



The following sample letters were left with us by Bob Cassidy of C.A.R.E. They address his concerns with the "Victims of Crime Restitution Fund" and he asked for our assistance. These or similar letters sent to the Governor (or your Assembly Representative) would be appreciated.

Governor Pete Wilson State Capitol Sacramento, CA 95814

Dear Governor Wilson,

I am writing to alert you to a serious problem affecting crime victims in California, particularly child victims. The State Board of Control has virtually stopped paying for services for crime victims even though the State has made a clear commitment to assist these children. The stated reason is that of a budget deficit in the Victims of Crime Restitution Fund. A closer inspection reveals the real reason for this deficit is that restitution moneys are being diverted to other state programs.

We urge you to stop this budgetary theft, and restore solvency to

this fund directing restitution to go to crime victims first.

Without your immediate intervention, valuable services such as counseling to child sexual abuse victims will cease to exist.

Dear Governor Wilson:

I am writing to express my concern regarding the Victims of Crime Restitution Fund, which I understand has a serious deficit, resulting in funds not being paid to providers of services to crime victims. I urge you to make an emergency appropriation to this fund to alleviate the deficit so that crime victims, especially child victims, can receive theraputic treatment. I am concerned that unless providers of this valuable service can be reimbursed through this fund in a timely manner, they will not be able to continue to operate and it will be the child victims and their families who will have to go without treatment.

Please help to restore this program to its original intent: that crime victims receive restitution from criminals. Thank you very much.


