- In Eureka, two recent fund-raising events -- a bicycle ride and a local school football game -- have resulted in donations to Rotary Project Share Life of more than \$7500!
- Also in Humboldt County, two marrow donor registration drives have been held at the College of the Redwoods -- and 88 new potential donors registered!
- Dr. Jerry Besses of the Petaluma Valley Rotary Club has raised \$50,000 to fund a marrow donor drive, to be held in early 1998. Rotarians are invited to participate as volunteers. For more information, call (707) 762-0001.
- Because of changes in funding policies, the Sacramento Blood Bank is now charging \$57.50 for each blood test to register a potential marrow donor. Rotary Project Share Life is focussing efforts on funding donor registration drives, where testing can be done more cost effectively. ## Community Service Projects Report

The following was submitted by Randy Seelye to report on the recent survey that was carried out to identify the wishes of the club regarding future Community Services Projects:

A Community Services project including \$5,000 or less of club money, with a number of work parties including from 10 to 20 people each, lasting about a month and done to benefit youth or senior citizens.

That would be the No. 1 choice, but we have many other scenarios that would also be favored by club members. Some would be more expensive and take longer to complete, some would be less expensive and much shorter!!

Here's what club members want, specifically:

--- More than half, 53% want the club's focus for Community Service to be on senior citizens and youth. But 47% think we should widen our philanthropy to other groups. Suggestions to widen our scope cover a very broad spectrum.

-- Overwhelmingly, club members want to be involved in

work parties. A total of 83.8% would volunteer for work parties (as their schedule permits -- 80.6%), including 25.8% who say they'll show up as often as needed.

- Club members definitely favor variety.
- Forty-four percent want projects to both include club cash and work parties.
- Forty-seven percent favor projects that just include cash, or are just work parties, and they also favor a combination of cash and work.
- Club members also favor variety in time and financial commitments.
- 56% think projects should vary in time commitments.
- 12.8% think projects should be done quickly, in 1 to 2 weeks.
- 12.8% think projects should be finished in a month.
- Two club members favor projects of up to a year, but only 1 wants projects of longer than a year.
- 68% think projects should require a variety of financial commitments, ranging from small to large..

-- The rest of the financial comments were divided, with 10% thinking costs should be up to \$10,000, 7.9% up to \$5,000. Only two respondents said costs should be more than \$10,000 but only a couple of members felt expenditures should be less than \$2,000. One person favored only small projects.

A total of 31 club members responded to the survey, which represented about 60% of the club membership in December. Pollster and past president Randy Seelye said the sampling is not scientific, thus can have a margin of error ranging from 1 to 2 work parties a year!
