Chair Denise Dinham introduced member Betty Gebert who spoke passionately on raising awareness of the incidence of ovarian cancer, the risk factors and symptoms to watch out for.

Did you know it was World Ovarian Cancer day May 8th & Ovarian Cancer Australia awareness month March-April 2022?

THIS YEAR THE FOCUS OF RESEARCH IS FOR YOUNGER WOMEN

About Ovarian Cancer: over 1700 women in Australia will be diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer, each year and over 1000 will die from the disease.

NB : There is no effective screening program for ovarian cancer, so the best way of detecting the disease is to know the signs and symptoms.

In Australia, the overall five year survival rate for women diagnosed with ovarian cancer is 48 percent In breast cancer it is 92 percent.

RISK FACTORS: (Number 4 Resource Booklet) is available on the OCA Website or by contacting OCA.

- A family history of ovarian cancer -the risk is higher if 1 or more blood relatives (such as mother, sister, or daughter has had ovarian cancer)
- Family history of breast or colon cancer
- A mutation in 1 of several known genes. Up to 15 percent of all cases of invasive ovarian cancer involve the inheritance of a mutated gene. Women who have inherited mutations in the brca1 or brca2 genes have a substantially increased risk of ovarian and breast cancer. Women with lynch syndrome hnpcc. (non-polyposis colon cancer have an increased lifetime risk of ovarian cancer.)
- Increasing age
- Medical conditions such as endometriosis
- Use of HRT (hormone replacement therapy)
- Tobacco smoking
- Obesity

SIGNS AND

Learn the common signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer.



Signs and symptoms:

There is no early detection test for ovarian cancer, so all women need to be aware of the symptoms.

- Note it is important to remember, the signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer -symptoms can be vague, and similar to other medical conditions and it is important to seek an early medical checkup with your GP if you experience any of these symptoms :
- Unexplained fatigue
- Unexplained weight gain or loss
- changes in bowel habits eg: constipation
- Increased abdominal size or persistent abdominal bloating
- Abdominal or pelvic pain or urgency to urinate often
- Lower back pain
- Indigestion or nausea
- Bleeding after menopause or in-between periods
- Pain during sex or bleeding after
- Feeling full after eating a small amount
- Even unusual bleeding should be checked by your GP asap to preclude other less serious conditions do not put this down to menopause or irregular periods and dismiss from your mind

Remember too- a pap test for cervical cancer does not detect ovarian cancer (a common belief) so," let's ovary act" (Ovarian Cancer Australia)

OVARIAN CANCER AUSTRALIA provides services and support so the any woman in Australia who is diagnosed with ovarian cancer WILL NOT WALK ALONE

Betty announced that as part of the night's TEAL event all funds raised through the raffle, door prize, silent auction and the gold pot will go to this very worthy cause. (Editor: just over \$660 was raised)

In addition, the Club through the Community Services committee has donated \$3000 to Ovarian Cancer Research.

Today 5 women will be diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer and tomorrow 5 more. The signs and symptoms of OC can be so mild that even Doctors can dismiss it as menopause but if not detected early OC can lead to stage 4 cancer and by then it can be terminal with a 48% death rate within 5 years.

It is vital that we raise awareness of OC to be aware of the symptoms and warning signs, so they aren't dismissed, and lives saved. (A link to the Ovarian Cancer Australia Website is <u>HERE</u>)

Rotarian Gail Casey then spoke both courageously and powerfully about her own journey with cancer. In 1998 she was had breast cancer and after chemo and treatment she thought she was finally out of the woods and yet 6 years later she started to experience some mild medical symptoms that she could have shrugged off, but instead got checked out and was diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer. Within the week, she underwent a radical hysterectomy. At the time there was very little information about OC, she was surprised. It is so vital that you are aware & get any symptoms checked. Please learn from her

experience before it is too late.

Unlike say breast cancer, where there can be something physically obvious like a lump in the breast, OC is sneakier. Gail considers herself very lucky that she is in the 52% bracket that survived OC.

Gail caught it early, but many don't and so please be aware, know the symptoms and don't put off getting checked out.






