Salvation Army in providing targeted programs for visits & interaction with the Zoo for many disadvantaged and marginalised families needing a break and a fun, social, and positive experience.

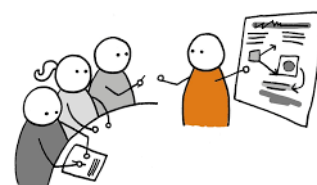

ROTARY INFORMATION – Tony Lagozzino-My Year as President 2002-2003



• **Chair Ankur Jandial introduced Past President and Member Tony Lagozzino .**

Tony is an electrical contractor by profession & has been with the Rotary Club of Campbelltown for 29 years and has served on most committees. He served as president in 2002-2003.

Please welcome Tony who will take us through his journey as President in 2002-2003 .

• **Tony Lagozzino then spoke about his Presidential Year .**

I was introduced to Rotary by the late Vic Agostinelli and inducted in 1993. I was president of the club in 2002-3, with that year's RI theme being "Sow the seeds of Love". These carefully chosen words made me think. Are we expecting to have a very challenging year ahead in the garden? Or is RI going hippie?



The theme, however, was most significant and unique, with a great sense of inspiration which constituted the many challenges of the year's activities. Together with the clubs' theme "Embracing Multi-Culturalism", our club had successfully achieved the many goals set out at the start of the Rotary year. Of all the seeds that were sown, not one of them failed to yield. This was because of the good, sound environment in which they grew, and gave us so much enjoyment in cultivating them, with a proud commitment and enabled us all to see them flourish.

As President, it gave me much pleasure in working together with all members, and to understand to see the benefits and experience the joy brought to those more unfortunate than us, by "Sowing the seeds of love". Suffice to say, that the successful attribute of this clubs' activities in all avenues of service in the Rotary year 2002-3, can only be attributed to the board and their committee members for the meritorious efforts and commitment. The highlight of that years' activities was being able to witness the realization of each project.

The undertaking of building the new Rotary shed – what a challenge! Now, our members and partners continue to enjoy giving their time working in a comfortable environment, which has led to a more positive result at the club's monthly shed sales.

As the shed came near to completion, another team of dedicated members under the direction of Community Service, focused on reconstructing and replanting the Rotary garden, which was partly devastated due to building additions at the North Eastern Community Hospital. The gardens were then enjoyed by the hospital residents and visitors.

In February 2003, the club bravely took up the challenge of a new project, 'the Carnevale in Adelaide', with a committee of members working towards the success of this activity. It turned out to be a great fundraising opportunity. In that year it was also the 20th anniversary of the City of Campbelltown Art Show which our club hosted. It was a great selection of Art on display and an acknowledgment to all the sponsors who supported the annual event, which enabled the club to gain valuable public awareness, as well as raising much needed funds.

Our club has always been passionate in sponsoring and giving young people within our community the opportunity to participate in many Rotary Youth programs offered. Then known as New Generations committee were busy sending participants to most of our Rotary programs.

On the International scene, our club was most impressed by the tremendous work carried out by Dr. Mark Moore on patients with severe deformities in East Timor. Our contribution of the KY driver and carry case which made his job in treating patients much easier.

In October 2002, 5 Campbelltown members and their partners visited Ipoh, Malaysia, and in April 2003, 6 Ipoh Rotarians and 3 partners and one son, returned the gesture by venturing to Adelaide on a return visit. The two Rotary clubs entered a Sister Club relationship, with the signing of a "Certificate of International Friendship". At the beginning of the Rotary year, RI drew our focus to the Polio Plus program, setting a challenge for more funds to be raised, in aim to complete the RI project by 2005. Our club pledged to raise funds and held a Polio Eradication Dinner in late May, which resulted in our contribution being approximately \$20,000. (Auction Elaborate)

Businesses in our community never went unnoticed, with many good people in their vocation, always prepared to give and go that extra mile to serve in the community. One example of those people is "Tony and Mark Fruit and Veg at Newton" who were awarded with the Rotary Vocational Service Award for the year. The club also had the opportunity to visit Paradise Motors and the Grainhouse Bakery to experience their hospitality in a workplace environment, and to learn about their vocations and involvement in the community.

Most significantly, the fellowship of our club back then kept the members and their partners in very close contact with each other as they participated and supported the many club events. In particular, the visit to the Hindu Temple and the monthly dinner night's out by the members' partners. (DG Visit Elaborate)

That year, our club continued to maintain a proud status in having the reputation of being the largest membership club in the district of 9520. This reflects the stability in the club whereby membership retention was and still a priority. In 2002-3, the club gained 2 new members and 1 new honorary member keeping the level of membership constant.

It was also my privilege to have had the opportunity to recognize some of the members of the club as Paul Harris Fellows, along with 3 partners of charter members. On 9th Dec 2002 Shirlee Inkenharg, Miffy Grosvenor and Annita Sommariva, whose husbands were charter members of this club, received their Awards. At our Birthday Meeting on 17th Feb 2003, the late Pat Ruotolo and Jeff Neale received their Awards and Dean Fleming received a Sapphire Pin.

A very positive initiative was taken up by Public Relations with the assistance of our Web Master and Public Relation convener, resulting in a higher awareness of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown in our community. Together it was made possible to reach out into the community to showcase Rotary's involvement in local and International projects through the electronic media and printed publications. The Rotary Club of Campbelltown has always been well represented at District level, which has made the club very active in all avenues of service. Twenty-three club members plus partners attended the District Conference that year, held at the Barossa Valley, and eight members plus partners travelled to Brisbane for the Rotary International World Convention. Everyone enjoyed the fellowship and information gained from these gatherings. The dedicated commitment and enthusiastic support given throughout the year was an outstanding achievement by our club.

I would like to give a special mention to the 2002-3 position holders.

It was an absolute honour and privilege to serve as President of this club. The experience was the culmination of my 10 years as a Rotarian and my passion for the Rotary organization. That year, Carla and I enjoyed the opportunities of interacting and sharing with our members and partners. We met so many new Rotarians locally and from overseas, and in most occasions, inspired by their dedication to the Rotary Motto of "Service Above Self". I would like to express my sincere gratitude and appreciation to all Rotarians and partners, for all the support which made my year as President a most memorable and enjoyable one.

I would like to share a quote from Paul Harris to the new and continuing members in Rotary, "Some of the most powerful forces in this world are invisible. No mortal man has ever seen electricity, yet this is what makes industry function. Gravity cannot be seen, yet the magnificent Niagara Falls depend on it. Even the air we breathe, yet it makes miracles. The gates of Empires have been spread open by the forces of ideas. At the base of the good deeds done by Rotary there is an invisible power: the power of goodwill, and it is precisely through this power that Rotary exists".

To conclude, sowing the seeds of love in 2002-3 resulted in a great harvest of understanding, fellowship, commitment and creating change in fulfilling the vision of the Rotary World President; Bhichai Rattakul.

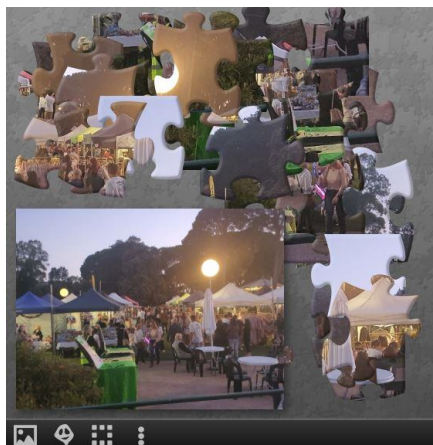

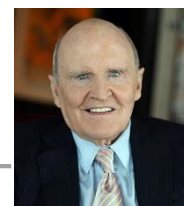

Bundle of Joy Mission 2021 (Philippines) International Committee

One of our Rotary Members, Maria Figg, comes from Cebu in the Philippines. Through her we have set up a 'sister' relationship with the Rotary Club of Cebu East.

Our committee voted to donate \$2,000 to their **Bundles of Joy** yearly mission: to give up to 300 food parcels at PHP 350 each containing sardines, rice, noodles, energy drink, corned beef, biscuits, soap to a *needy community*.

The RC of Cebu East decided on 31 October 2021, that it should go to the Cebu community of **Mountain Barangay Babag** because most of its inhabitants are successful vegetable and fruit growers, whose produce is sold in Markets in Cebu City. Because of COVID these markets are not open: viz the *growers do not have any income*.

Why did President Heinz Ackermann ask us for help? Because of COVID only 6 of their 19 members could pay their dues in full and one paid only half. They have little cash reserves. "There are those in need in our community, will you help us help them?"

And we did. This is the poster made for the distribution of those Bundles of Joy.
