This month, in addition to on-line sales, we earned \$386 from the sale of scrap to Paramount Browns thanks to David Richards and separating stainless steel and aluminum and Peter Allen and David Munro for cutting electrical cords off electrical items that do not meet their rigorous testing process. Thanks also to Benny for helping with the loading and unloading of the Paradise Mazda van and trailer. So, we were encouraged on a wet Saturday morning to know that \$2,010 had been raised for the month. The weather may well have accounted for what seemed like a disappointing turn out of customers, but we achieved sales amounting to \$3,143 for the day, with included coffee and BBQ sales of \$136 – thanks very much to Angela, Mal, Gus, David Munro, Nigel and our volunteer Alan.

So the total raised for the month was \$5,153 – an excellent result for all of the hard work done by our Rotarians and volunteers – well done Team!

Thank you again to our amazing sponsors, particularly Jeff and Jenny Neale and Paradise Mazda for the van, which they serviced last week, the reception service enabling donors to arrange collection of goods and also for the fantastic coffee machine which is fed with filtered mains water thanks to Crystal Clear Purification Systems and Scotts Plumbing Plus.

And finally, to ensure I have not missed anyone, thanks again to everyone who contributes to the success of our major hands-on fundraising project, The Rotary Shed.

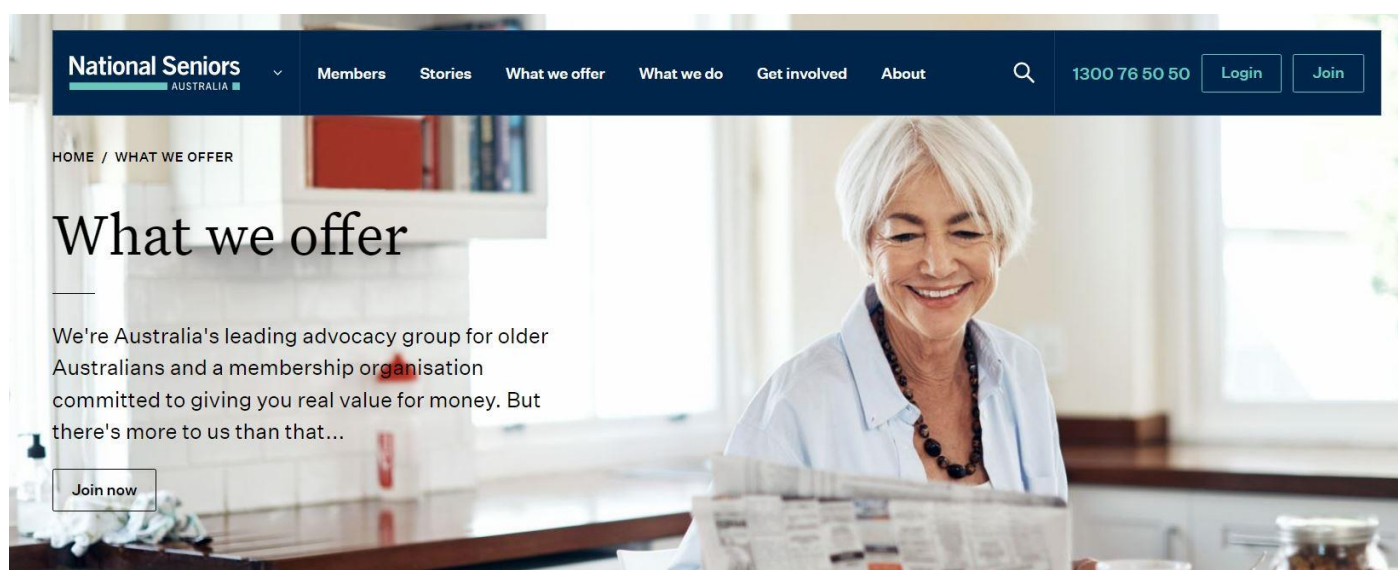

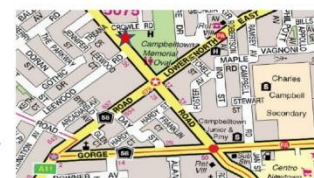
