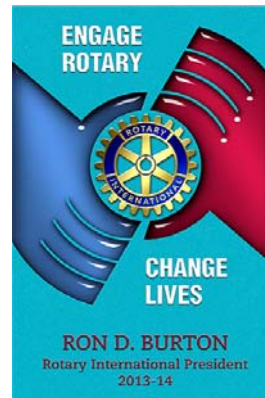

## What is Rotary?

### *Rotary is*

- An organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world.
- The world's first service club which was founded in Chicago in 1905.
- 32,000 Clubs with 1,200,000 members located in over 200 Countries.
- The Rotary Foundation, which each year provides some \$60 million for international scholarships, cultural exchanges, and humanitarian projects large and small that improve the quality of life for millions of people.
- PolioPlus, Rotary's commitment to eradicate Polio in the world. Two billion children have been immunized, five million have been spared disabilities, and over 250,000 deaths from Polio have been prevented. Only 4 countries in the world remain Polio endemic.
- Planning and carrying out a remarkable variety of humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs that touch people's lives in their local communities and our world community.
- Membership is by invitation and is based upon a vocational classification. Attendance at meetings is a basic obligation and a member may make-up a meeting at any Rotary Club in the world.
- *The Rotary Club of Santa Rosa Sunrise*, chartered June 30, 1986, has over 65 men and women representing a diverse cross-section of local business, professional and public service organizations. The club meets each Thursday at 7:15 AM at the Fountain Grove Inn, 101 Fountain Grove Parkway, Santa Rosa for fellowship, breakfast, and programs which are informative and timely. The club is part of Rotary District 5130 comprised of 45 clubs and 2,500 members.
