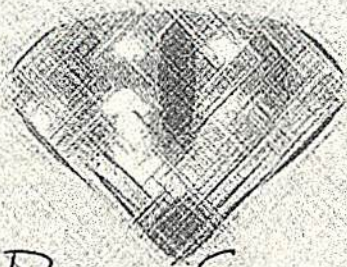

Christiane Roedel - April 9 Speaker

I was born and grew up after World War II in the port city of Bremen, in what was then known as West Germany. I received my teaching credential in Goettingen and taught in the state of Hessa during the seventies. Realizing that my heart was not necessarily in teaching children I changed my career and became Director of the Berlitz School of Languages in Frankfurt/Main.

Being the daughter of sea captain who sailed around Cape Horn in 1926 on a four-masted bark, I believe I inherited his desire to travel the world. My contribution to the American bicentennial anniversary was a trip from New York to L.A. and back. I realized its vastness and diversity, learned about the American people and to appreciate their way of life.

In 1979 my husband, who is American, and I decided to move to the United States where we settled in Long Beach, CA, close to where his family was living at the time. Even after the birth of our two sons, born 1980 and 1986, I managed to stay in touch with the business world and found my calling in sales. I enjoy meeting and working with people, connecting and sharing information and services. I continue to remain actively involved in the community through volunteering.

In 1991 our family decided to move to Sonoma County because of its beauty and open space. Because we were unable to find satisfactory employment we decided to start an advertising agency. This enabled me to get to know a lot of business people in the community and to establish ourselves very well. The company was sold after 5 years.

In 1996 I joined The Pathways Group, Inc., headquartered in Woodville, WA (Seattle area) which had just opened their first satellite office in Santa Rosa, CA. The Pathways Group develops custom software and hardware for electronic banking, data and transaction processing, and smart card applications.

I have been working on finding new applications and currently am in charge of the implementation of a program called 'Smart Scrip' involving a network of non-profit organizations and retailers. Smart Scrip is based on the paper scrip program. It minimizes most of the paper work and other associated tedium, transfers monies electronically and thereby offers benefits like security, loss prevention, convenience and much more. The program will be tested in Sonoma County and then expanded nationwide.

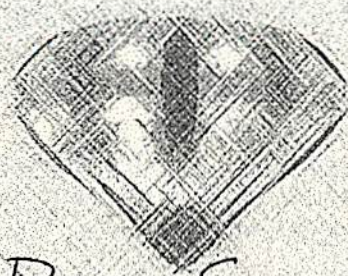

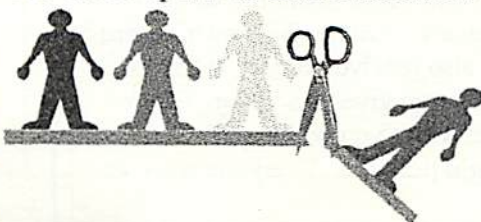

Make Service an Integral Part of Your Life

The following is taken from the book

Don't Sweat the Small Stuff . . . and it's all small stuff

written by Richard Carlson, Ph.D.. When I read this chapter, it seemed like it had Rotary written all over it. I thought it would be appropriate to include it in the bulletin, both as a gentle reminder of the pleasures of being of service, and also as a confirmation of the principles that Rotary has exemplified for over 90 years.

Make Service an Integral Part of Your Life

To become a kinder, more loving individual requires action. Yet, ironically, there is nothing specific you have to do, no prescription to follow. Rather, most genuine acts of kindness and generosity seem natural; they stem from a type of thinking where service and giving have been integrated into the person's thought process.

Several teachers and philosophers that I have learned from have suggested that I begin my day by asking myself the question, "How can I be of service?" I have found this to be useful in reminding me of the multitude of ways that I can be helpful to others. When I take the time to ask this question, I find answers popping up all day long.

If one of your goals is to be of help to others, you will find the most appropriate ways. Your chances to be of service are endless. Sometimes the best way that I can be of service is to offer my home to a friend (or even a stranger) in need. Other times, it's to give my seat to an elderly person on the train, help a youngster across the monkey bars, speak to a group, write a book, help out in my daughter's school, write a check to a charity, or pick up litter on the road. The key, I believe, is to remember that being of service isn't a one-time effort. It's not doing something nice for someone and then wondering why others aren't being nice too, or doing things for us. Instead, a life of service is a lifelong process, a way of thinking about life. Does the trash need to be taken out? If so, go ahead and take it out even if it's not your turn. Is someone you know being difficult? Maybe they need a hug or someone to listen to them. Are you aware of a charity that is in trouble? Could you possibly give a little extra this month?

I have learned that the best way to be of service is often very simple - it's those little, quiet, often unnoticed acts of kindness that I can choose on a daily basis - being supportive of a new endeavor by my spouse, or simply taking the time and energy to listen. I know that I have a long way to go toward my goal of becoming a more selfless person. However, I also know that as I have attempted to integrate service into my life, I have felt better and better about the way I choose to live. There is an ancient saying, "Giving is its own reward." It's really true. When you give, you also receive. In fact, what you receive is directly proportional to what you give. As you give more freely of yourself in your own unique ways, you will experience more feelings of peace than you ever thought possible. Everyone wins, especially you.

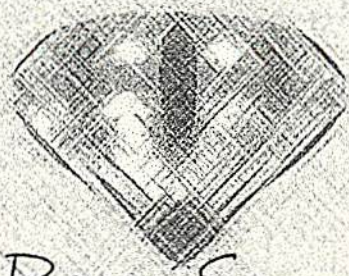

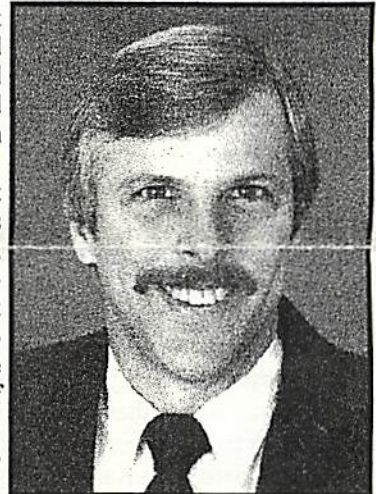


**The District Conference

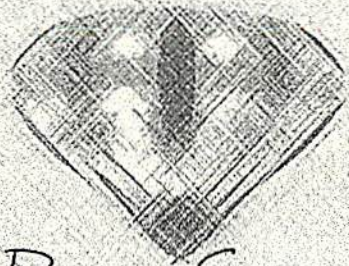

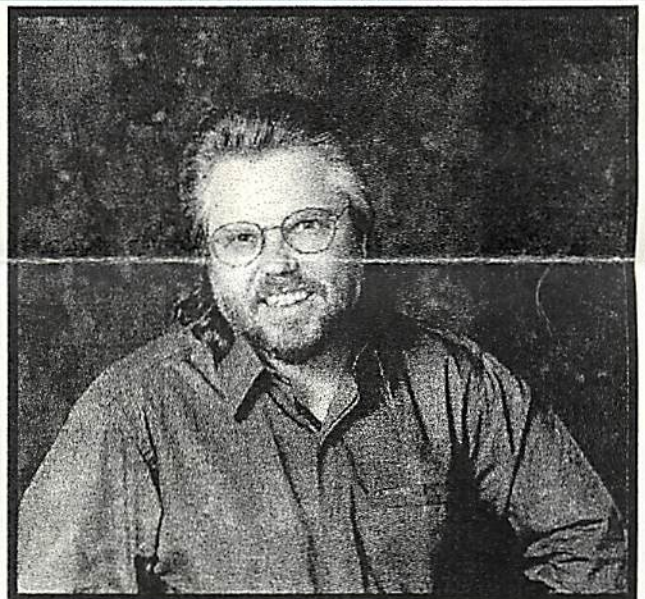

Tom Simoneau - April 30

Tom Simoneau is a 16-year veteran wine consultant at Windsor Vineyards and a sales team manager who helped develop and implement the telemarketing program. A native of Maine and a former rock-n-roll band leader, he also owns and operates Simoneau Ranch, a 12½-acre vineyard and winery at the western end of Sonoma County's Alexander Valley growing region. In addition, Simoneau is known as "The Wine Guy" from his upbeat and educational one-minute wine tips, aired on News Talk 1350 KSRO and the Wine Brats Web site, www.winebrats.org.



Simoneau began making wine as a hobby in 1983 with friends' second crop grapes, doing "everything wrong" but enough right to win a Bronze medal in the amateur division of the Sonoma County Harvest Fair that year. By 1992, his 1990 Meritage yielded a "Sweepstakes Award" in the same competition, and launched his career as the "Sonoma County Wine Guy" on KSRO.

Since purchasing the Alexander Valley ranch in 1988, Simoneau's one-man operation has commercially cultivated 10 acres of grapes, 5 of Chardonnay and 5 of Cabernet Sauvignon, and sold them each year to local wineries such as Beringer and Clos du Bois.

Here is all the news that is fit to print:

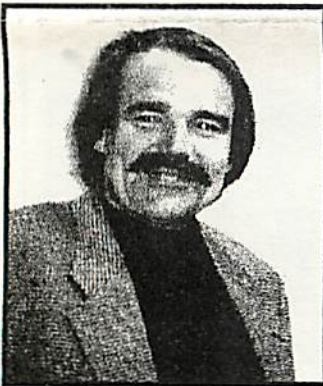

In 1992, Simoneau offered his Chardonnay crop to Windsor Vineyards, whose winemaker, Carol Shelton, was so pleased with the quality that she chose to produce and bottle the wine with its own vineyard designation. Her decision has resulted in over 10 medals and awards for Windsor Vineyards Private Reserve Chardonnay, Alexander Valley, Simoneau Ranch since 1992. Based on the success of Simoneau's Chardonnay, Windsor Vineyards sought out the Cabernet Sauvignon crop in 1994. Prior to its February 20 release at Windsor's annual awards banquet, the first-ever, 1994 Windsor Vineyards Private Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon, Alexander Valley, Simoneau Ranch won a Silver Medal at the 16th Annual Cloverdale Citrus Fair Wine Competition. "I'm hoping for a Grower's Award at the Sonoma County Harvest Fair this year, for either the Chardonnay or the Cabernet," Simoneau remarks. "That's my goal."
