I am dependable.

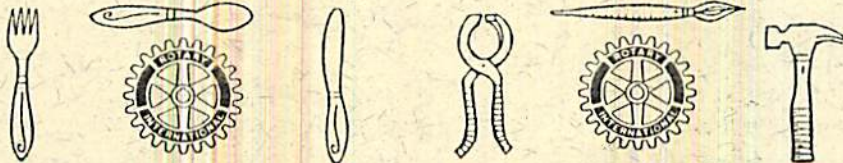
I am available.
