The greeter was the meeting was Ezbon Jen, the pledge was led by Peter Trelea and Steve Amend let us with an inspirational thought.


Visitors included Larry Wassem (Windsor club), Becky Christianson (friend of Ni Aita) and Alexander Stark (descendent of Jon Stack)

The item committee will be calling everyone this week to see what you have lin and perhaps help with some ideas. Let's support their early efforts rather than until the last week or two.



The Nonviolent Peaceforce

Talk and Discussions by **Dr. Shall Sinha**

The idea of a **Shanti Sena** (or Nonviolent Peace Force) was conceived and develow by Mahatma Gandhi - for overcoming violence in many parts of India - and ha applied by many leaders around the world to achieve sustainable peace without of any violence. Dr. Martin Luther King, for example, employed the same tech during his **Civil Rights Movement** in US.

The vision of **the Nonviolent Peaceforce** is to train and build a Peace Army cabeing deployed in any part of the world for overcoming violence and buildir sustainable peace without using any kind of violence. A Pilot Project, employed Lanka, has proved the feasibility and long term benefits of a *Peace Army* and a now being made to train and deploy *Peace Army Soldiers* (or the Nonviolent Peace Arms) in various parts of the world that are currently experiencing human environmental and other kinds of losses.

Dr. Shall Sinha is a Gandhi Scholar and has studied the Principles and Practic Nonviolent Peace Force and his wife, Pramila Sinha, is a member of the Secon Team of the Nonviolent Peaceforce in Sri Lanka. Dr. Sinha is also the author of including 'Words of Wisdom from Mahatma Gandhi'.
