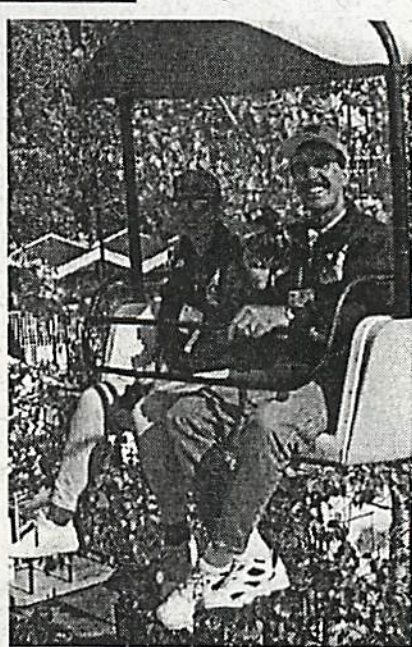

Our weekly meetings are the most important part of the Santa Rosa Sunrise Rotary Club. .

If our meetings are successful -- both entertaining and meaningful -- then we can build on that foundation in everything else that we do.

Attendance is also the cornerstone of our organization. Rotary International has strict attendance rules -- more stringent than most service clubs -- precisely because participation is what makes Rotary successful.

- Rotary requires that each club members must:
  - Attend or make up at least 60% of regular meetings.
  - Attend at least 30% of this club's meetings.

To make up for a missed meeting, club members can attend another Rotary Club meeting up to 14 days BEFORE the missed meeting or 14 days AFTER the miss. Also counting toward attendance is attending an Interact Club meeting (at the direction of the club), attending Rotary district assemblies, conferences or committees (at the direction of the district governor) or the Rotary International Convention.

Club members MUST be dropped from the club if they miss four consecutive meetings without making up.

The flip side of the attendance requirement, is the enjoyment of making up. Attending another Santa Rosa Rotary club can be interesting and informative, while attending in another state or country can be the highlight of a trip.
