once again reinvent the popular local – the result is 'Rezz'.

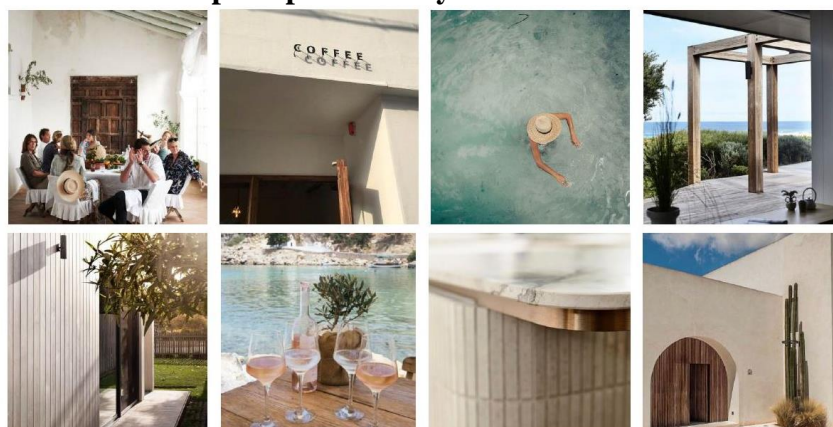
A new take on an old favourite, Rezz is a fresh and ambient venue that invites diners to enjoy good food in the company of good friends. It's local, it's family-friendly and after 150 years it's still serving up the very best of our great state. Please welcome Fred Hamood.

### Fred then spoke passionately about the Rezz Hotel Redevelopment.

Fred said his 93 yo mother Lorna ,the family matriarch, is still involved with the Rezz .

Six years ago, the family decided they needed to rebuild the Hotel , and now that is becoming a reality, with the 1<sup>st</sup> Stage of 4 , already started and hopefully will be largely completed before Christmas. The Hotel is to remain a family orientated pub and their vision (see left) is to provide patrons with a Mediterranean experience .They have engaged local Studio 9

Architects to design it. The old Hotel had a capacity of 700 while the new will have 1100 and be more



covid manageable with more open areas & flexible dining options . Future stages will see a conference room upstairs and if all goes well, in the long term, accommodation in the final stage. Council is planning to make Hamilton Terrace that borders the Rezz to the west & north , into a one way street with more landscaping to interface more seamlessly with Thordon Park , the jewel of Adelaide's NE. The Rezz is in total agreement and will work with Council, together , to achieve a harmonious development and the best outcome for all , and most importantly the public .

Fred then showed a presentation of the Architectural Design and was passionate that this will be a great positive step, for the Hotel and the local area. The Hamood family has always believed in giving back to the community. It is involved with local sporting clubs and has always welcomed service clubs such as Rotary ,Lions , Innerwheel etc who have met at the Rezz for many years and will continue to do so. It will be family friendly and a safe place for kids.

At the conclusion of Fred's talk he answered many questions and was thanked by President Steph for sharing with us his passion for the Rezz Development.

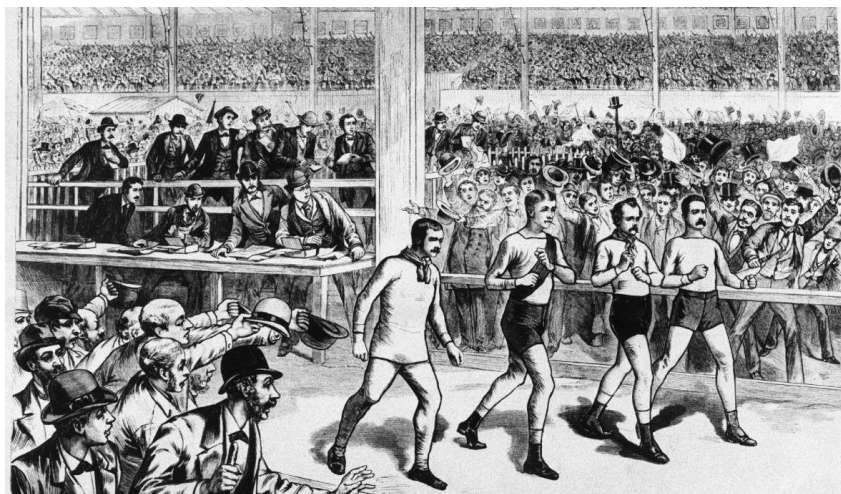
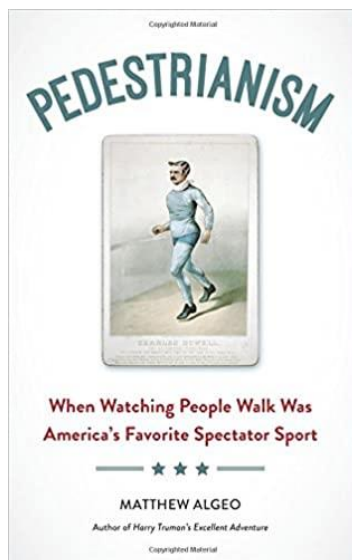

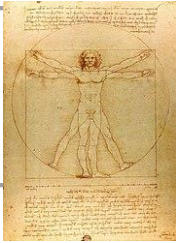

Dear fellow Rotarians, partners and friends of Rotary,

Well, time has gone by very quickly and we are already 2 months into the new Rotary year. With restrictions easing, clubs have been able to return to most of their regular meetings and projects, although gatherings are still limited and we still have a few functions being cancelled. We are also conscious of the clubs in our District that are in other states that are still facing varied levels of lock-down. We think of those clubs in Alice Springs but more particularly the clubs that are being severely impacted in New South Wales and Victoria. I would encourage clubs in these regions to maintain contact with their members and utilize the technologies that have become available over the last 18 months to continue meeting where possible. I am sure that we are all looking forward to a time when restrictions are over and we can safely return to normal activities across the whole district.

Jenny and I have just attended the last of the Changovers that were moved because of restrictions. As mentioned in last month's edition, Jenny and I started our official visits on the 2nd August and so far we have completed 15 club visits. We have 69 Rotary clubs and 5 Rotaract clubs still to go, but who's counting.

We have enjoyed the visits we have made so far and it has been a great experience. We have visited clubs near and far and there has been a common thread throughout all the visits and that is Rotary fellowship and commitment to serving the community. September is Basic Education and Literacy month. There are many opportunities to support this initiative in the community and overseas. One example of this is Jenny's partner project which is to support AllKids.

The purpose of AllKids is to ensure that all children in the Ream Commune Cambodia have access to Education by eliminating the barriers that prevent children from attending school. They also offer Early years education and school-based Education from year 1 to International Standard year 12. Jenny will be presenting information about this project as we visit clubs. AllKids is a RAWCS project and information is available online.

Although the Rotary calendar has a different focus each month, membership must still remain an important focus for us moving forward. Last month I shared some of RI President Shekhar's goals, many of which focused around increasing our membership and strengthening the impact Rotary has on the community. It has been encouraging to see the clubs have been engaging with these goals and ideas and incorporating them into their clubs strategic plans.
