Dr Dora Iuliano is a passionate life-long learner, educator and leader.

She has worked for the S.A. Department for Education at various public primary schools and at head office, since 1980.

She is currently the Principal at Rose Park Primary, an International Baccalaureate School.

Her first teaching appointment was at St. Morris Primary School, where one of her earliest achievements in education was introducing Italian language and culture into the state curriculum.

In the 1990s, at Blair Athol and at Ardtornish Primary Schools, she balanced the dual roles of teacher and Literacy Co-ordinator.

From 2000, she continued in leadership roles at Tea Tree Gully Primary School - in Literacy, Numeracy, Technologies, Science, Teacher Librarian, Deputy and shared Principalship.

During this period, Dora was accredited as an Advanced Skilled teacher, which later saw her assessing other highly accomplished and lead teachers, state-wide.

In 2012 Dora was appointed as Deputy Principal at East Adelaide School, and from 2016 won Principalship at Thorndon Park Primary School, before becoming the Principal at Rose Park in 2021.

Dora holds: a Bachelor of Education; Graduate Diplomas in Languages and Educational Computing; Master of Education; and a Doctorate of Education. She loves travelling both in Australia and internationally, skiing at home and abroad, watching action movies, dancing, and catching up with friends and family.

**WHY ROTARY?** Dora thanked Jane and said her Dad would have loved that she had joined Rotary, as he was very community minded and was involved with Lions, The Italian Club and sporting Clunbs most of his life.Her father immigrated as a young man to Australia in 1927 and settled in Newton working in the market gardens before starting a family and getting a block of his own. 
