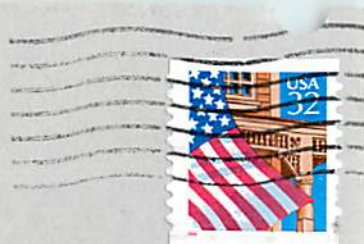

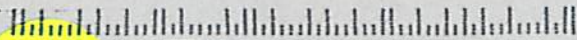


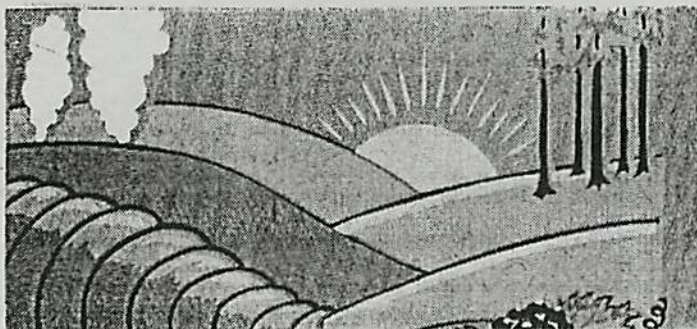

Coming Programs

Steele Lane Dedication

This Thursday will mark the culmination of nearly 18 months of effort for the Sunrise Rotary Club's largest Community Services project ever. Instead of meeting for breakfast, we will host a dedication ceremony for our Steele Lane School Fields project.

This is not a meeting to miss -- for many reasons:

1) It's an opportunity to showcase what our club has done.

Seldom do we toot our own horns -- and this is our chance.

2) We have invited many community leaders -- from schools and the city -- and this is an opportunity to show what businesses and business leaders can do with very little government assistance. We also filled a need that our schools (and government) could not provide.

3) This is an opportunity to honor those who helped us.

4) It will end a project that included thousands of hours of time from our club members, \$45,000 from our fund raising events and a huge commitment to carry the project through.

Our Rotary District 5130 Governor, Larry Kavanaugh of Eureka, has said he intends to drive down to attend the ceremony -- just four days after finishing the major event of his year, the District Conference in Eureka.

The dedication ceremony is being organized by Director Pat Solar, who's in charge of club Community Services, along with Vicki Lockner, club member and school principal.

In attendance at the lunch barbecue will be 450 Steele Lane students, and invited guests -- businesses who helped with our project, Santa Rosa school officials, Santa Rosa city officials, Rotary district leaders and the media.

The ceremony will begin at 11:30 with check-in, 11:40 lunch and then a ceremony from 12:15 to 12:35. The pupils will eat before us and sit on the edge of the grass as the program starts.

June 12

Our guest speaker will be Michael Sullivan, who is president and CEO of Flex Products of Santa Rosa.

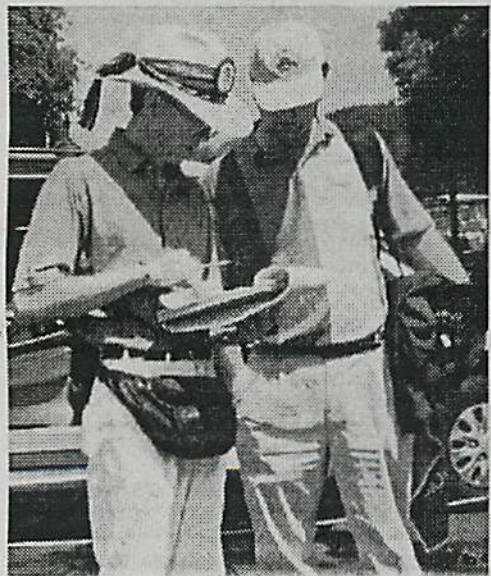

Club Honors

At the Rotary District 5130 Conference held two weeks ago in Eureka, Santa Rosa Sunrise Rotary Club officers came home with an armload of awards for our club's 1996-97 year, including first place awards in three of the four Avenues of Service.

The awards were presented in the medium sized club category (from 50 to 75 members):

Community Service, First Place

We were honored for our Steele Lane School Fields project, led by club member Leroy Carlenzoli. Although this \$140,000 project spanned more than one Rotary year, the category is for projects completed during this year.

Vocational Service, First Place

We were honored for our two Club Job Fairs, organized by Director Steve Olsen. The job fairs were quite unique.

District Governor Larry Kavanaugh, in a letter to the club after his visit in the fall, said, "Your club vocational job fair was and is a great idea."

World Community Service, First Place

Our World Community Service project of raising \$29,000 to send medical supplies to Croatia -- a project led by Director Dale Zumfelde over a more than two year period -- was honored.

Homer Wood Award

Our Croatia project was also honored as the BEST World Community Services Project in the entire District 5130's 41 clubs. We competed against clubs more than four times our size.

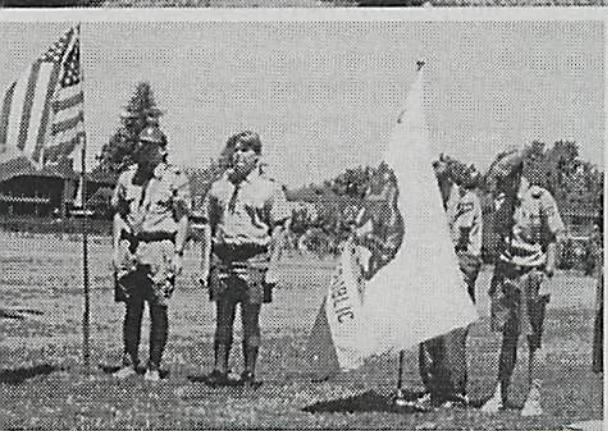
Club of the Year!!

Cancun School project

Completing a project launched during Dan Davis' year as president (1994-95) the club Board of Directors approved \$750 for improvements to a school in Cancun, Mexico.

The project was started by club member John Jones following the club's first eyeglass project, when about 600 eyeglasses were distributed in small villages in Cancun.

Our club's \$750 is matched with \$750 from the district, \$1,500 from the Cancun Hotel Zone Rotary Club and \$3,000 from Rotary International -- for a total project of \$6,000.

The project is to install a kitchen at a trade school in Cancun.

President's Corner

It has been a tremendous honor to serve as president of the Sunrise Rotary Club for this past year -- it has been an incredible journey for me and I hope for the club as well.

It has also been a humbling experience. To realize that I was only one of 28,284 Rotary club presidents -- all trying to accomplish projects in their community and in the world -- is unbelievable.

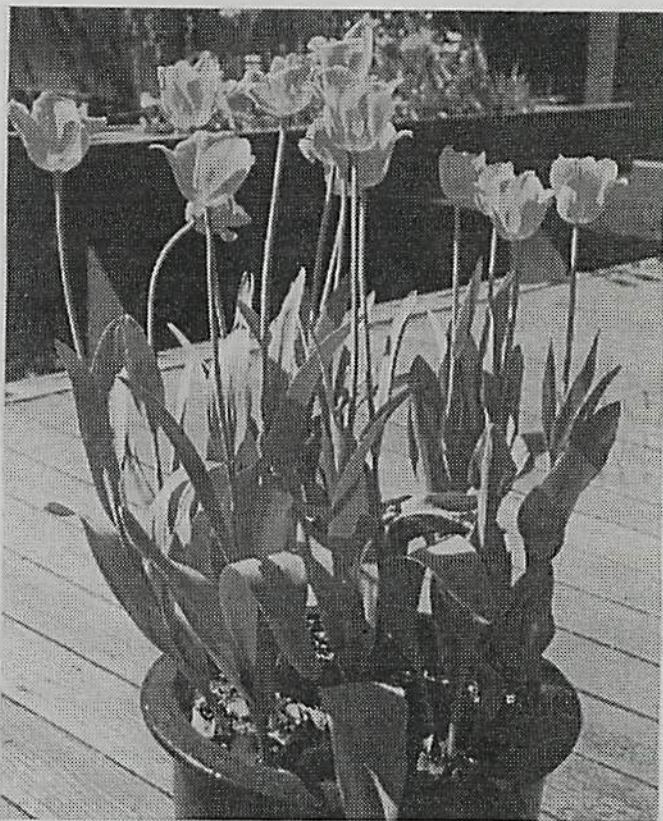
