

• After the invocation by Sgt Margaret Beare, President Stephany welcomed everyone to the Zoom meeting.

Tonight, we welcome as guest speaker Ella Huisman from the Adelaide Fringe. Ella started her arts career at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe over ten years ago. Since then, she has made her way across several arts festivals to be at Adelaide Fringe as Head of Ticketing and Marketing + Digital.
The Fringe has evolved dramatically in the seven festivals Ella has been involved, with a digital overhaul (including new ticketing and website platforms) doubling ticket sales. I look forward to you joining me in

listening to Ella while we also hear from Brian Stevens about his year as President.

 \circ I wanted to bring everyone up to date on a couple of different projects relating to India.

I am sure members will remember that in early 2021, India suffered from a catastrophic second wave of the COVID Delta variant. Hundreds of thousands of lives were lost and many more became ill.

The Rotary Club of Campbelltown embarked on fundraising efforts and thanks to members generous support, in June 2021, we successfully raised \$17,000 at a fundraising dinner attended by 300 people. The International Committee contributed a further \$8,000 to top up our funds to \$25,000. This enabled us to participate in the Global Grant Application process in partnership with the Rotary Club of Madras South.

Due to Covid challenges, it took several weeks to come up with an agreed proposal to buy Covid testing medical equipment for a hospital. The Madras Club commenced the global grant application process in the first week of January 2022.

Simultaneously, we spoke to David Cockshell from 'Donations in Kind' and made all necessary ground arrangements to ship approximately 70 hospital beds to the Rotary Club of Madras for distribution and to equip a newly renovated hospital. The COVID Delta variant was so severe overseas that all shipping was suspended.

The cost of shipping is approximately \$8,000 and the Club is in discussions with RAWCS to cover the cost. President Steph, Rotarians and Guests

Ralph Holmes Shed Report

It is my pleasure to report as Shed Convenor and I thank all of our wonderful volunteers, Rotarians and Partners for the work done at the shed over the last month.

The total raised during the month, after adjustments since Saturday's sale, is \$5,829.80 and I thank Past President Babu for his diligence in keeping the accurate accounting records – there have been so many transactions this month! Presales, mainly from our internet sales and then upselling when customers came to pick up their goods, amounted to \$3,100, representing more than the amount raised on Saturday and for that, I wish to really thank Val Hansen and David Richards for the work undertaken to advertise goods for sale on Marketplace.

But, for the on-line sales to be sustainable, HELP is desperately needed. Customers buying on Marketplace expect to pick up goods almost immediately which means a Rotarian is opening the shed about four days a week to finalise sales, talking with the customers about what we do as a Rotary Club and upselling while they are at the shed. If you are prepared to be available for this role, just one day a week or a fortnight, please contact me.

The marketing of our goods on-line not only raised much needed funds but introduces and whole new range of customers who have not previously heard about our shed.

Finally, I would really like to thank Jeff and Jenny Neale and Paradise Mazda for the new van. We could not be nearly as successful without the van and Jim Beare, Michael McCabe, Garth Holmes, Geoff Brett, Jim Silvestri and Frank Augello who are doing most of our pickups. Thankyou President Steph, Rotarians and Guests.
