Gary started his pharmacy career in 1972 with a bachelor of science degree in pharmacy from Oregon State. After an internship at Salem Memorial Hospital, he returned to California as a pharmacist at Valley Memorial Hospital in Livermore. Five years later Gary became Director of Pharmacy at Santa Rosa's Community Hospital but greener pastures called again and he moved on to Apria Healthcare where he is currently Director of Pharmacy. Gary is a past-president of North Coast Society of Hospital Pharmacists and a member of the Continuing Education Committee. He was an adjunct faculty member at Chabot College school of nursing and is an assistant clinical pharmacy professor at U.C.S.F. He is also known as one of the local AIDS therapy experts.

There has been a marked shift in hospital services toward home IV therapy. Why? What kind of therapy does home infusion provide? How do patients qualify and who pays for this home therapy? What type of interaction is there between the physician, pharmacist and nurse? Learn the answers on June 11.

The Golf Tournament Report by Steve Herron

This year's tournament was a solid success in any number of measurements, even though we fell just short of a sell-out on players. The total number was 140 (including the absence of the Aitas). The financial results will come in at about \$20,700 net profit to the club after all expenses. This represents an increase over last year's net of approx. \$18,000, when we sold out at 144 players. Key reasons for this increase: we raised the price by \$25.00 per player, which did not seem to change participation materially. We also had great support from Tee Sponsors (49 in all @ \$125 each) and Corporate Sponsors (11 for a total of \$3,500 in income). Expenses were well managed based on our prior experience.

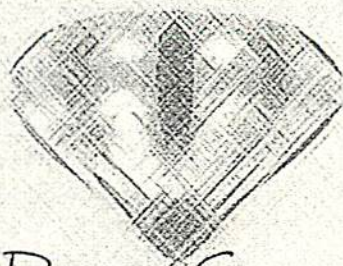

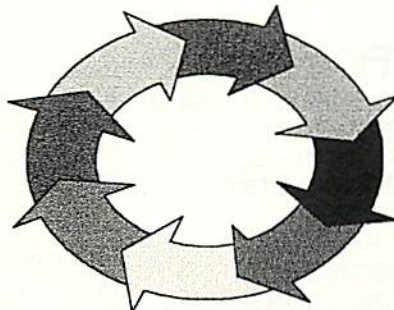

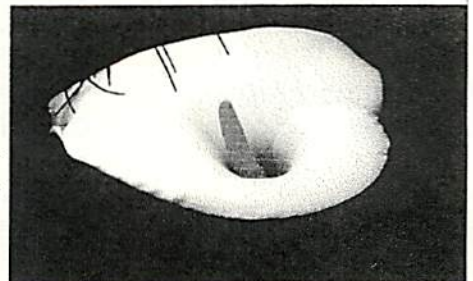
