INTERACT

The following examples were drawn from Interact Club Projects Data Forms submitted in the past year.



- The Interact Club of Princess Wales College in Moratuwa, Sri Lanka, aided residents of the nearby village of Welikanda, in the Polonnaruwa district, after a terrorist attack The Interactors circulated among their school and community collecting dry goods, clothing and medical supplies to distribute to the victims.
- The Interact Club of Brentwood High School, in Brentwood, New York, U.S.A, participated in an environmental project aimed at saving a stretch of natural habitat known as the "Bishop Tract." Once described as the "world's finest remaining example of an oak brush plain," the Bishop Tract in recent years had been overrun by widespread private and commercial polluting. Working together with their sponsoring Rotary club and several other community organizations, the Interactors helped to return the habitat to its natural state. The club not only participated in massive community-wide clean-up campaigns, but also hosted a series of lectures to heighten awareness among community residents about the ecological treasure in their midst.
- When the Interact Club of Spaulding High School in Vermont, USA, learned from its sponsoring Rotary club of the need for toothbrushes at an orphanage in Buzau, Romania, club members were quick to respond. The Interactors solicited local dentists for donations of children's tooth brushes and other dental supplies and also donated "sippy" cups and orthopedic spoons. This wasn't the first contact the Interactors had had with the orphanage, which has been helped considerably in recent years by their sponsors, the Rotary Club of Barre; the Interact club has hosted Romanian students and Interactors have visited Buzau in return.
- Trying to think of novel fundraising idea to benefit the Nelson Mandela Children's Fund, members of the Interact

Club of Our Lady of Fatima Convent, South Africa, truly used their noodles. The Interactors decided to make the longest piece of spaghetti in the world—a strand one-mile long! (See photo.) It took 40 Interactors 48 hours to complete it. The Interactors received



considerable community support and media coverage for the event, and while the money raised through sponsorship went to the children's fund, the over-sized pasta was donated to local charities.

The Interact Club of Kellogg, USA and the Interact Club Castlegar, Canada joined in an international environmental project near Priest Lake in the Panhandle National Forest in northern Idaho. Thirty members of the Castlegar club and 18 members of the Kellogg club along with exchange students from Finland, France, Denmark, Argentina, Mexico, and Slovakia helped to build a section of the Chipmunk Rapids National Recreation Trail. he trail will be used by hikers in the summer and cross country skiers and snowmobilers in the winter. The group cleared the brush and, after preparing a bed for the new portion of trail, hauled and spread gravel for the trail surface. While equipment and machinery for the job were supplied by the U.S. Forest Service, the Interactors coordinated the project and raised the necessary funds. When the work was done, the Interactors had a barbecue and discussed plans for their next joint project.

We have thirteen club members signed up for the Interact Leadership Conference on March 17th, 18th and 19th. The conference will be held at Alliance Redwoods in Occidental and will consist of three days of leadership training, inspirational speakers, skits and a Saturday night dance party. Of particular interest to Rotarians is an event that takes place on Saturday morning, March 18th, from 9:00 to 12 noon. Each Interact Club will do a presentation on last years projects. Visiting Rotarians are always welcome - inspiration guaranteed! Mark your calendar.

Our next Interact Club meeting at Elsie Allen High School is scheduled for Thursday, March 9th from 12:30 to 1:00 PM in Room I-24. Sunrise club members are welcome - check in at the office - bring your lunch... it counts as a make-up meeting.



Rotaract is a Rotarysponsored service club for young men and women ages 18 to 30. Rotaract



clubs can be either community- or university-based, and are sponsored by local Rotary clubs. In addition to undertaking projects to assist their local communities and to advance international understanding, Rotaractors, club members are commonly called, also engage in activities related professional development and leadership training.

The first Rotaract club was chartered on 13 March, 1968, in North Charlotte, North Carolina, U.S.A. Today there are nearly 6,554 Rotaract clubs in 146 countries with an estimated 150,000 members. Each year, Rotaractors from around the globe have the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas during a forum scheduled immediately prior to the annual Rotary Convention.

Each Rotaract club is required to undertake a minimum of two service projects annually; one to benefit its own community, the other to advance Rotary's

Lawrence L. Tracy

"Presentation Skills in a Nutshell:

The 'Shortcut System' to Speaking Excellence."

"An extraordinarily effective speaker was how President Ronald Reagan described Larry Tracy. He now conducts workshops and seminars for

business executives, State Department diplomats, and federal government officials, enabling them to improve their ability to speak with clarity and persuasion before even difficult groups.

He is a retired Army colonel, and formerly managed and trained the Pentagon's top briefing team. He was responsible for the daily strategic intelligence presentation to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Secretary of Defense as well as other Washington decision-makers. He was later "borrowed" by the State Department, due to his speaking skills, to debate foreign policy issues throughout the United States. In the next three years, he made over 400 presentations before demanding and skeptical audiences, leading to the observation from "The Great Communicator."

He has appeared on numerous television programs, including Crossfire, Nightline, CNN Worldnews, and The MacNeil/Lehrer Newshour. A graduate of St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia, he holds an MA from Georgetown University, where he also did extensive postgraduate studies, and is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College and the Inter-American Defense College.

Larry Tracy speaks fluent Spanish, has lived in Argentina and Bolivia, and is a frequent guest on Spanish-language television programs. He also conducts workshops in Spanish for Latin American executives who must make presentations in English, helping them learn to do so in the time-sensitive, "bottom line" style to which U.S. clients are accustomed.



Emergency Action



Call the emergency medical service immediately. If you can get to a hospital faster by car, have someone drive you. If you are with someone having "signals," expect a denial. But insist on getting help.

Emergency Medical Service phone:

Nearest hospital with 24-hour emergency

Warning Signals

Heart Attack

- Uncomfortable pressure, fullness, squeezing or pain in the center of the chest lasting more than a few
- minutes. Pain spreading to the shoulders,
- neck or arms Chest discomfort with lightheadedness, fainting, sweating, nausea or
- shortness of breath.

 Not all of these signals occur in every attack. If some occur, get help fast!

Stroke (Brain Attack)

- Sudden weakness or numbness of the face, arm or leg on one
- side of the body. Sudden dimness or loss of vision,
- particularly in one eye.

 Loss of speech, or trouble talking or understanding speech
- Sudden severe headaches with no known cause.
- Unexplained dizziness, unsteadiness or sudden falls, especially along with any of the previous symptoms

April 6, 2000 GSE TEAM FROM INDIA

Since its inception in 1965, the Group Study Exchange program has provided grants for countless teams of men and women in the early stages of their business and professional careers to GSE Team Member travel abroad and share vocational information with the Michelle Julene representatives of their respective professions in another



country. Team members spend four to six weeks studying the host country's institutions, economy, and culture, while observing how their own professions are practiced abroad. More than 500 exchanges between paired Rotary districts occur each year, advancing the program's ultimate goal of promoting international understanding and goodwill.

Rotary districts select teams comprising four non-Rotarians and one Rotarian leader, engaged in different businesses and professions. Each of two paired districts sends and receives a team for a four- to six-week study program. Pairings are usually determined by The Rotary Foundation's trustees to ensure wide geographical distribution, but exchanges can also be arranged by the participating districts.

While visiting abroad, GSE team members follow a carefully planned itinerary, including visits to government and cultural institutions, schools, religious and historic sites and other points of interest. In addition, each member spends at least five days studying and observing the practice of his or her profession in the host district.

The Foundation grant funds round-trip air transportation for each team member. Rotarians provide lodging in their homes, meals, and group travel, allowing the opportunity for participants to become acquainted with the customs and culture of the people in their host district.
