Rotary Information- Jeff Neale My Year as President 2007-2008



Good evening, President Stephany and fellow Rotarians It is my pleasure this evening to share with you some memories from my year as President in 2007-2008 and some of the activities that we undertook in that year.

My team for that year included: Vice President - David Richards, Secretary - Peter Rumbelow, Treasure - Graham Wallis and President Elect - Lin Green. I felt privileged to have these gentlemen as part of my executive team as they had been part of my life at Campbelltown Church for many years. More particularly David and Peter whose families I had grown up with. The rest of the board consisted of Scott Nichols, Peter De Palma, Haran Howard, John Schubert, Reg Bennett, Karen Beck, Mary Vincent and immediate Past President Brian Stevens.

The list is quite long of the many other people who served the club that year, but I would like to acknowledge that my father, Reg was the Song Leader, our late friend Ian Reddy was the Historian and Almoner, Tony Uren – Program, Garth Holmes – Sergeant and Peter Allen – Deputy Sergeant. Again, these were people that I had grown up with and felt very supported by.



In that year, Haran Howard and his fundraising team raised \$91,549 - \$59,000 from the shed, \$12,000 from Carnivale, \$6,500 from the Art Show and \$3,500 from the door raffle.

One of the significant community projects for Scott Nicholls and his committee was supplying a wheelchair lift for the Campbelltown Community bus. We also supported the Indigenous Health Scholarship program with Rebecca Richards as the recipient of our support. Many of you would remember, Rebecca went on in her career to become the first Indigenous Rhodes Scholar.

In New Generations under the leadership of Karen Beck, we supported RYWELL (Rotary Youth Wellbeing) and sent students to RYLA and RYPEN. The committee also put plans in place for the arrival of our incoming exchange student Marie -Caroline Fonsny.

The Vocational committee under the Leadership the Mary Vincent organised two vocational visits. One to Koorong Book shop and also to one to "Moving Juice". The club awarded a Pride of Workmanship award to Ms Glen Uren from Athelstone Primary School, and we presented a Small Business Excellence award to Dr Nicholas Lloyd of the Paradise Veterinary Hospital.

International under the leadership of John Schubert ensured we met our commitment of \$100/member to the Rotary Foundation. We donated 4 Shelter boxes for the earthquakes in Burma and China. We also hosted a Group study exchange team from District 1120 Kent and East Sussex.

Fellowship was under the direction of Peter De Palma. We had many fellowship nights – Pasta Night, Italian Night where the Consul of Italy, Dr Tomaso Coniglio was a guest, and this was held at the Marche Club. We also had the regular bowls night, club birthday and children's Christmas party.

Membership was in the hands of Reg Bennett. We started the year with 73 members and closed the year with 75, a net gain of 2 members. During the year there were 7 members that achieved 100% attendance and 16 members achieved over 90% attendance. Through the year we inducted 6 new members, 3 members resigned and on member passed away. Which brings me to this...

One of the sad moments for the year was the passing of our own member, PP and PDG Bob Northcote. This was a difficult and very sad time for us all. As the club President, it was particularly difficult and sad as Bob had been a great friend and mentor. Bob was an excellent leader of our club and the district. I know we were all very proud of the successful Conference we put on in the previous year for Bob and Margaret. A very sad time. However, we are privileged to still have Margaret serving and supporting our club.

On a happy note, I believe we had a year of excellent speakers keeping us entertained and informed thanks to program officer Tony Uren.

It was also never a dull moment with antics of Sergeant Garth Holmes and his deputy Peter Allen It was a privilege to have an opportunity to lead this club. Thanks to those of you that are here that served as leaders and who served as regular club members. I was well supported by you all and I thank you.








Speaker: Dr Trudy Lin
