The Rotary International Emblem and Guidelines Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another. In 1922, the organization decided to create and preserve an emblem for the exclusive use of all Rotarians, and the following year, the present emblem, a gearwheel with 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted. A keyway was added to signify the usefulness of the gearwheel. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention. Royal blue and gold were chosen as the official Rotary colors and the flag of Rotary was designated as a white field with the emblem emblazoned in its center. The emblem, worn as a lapel pin, now identifies Rotarians around the world.

Jorian Powers educated and entertained us with the help of Norton, a mellow white golden retriever assistance dog. Jorjan has a fondness for Rotary, starting 30 years ago when she was granted Rotary college scholarship. The Assistance Dog Institute was founded by Bonnie Bergin, the same person who had founded the Canine Companions

for Independence. The Assistance Dog Institute adds the dimension of training-the-trainer and has a fantastic project at the Sierra Youth Center. There the incarcerated teens benefit as much as the dog in a program in which the youth trainers are paired with dogs for the duration of their mutual training. Jorjan showed a video from 20-20 on that program and

mentioned that Norton had also been on Opray Winfrey's show. She also talked about a college program to get High School students involved in a training program kids are 25% of our population and 100% of our future. The Institute places about 15 dogs per year. Last Week in Review

Mike Hauser

Chamber of Commerce

The speaker was Mike Hauser, CEO of the
Santa Rosa Chamber of Commerce. Mike shared
a lot from his 32 years of experience in chamber
work. Most recently, he has spent 14 years in
Fort Collins, a city with many similarities to
Santa Rosa, such as population, largest employer, key issues, etc.



Mike discussed many of the issues for Santa Rosa. On highway 101 widening, we have changed our approach, and are lobbying the congresspeople currently who will write the bill for transportation funding, and we probably will not try another increase in sales tax. On affordable housing, Mike suggests that the trend for increasing home prices is likely to continue. One reason is that Marin County is creating many jobs, but very little housing, since 85% of Marin County is protected land that cannot be developed. This causes pressures on 101 and on Sonoma County housing prices. Mike believes we need to enable developers to build more moderately-priced homes.

On tourism, Mike says that the Sonoma County Tourism market is recovering slowly. The opening of the Charles Schulz Museum on August 17 is creating a lot of interest, and should help tourism. On the aging workforce, Mike feels that we need to do more to ensure that the retiring people get replaced, especially nurses and other health care professionals.



enry Wendt is chairman of the Community Foundation of Sonoma County. The Foundation strives to make a difference in our community. It's mission includes "matching philanthropic interests with community needs by serving as a leader, resource



and catalyst to enrich the quality of life; develop a permanent endowment; encouraging philanthropy at all levels; providing comprehensive donor services; and responding to changing community needs and opportunities."

Henry Wendt served as Founder and Chairman of Global Health Care Partners, a unit of CSFB Private Equity, specializing in investments in health care businesses worldwide until January 1, 2001. He retired completely from CSFB on December 31, 2001. Mr. Wendt retired as Chairman of SmithKline Beecham in 1994 after nearly four decades in the pharmaceutical, health care products and services industry. He is generally recognized as a principal architect of the successful merger creating SmithKline Beecham in 1989. He was Chairman and Chief Executive of SmithKline Beckman prior to the merger with Beecham in 1989.

Mr. Wendt is Chairman of the Board of Directors of Computerized Medical Systems, Inc. and Arrail Dental (China), Ltd., and serves on the Boards of BioPartners, SA; Cambridge Laboratories, PLC; Wilson Greatbatch Technologies Ltd; Focus Technologies Inc.; and Prometheus Laboratories Inc. He also serves as Chairman of the Community Foundation of Sonoma County, Director of The Pacific Basin Institute at Pomona College, and as Trustee Emeritus of the American Enterprise Institute.

In 1994, Mr. Wendt was awarded the Order of the Rising Sun with Gold and Silver Star (the highest honor awarded to a non-Japanese) by the Government of Japan and in 1995 he was named Honorary Commander of the British Empire (CBE) by HRM Queen Elizabeth II.

Randy cited environmental, regulatory and funding to be the major challenges. Water supply is one of the major issues in this county and the North Bay. Demand can be as high as 84 million gallons per daythat puts us at capacity. There is water...Warm Springs is full, but we can't get to it because the Coho and Chinook salmon are endangered species. We need to push collectively from Monterey to Redwood Creek, to recover the fish to help solve the problem It is a difficult situation effected by flood control, sanitation, gravel and highway issues. In 6-10 years, we will be living with a limited supply of water.

Randy challenges us all to helpit is our duty to enthuse our elected officials and request government participation to support our short falls and cost increases. We also need cooperation from Marin County. "We are doing our fair share. We need to ask that they do their share to help solve the problem." In addition, we need to work on conservation, urban reuse and groundwater use as part of the solution.
