INDUCTION of Dr Nigel Quadros into the Membership of the Club

• Damian Leach introduced Dr Nigel Quadros. Nigel is a Fellow of the Australasian Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine (RACP) and works as a Senior Rehabilitation Medicine Physician in Central Adelaide Local Health Network which is affiliated with the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, the Royal Adelaide hospital, and Hampstead Rehabilitation Centre. He is also a Senior Clinical Lecturer in the Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences at the University of Adelaide where he is involved in both undergraduate and post graduate medical teaching. His clinical interests are mainly in stroke and general neurological rehabilitation.

His special interest is in assessment and management of people with late effects of polio, and he has been conducting a medical post-polio clinic at Queen Elizabeth hospital since 2005. His research area currently involves studying the functional decline in ageing polio survivors.

Rotary Information by -RCC Past President Tony Uren July 1983-June1984



Tony Uren enlightened us all,of his year as President

of the Club from July 1983-June1984 .

It was a most interesting and entertaining talk that refreshed the memories of some older members and gave an intriguing glimpse into the past for newer members.

At the time, it was an all male club & they met at the Reservoir Hotel. They assembled at the bar for pre-dinner drinks and afterwards for fellowship; they had song books; the loyal toast was done after the meal so the smokers could light up; monthly fellowship comprised highly competitive rounds of darts or carpet bowls; committee meetings were in private homes where the partners would often compete on who provided the best or most supper; there were 59 members; 0 resignations; 1 death; 12 members had 100% attendance. There were many club legends active in the club at the time -namely, Richard Fereday, Barry Donaldson, Len Rowlands, Albert Sommariva, Eric Webb, David Tuckwell, Gordon Strawbridge, Vic Sharp, Ray Grosvenor, Theo Inkerharg & Ian Reddy to name a few .

Kevin Parkinson was nominated for DG.

They setup a Probus Club, Morialta RC & an Interact Club.

Vocational-Factory Visits; Case Study nights; guest speakers; invited business guests to meetings **Fellowship**: Clubs Visit; Games night-Pool & Table tennis; Picnic at the Gorge-tennis, cricket, races etc Christmas night at the golf club; Bowls at Tranmere-70 attendees; Globe Derby Park

Community Service: Abbey Burton Van- supported by Greg Crafter MP was in the TV,Radio & Press a a specially equipped Van donated to Abbey a 12yo with special needs. This was all done at a special meeting where the van was presented at Paradise Motors; Mardi Gras; Elderly Christmas Night; Urine testing-446 tests (Not Urine Tasting!) Donations to the RFDS & the Athelstone CFS.

Tony concluded his talk with some amusing yarns & anecdotes of the times. They were great times!
