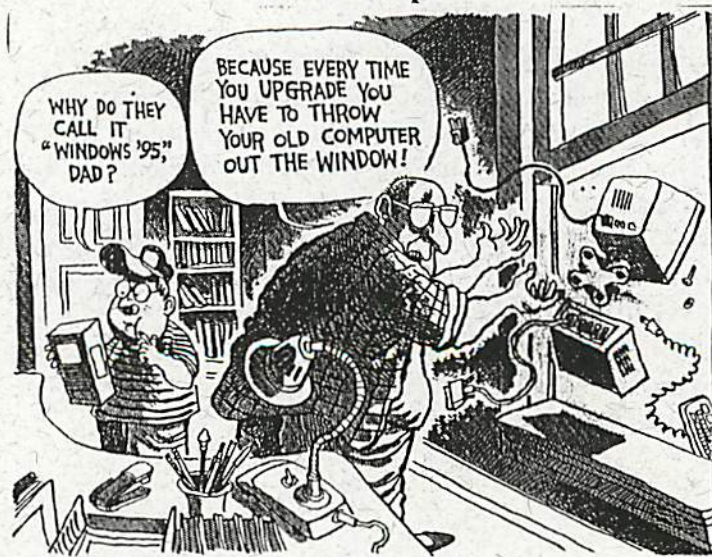
“South Of The Border...We’re Getting Closer”
