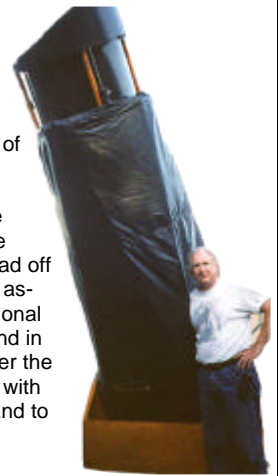

BILL RUSSELL - Ferguson Observatory

Bill Russell is a volunteer astronomer with the Robert H. Ferguson Observatory. He built a 24-Inch observatory-quality telescope out of spare parts and it is installed in one of the 3 wings of the observatory. The Valley of the Moon Observatory Association (VMOA), is responsible for the construction, maintenance and utilization of the Ferguson Observatory. The Observatory is within Sugarloaf Ridge State Park in Kenwood (east of Santa Rosa on Adobe Canyon Road off Highway 12). The VMOA is a volunteer amateur and professional astronomers organized as a non-profit association to provide educational programs about science and astronomy for students, the public, and in support of educators. It functions as a non-profit organization under the auspices of the California State Parks System, and in cooperation with our local state parks. 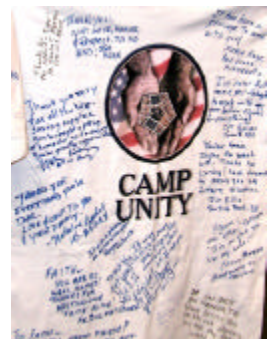

RED CROSS DISASTER RESPONSE



Faith Smagalski is a key volunteer and co-coordinator of the Sonoma County Red Cross Mental Health Team, which responds to numerous disasters in our county and around our nation. She provided us with a real insight into the tragedy, recovery process, compassion, integrity and national pride of the teams involved in the recovery process following the 9/11 terrorist attack on the Pentagon. Faith was a part of "Camp Unity", where she was assigned the midnight to 6 am shift at the tent of the U.S. Army's 54th Quarter Master Mortuary Affairs Unit. She is a psychologist out of UCLA with a Master's degree from UCSF and a special program in "traumatology" from Florida State. PP "hold-on-to-your-wallets Aita got LuAnn Campbell for \$10 just for showing up and not having anything exciting to report.

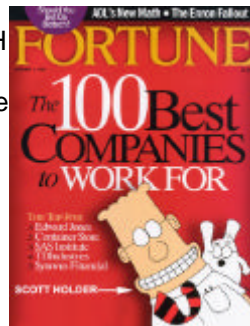


Tux Tuxhorn is once again in the newspaper with an extravagant housing development know as Byrne Court.

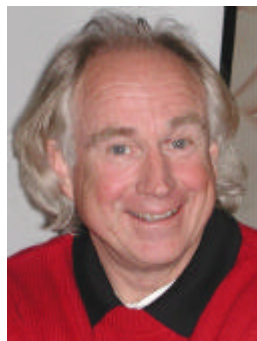

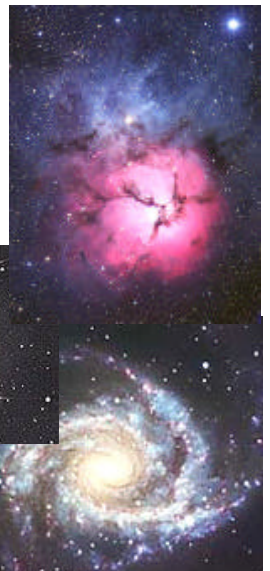

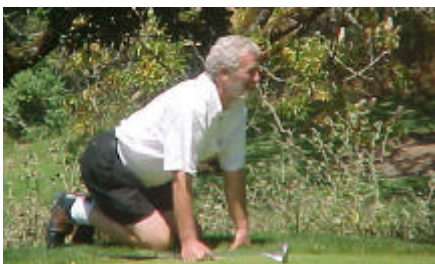

Since becoming the CEO in 1994, Timothy Duncan has tripled the Chapter's budget, quadrupled its number of volunteers and expanded its facilities to include a new, 12,000 square foot headquarters/disaster operations/education building. Under his leadership, the Sonoma County Chapter became one of the top 14 Strategic Chapters in California (out of 37). In 2002, Duncan was honored with the American Red Cross (California) "Golden Bear Award" for outstanding contributions to the mission of the Red Cross. A native San Franciscan, Timothy previously worked in the performing arts: He was Executive Director of the Miami City Ballet and prior to that he served with the San Francisco Ballet, the Cincinnati/New Orleans City Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet and the Pennsylvania Ballet. He has been appointed twice to the San Francisco Arts Commission. Mr. Duncan is a Rotarian and member of the Sonoma County Press Club.

Last Week in Review Jon Stiffler

Development Director, American Red Cross

Jon Stiffler was born and raised in Santa Rosa, California. After graduating from UC Berkeley, he relocated to the East Coast and earned 2 masters degrees. While working as an investment professional, Jon served on the Board of Directors of a Red Cross chapter in the Philadelphia area. After moving back to Sonoma County, Jon is putting his financial experience and love of the Red Cross together as Development Director for the Sonoma County Chapter. Jon gave us a little history and a lot of information on how the Red Cross operates. It started in 1859 when Henry Dunant (read the book) witnessed over 4000 wounded men lying unattended for days on a battlefield in Austria. The world headquarters is in Geneva Switzerland and the Red Cross symbol is the Swiss flag in reverse. The American Red Cross was started by Clara Barton during the Civil War. In Sonoma County there are 1200 volunteers. They have responded to over 65 disasters in the County. The Chapter is proud of all the training they do for instructors, CPR, first aid caregiving and disaster response. They have 70 people highly trained to respond to disasters. Larry Martin credited his training from the Red Cross for saving the life of his father during a dinner table choking incident.
