Jacqui Caudle from Meals on Wheels will be there to give a brief presentation and to answer any questions. To date Meals on Wheels have provided lunches at no cost.


We will endeavour to have regular services to chat with the community.

If you know of anyone that is wanting company and wants an outing each fortnight, please let them know about our program.


I have also printed several copies of the May Active Ageing Newsletter from the Campbelltown Council. There is an article re Community Connections, (see p2 above) ... the word is out there!

# Guest Speakers -Paul Baker & Jimmy Day- Chefs on Wheels



Chair Damian Leach introduced Guest Speakers Paul Baker and Jimmy Day from Chefs on Wheels.

"But before I do that, I'd like to provide some context. COVID-19 has profoundly impacted the Australian economy since arriving in Australia in January 2020. Measures to reduce the spread (e.g., social distancing, commercial trading restrictions, and stay-at-home orders) have had varying impacts on economic activity.



The most noticeable impacts were driven by two COVID-19 variants: the L-strain of the virus, which arrived in Australia in January 2020, and the Delta strain, which was first detected in June 2021.

The arrival of the L-strain of COVID-19 triggered an Australia wide lockdown on 23 March 2020. The first significant round of restrictions included temporary closures of pubs, clubs, cafes and restaurants, with various other service providers following shortly after. Many workplaces advised their employees to work from home where possible. Household social distancing measures were put in place, with the most severe restrictions being that gatherings were restricted to two people. Restrictions began to ease across the country between late April and early May 2020.

A surge in COVID-19 cases in Victoria triggered the state to go into a second lockdown on 8 July 2020, with <u>stage 4</u> stay-at-home restrictions introduced in August. There were shorter lockdowns enforced in Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia.

The emergence and subsequent rapid spread of the Delta strain in June 2021 triggered various lockdowns across all states and territories, with Victoria, the ACT and NSW enduring the most prolonged, strictest restrictions. Leaving home was only permitted for essential reasons, and mandatory mask-wearing was enforced. PCR testing ramped up, and national and state governments strongly encouraged Australians to get vaccinated. Targets for vaccination rates were set across states and territories with the incentive of easing restrictions and ending lockdowns when these targets were met.

I provide this information because many businesses shut their doors during this time. Unemployment was anticipated to go into the mid to high teens, and bankruptcies were forecast to skyrocket. Of course, governments of multiple levels put in place support for individuals and businesses, but there wasn't a great deal of entrepreneurialism provoked at this time. As an economy, we became risk averse. Chefs on Wheels is one local story of innovation and entrepreneurialism.

The two gentlemen we have with us tonight, Paul and Jimmy, have backgrounds in some of the best restaurants in Australia as chefs.

Paul was the Adelaide Advertiser "Chef of the Year" in 2015 and 2017 and was also awarded Chef of the Year by the Restaurant & Catering Association.

Jimmy grew up immersed in the Barossa Valley wine scene and opened a cellar door and small restaurant at this family's winery. After several vintages making wine, he returned to Adelaide to start Edible Exchange, a fine food distribution business.

I'll leave them to tell you more about the story of Chefs on Wheels. Please welcome them."



Paul & Jimmy then gave a presentation on how it all started; the devastating effect of Covid on their industry; the urgency to reinvent themselves and assist others struggling to survive under covid and shutdowns with no one knowing what to do; how to keep their jobs & those of their staff and earn a living again? Looking back, despite the hardships it has been worth it. It was something they had to Do, it was the Right Idea with the Right People and the Right

Time. How did it begin? Well before Covid Paul had worked as a chef in many high-end restaurants and was when Covid hit working in the Botanic Restaurant. When you are a Chef, your life was tied to the restaurant, you can't commit to anything in your private life. He even missed the his first Father's day

with his daughter as he was called into work. Once Covid came along Paul finally had a chance to reflect. Jimmy, prior to covid, had worked in the industry but saw a niche market and started Edible Exchange a distribution business that delivered high end produce and supplies directly to the restaurants. In 2019 Edible Exchange were doing so well they bought the Ravioli Factory at Glynde which had a commercial kitchen, packing and freezer facilities. It was a base to expand. Then Covid hit early 2020! Everything was in shutdown. Restaurants and eateries closed! No jobs, no reason for deliveries? After brainstorming Paul, Annabelle and Jimmy joined forces, they had the facilities at Glynde, could produce the food as normal, partner with other restaurants and help them survive as well by working together. They would collect the meals and deliver it to customers who were in lockdown. They would call the business -Chef on Wheels. Within 36 hours it was a reality. They setup a website which was so successful it crashed with so many hits! There was a huge demand. Their 2-3 days business plan worked. They received huge support from restaurants and customers who wanted them to survive. After a hectic start in early 20 where it was day by day survival ,things slowly started to settle down and confidence returned. Restaurants & their staff though they had no customers could survive if they partnered with Chef on Wheels. It was a win win for all. Not just in providing income but Hope. Presently they have over 20 staff, 9 fulltime and operate in Adelaide, Sydney, Melbourne and some regional centres. They produce a wide range of their own restaurant quality meals and trial new meals using their own test kitchen. They now have a database of over 7000 and they engage their customers by asking them what they want?
