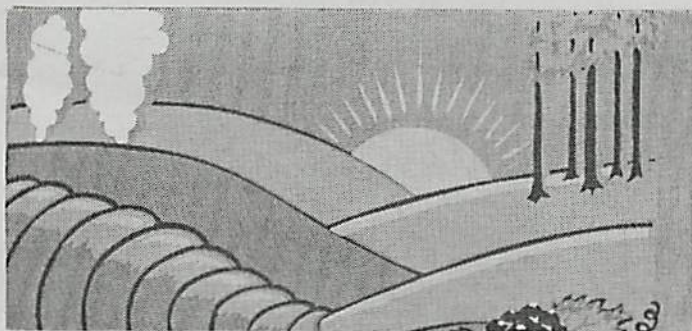

Coming Programs

Thursday

This week we have a club assembly to discuss a number of our projects and activities.

Major topics to be discussed include the Steele Lane School Fields project dedication on June 5, the World Community Services eyeglass project to Haiti, in late June, and the club's annual golf tournament to be held May 23rd.

Steele Lane: Pat Solar is organizing the Steele Lane ceremony, to dedicate the grass playing field, irrigation system and backstops our club installed -- at a total cost of \$120,000 We plan to cancel our morning meeting that day and meet for lunch.

Tentative plans call for including the entire school student body to attend, along with school officials, PTA, etc. We will invite all of the local businesses that contributed a total of \$75,000 to the project.

We also plan a big media splash, inviting local television stations, newspapers and radio stations.

Golf Tournament: Our 8th Annual Sunrise Rotary Club Golf Tournament, traditionally our biggest fund raiser of the year, will be held May 23rd at Oakmont. This will be a chance for co-chairmen Jeff Young and Steve Herron to discuss the tournament's status and plans (see story, next page).

Haiti Project: A number of club members will be traveling to Haiti from June 14 to 21 along with optometrist Les Shipley.

Total trip cost is estimated at \$10,000. Three airline tickets donated by Larry Martin and his firm will reduce club expenses.

John Jones is organizing the project.

April 17

"Project Share Life," a Rotary bone marrow donor project organized by the Niles Henderson of the Southwest Eureka Rotary Club, will be this week's topic.

Henderson started the project after a bone marrow transplant saved the life of his son, Steve.

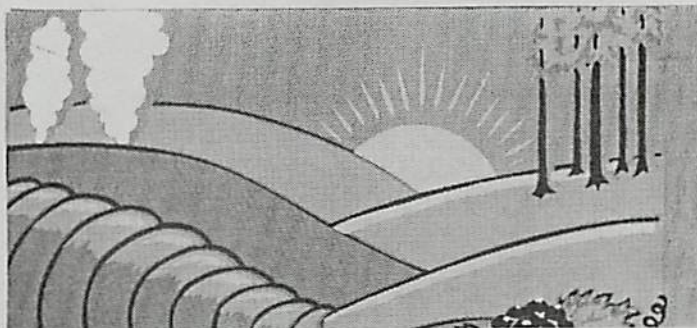

Community Service projects

The Board of Directors, at its April 9th meeting, approved funding for the following Community Service grant applications. The applications were approved by the Community Services committee, and recommended for approval by Director Pat Solar, who directs club Community Services:

Elsie Allen High School -- \$1,000 toward the cost of band uniforms. The grant was proposed by our Interact Club at the school and they strongly recommended our support.

YMCA -- \$500 for the Y-Tenn Center and Leadership training program. (We have supported this program in the past.)

Choices for Change -- \$250 for a counseling program designed to help families of chemical dependency develop communication skills, problem solving, anger management and relationship building skills.

Sonoma County Sheriff's Department -- \$250 for the Canine Trading Cards program. The cards are handed out to 10,000 youngsters

at Sonoma County Schools in the safety and drug-awareness program.

Santa Rosa Summer Youth Program -- \$250 for the summer employment program. Provides funds to pay the PG&E bill for the program's office at the Santa Rosa Plaza.

Redwood Empire Boy Scouts -- \$250 to provide camping scholarships allowing boys to attend Camp Navarro. Cost for one boy is \$160.

DeShields Memorial Scholarship: Directors voted to award three \$1,000 college scholarships this year, to deserving students finishing their senior year at Elsie Allen High School.

The applicants, recommended by Director Pat Solar, and counselors at Elsie Allen, will receive the awards an assembly in late May. All three plan to attend Santa Rosa Junior College before moving on to four-years schools.
