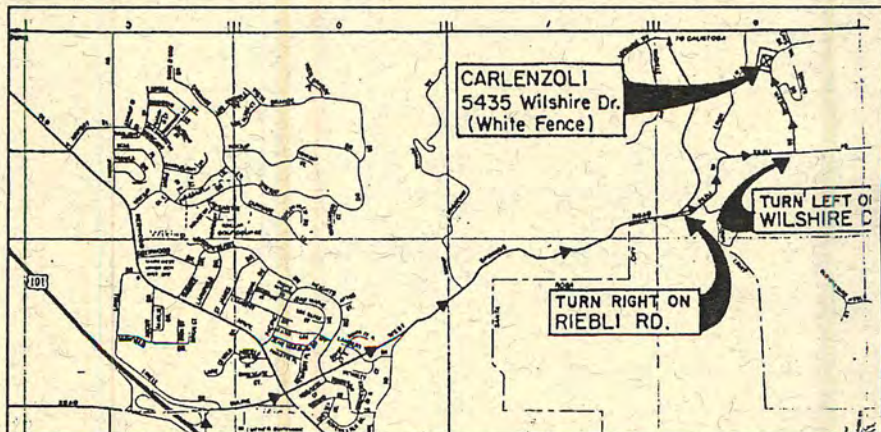
### SUNDAY SUNRISE POT-LUCK PICNIC

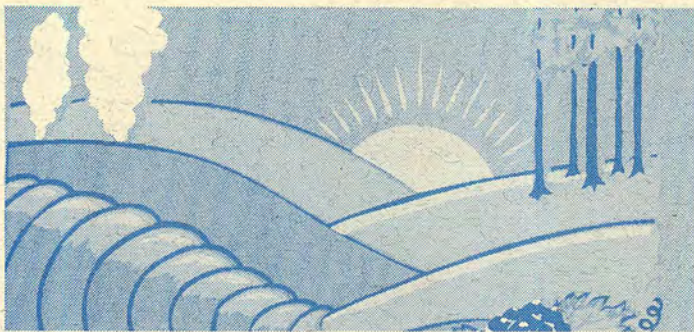

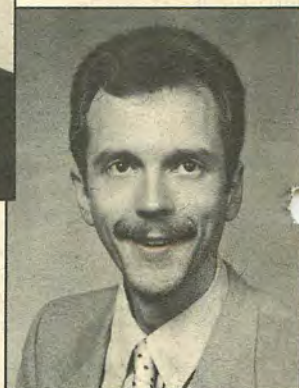

### ROTARY INFORMATION

#### "AUGUST IS ROTARY MEMBERSHIP MONTH"

---

There are four kinds of membership in Rotary

**ACTIVE** and **ADDITIONAL ACTIVE** are leaders in the business or profession under which they are classified. They must either work or live within the club's territory, the corporate limits of the city in which the club is located, or within the territorial limits of an immediately adjoining club.

**SENIOR ACTIVE** members are former active members who automatically become senior actives in one of the following ways: (1) having been active members of one or more Rotary clubs for at least 15 years; (2) being at least 60 years of age with ten or more years of active membership; (3) being at least 65 with five or more years of active membership; or (4) being president or past officers of Rotary International. Senior Active members who move to another locality may be elected by another club to this type of membership.

**PAST SERVICE** members are those who have retired from work after having held active membership for three or more years, but are not yet eligible for senior active membership. Club officers may also elect to past-service membership any club member whose own classification is lost due to a situation beyond that individual's control.

**HONORARY** members are elected because of distinguished service in furthering Rotary ideals. They may attend meetings only of the club that elected them, but they do not vote and are not eligible to hold office in the club. Their membership terminates on June 30 following their admission unless the club's board votes to continue membership for another year.

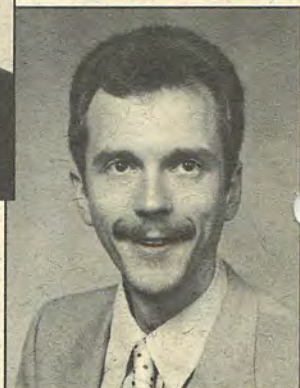

## **SANTA ROSA SUNRISE ROTARY TO SUPPORT INTERNATIONAL CATARACT PROJECT**

Santa Rosa Sunrise Rotary, in association with Djakarta Rotary, has adopted the International Cataract Project as our World Community Service Project this year.

The city of Djakarta has at least 3 million inhabitants below the poverty line with an estimated 70,000 cataract blind and about 9,000 new cataract cases per year. Since there are an estimated 3,000 cataract operations each year, the number of people who will go blind is increasing dramatically every year.

The Rotary Club of Djakarta has joined forces with the Ministry of Health, the Indonesian Ophthalmological Association, the Provincial Health Department and the Helen Keller Institute to establish a Community Eye Care Institution in Djakarta. In the first year the institution would provide:

- 3,000 - 5,000 eye exams
- 600 cataract operations
- 200 other eye operations
- 1000 low cost eyeglasses
- 600 aphakic glasses.

The \$1,000 contribution from Santa Rosa Sunrise will grow to \$4,000, with the matching fund programs which are available through Rotary International.

Our contribution will mean the difference between blindness and sight for at least 600 people per year and primary eye care for thousands more.

Our on-going contact with the Djakarta Rotary is Warren Smith, who brought this program to our attention through his many travels to the area. Warren will keep us updated on the progress of the project.

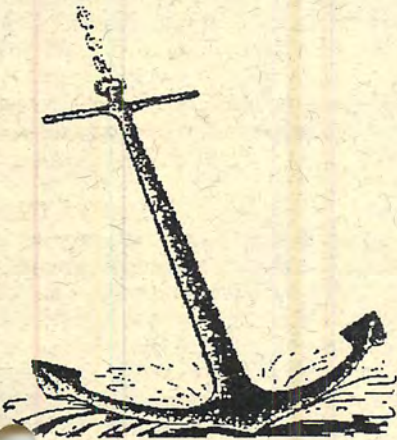

# MEMBERSHIP MONTH

## Proposing a new member...

- The name of a prospective member, proposed by an active, senior active or past service member of the club is submitted to the board in writing, through the club secretary. The proposal is kept confidential throughout the preliminary procedure, and the candidate is not aware of being considered.
- \*The board requests the Classifications Committee to report on the eligibility of the proposed member from the standpoint of classification, and the Membership Committee to investigate and report on the person's eligibility from the standpoint of character, business and social standing, and general eligibility.
- \*The board considers and approves or disapproves the recommendations of the Classifications and Membership committees and then notifies the proposer, through the club secretary, of its decision.
- \*If the board's decision is favorable, the proposer, together with one or more members of the Membership Committee, informs the prospective member of the purposes of Rotary and of the privileges and responsibilities of membership in the club. The prospective Rotarian is then asked to give permission for their name and proposed classification to be published to the club. It is sound practice to invite the candidate to several regular club meetings prior to their meeting with the Membership Committee.
- \*If no written objection to the proposal, stating reasons, is received by the board from any club member within ten days after publication of the name of the prospective member, the latter, upon payment of an admission fee, is considered to be elected to membership. If an objection is filed, the board considers it at a regular or special meeting and votes on the proposed member. If the "no" votes fall below two, the candidate is elected to membership. The club secretary then issues a membership card and reports the new member's name to the General Secretary of Rotary International.
- The individual is then formally introduced at a regular meeting of the club.
