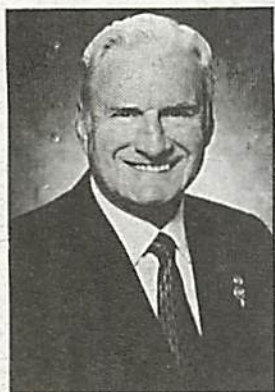

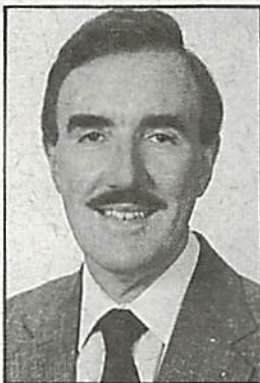

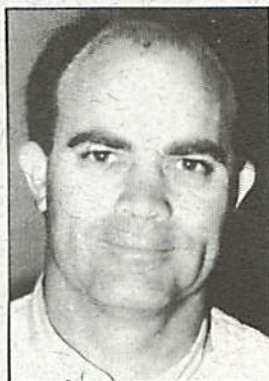

"As we approach the mid-point of the Rotary year, I think it's appropriate to discuss some topics related to this important effort.

- 1. Membership growth is a personal responsibility.** When you become a Rotarian, you accepted the responsibility for the personal application of the ideal of service. This responsibility includes an obligation... 'to share Rotary with others and to help extend Rotary through proposing qualified persons for Rotary club membership.'
- 2. Growth is not a quantity vs. quality issue.** [Rather than quantity of new members] adding qualified men and women to Rotary clubs will vastly increase our ability to do good in the world. Surely each one of us knows at least one friend, relative, colleague, or associate who is qualified to be a Rotarian and who would be delighted to serve as a member.
- 3. Retaining members is vital.** Stopping (membership) attrition is just as important as adding club members. Keep your current members interested by giving them work to do. Empower them to participate.
- 4. Membership should not be a "revolving door."** If you select qualified, interested individuals, thoroughly explain Rotary to them and give them important work to do, they will invest their lives in Rotary and will stay."
