PROPOSED AMENDMENT 2 - 1993

- PROPOSED BY -

Past President and Charter Member Kent Seegmiller.

- CURRENT BY-LAW -

ARTICLE VII - Committees

SECTION 1, Paragraph f - The president shall be ex officio a member of all committees and, as such, shall have all the privileges of membership thereof.

- PROPOSED REVISION -

SECTION 1, Paragraph f - The president shall be ex officio a member of all committees, with the exception of the Nomination Committee, and, as such, shall have the privileges of membership thereon.

- RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE -

It was never the intention of the authors of the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa Sunrise By-Laws to include the current president as an ex officio member of the ~~Nominating~~ Committee. This is best indicated by ARTICLE VII, SECTION 1 of the by-laws which states "At least one month prior to the annual meeting, the presiding officer shall appoint a nominating committee to be made up of the five (5) immediate past Presidents of the club who still retain membership in the club other than honorary."

This nomination procedure (with the exclusion of the "presiding officer"), is consistent with the By-Laws of District 5130.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 2 - 1993

- PROPOSED BY -

Past President and Charter Member Dave Lorenzen.

- CURRENT BY-LAW -

ARTICLE I - Election of Directors and Officers

SECTION 1 - At least one month prior to the annual meeting, the presiding officer shall appoint a nominating committee to be made up of the five (5) immediate past Presidents of the club who still retain membership in the club other than honorary. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be the member with the longest tenure as Past-President and the vice-chairman shall be the member with the next longest tenure as Past-President. This committee shall place before the club one nomination for each of the following: President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and three (3) Directors. Additional nominations may be presented by the club members from the floor. If there are no further nominations, the election may be held at this meeting. If there are further nominations, all nominations duly made shall be placed on a ballot in alphabetical order under each office and shall be voted for at the next regular meeting. The candidates for President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and the three Directors receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected to their respective offices. Term of office for President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer shall be one year. Term of office for Directors shall be two years.

- PROPOSED REVISION -

ARTICLE I - Election of Directors and Officers

SECTION 1 - At least one month prior to the annual meeting, the presiding officer shall appoint a nominating committee to be made up of the five (5) immediate past Presidents of the club who still retain membership in the club other than honorary. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be the member with the longest tenure as Past-President and the vice-chairman shall be the member with the next longest tenure as Past-President. This committee shall place before the club one nomination for each of the following: President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer,

and three (3) Directors. Additional nominations may be presented by the club members from the floor. If there are no further nominations, the election may be held at this meeting. If there are further nominations, all nominations duly made shall be placed on a ballot in alphabetical order under each office and shall be voted for at the next regular meeting. The candidates for President, President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and the three Directors receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected to their respective offices. Term of office for President and President-Elect shall be one year. Term of office for Secretary and Treasurer shall be two years, with each term beginning on alternate years. Term of office for Directors shall be two years.

- RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE -

Since the charter of the Rotary Club of Santa Rosa Sunrise, it has proved to be a tremendous benefit to each successive President, to have at least one office of either Secretary or Treasurer occupied by a member with one year experience in the office. This affords an opportunity to better lead the club with at least one experienced Secretary or Treasurer.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 1 - 1993

- PROPOSED BY -

Past President and Charter Member Kent Seegmiller.

- CURRENT BY-LAW -

ARTICLE I - Election of Directors and Officers

Section 2 - The officers and directors so elected shall constitute the Board of Directors.

- PROPOSED REVISION -

Section 2 - The officers and directors, so elected, together with the immediate Past President, shall constitute the Board of Directors.

- RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE -

To be consistent with ARTICLE II, SECTION 1 which states: "The governing body of this club shall be the Board of Directors, consisting of eleven (11) members of this club, namely six (6) directors elected in accordance with ARTICLE I, Section 1, of these by-laws, the President, the President-Elect, the Secretary, the Treasurer and the immediate Past President."

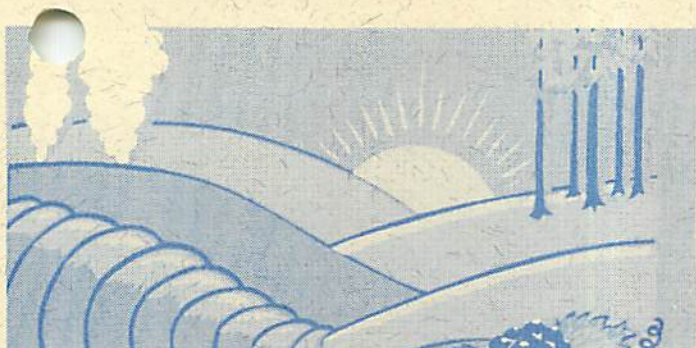

KEEP "THREE STRIKES AND YOU'RE OUT" IN BASEBALL

As the father of two young children, I am as concerned as the next person about violent crimes being committed in our community by repeat offenders. However, notwithstanding the interesting presentation given at our weekly meeting on May 26th, I don't believe that "three strikes and you're out" legislation is the appropriate response. Consider the arguments and the facts:

1. "Released convicts show no signs of having been rehabilitated, and only end up committing more crimes." This may be true, but it wrongly implies that rehabilitation has been attempted. As another recent guest speaker told us, prisoners basically spend their days hanging around, maybe working out a little. Few meaningful efforts to train the unskilled or rehabilitate those with anti-social attitudes or substance abuse problems are made. In this context, it's no wonder these people come out of prison much as they went in.

2. "It may cost a lot of money, but we can't afford not to spend it." Ignoring the fact that we have a huge budget deficit in California while still underfunding schools and other essential services, "three strikes" expenses are unwarranted. Do we really want to pay for the lifetime incarceration of felons convicted of two non-violent felonies followed by such "violent" felonies as punching a guard at the Santa Rosa Plaza in the face? We may like the idea emotionally, but the price is too high. Again, a recent speaker noted that we already have three brand new, empty prisons in this state - - empty because we can't afford to staff them. Doubling the state's prison population won't ease the financial burden, and think of the likelihood of "rehabilitating" those who will be released from such overcrowded institutions.

One response we heard this morning was, "Think of the trials we WON'T be paying for as the career criminals remain in jail." I prefer to think of all the trials we WILL be paying for that we have avoided paying for until now. Formerly, a person arrested on several felony counts might enter into a plea bargain, pleading guilty to one or two of the lesser felonies. Who will do that now, knowing that ANY prior felony conviction can carry so much weight in future sentencing? There is no money in any of the "three strikes" proposals (or in the legislation already passed and signed by Governor Wilson) for more court construction or more judges. Soon, all of the judicial time will be spent on criminal matters; civil litigants will be locked out of the courthouse.

3. "We need tougher laws to make criminals think twice." Nice concept, but remember the anecdote about the defendant who said the new law shouldn't apply to him because he hadn't heard about it? Let's face it, we're not exactly talking about the sort of people who read the newspaper while sipping their lattes each morning. In any event, most of those arrested will simply be replaced by other criminals who see new territory open up as their "competition" becomes indisposed. Then we'll need even tougher laws, with even greater expense.

KEEP "THREE STRIKES AND YOU'RE OUT" IN BASEBALL

Congressional candidate Mike Nugent proposes "use a gun in the commission of a crime, go to jail for life." Wow, that's REALLY tough! What's next, "think about using a gun in teh commission of a crime, go to jail for life"?

I'm all for tough sentencing laws, such as requiring serving out full terms and stiff enhancements for repeat offenders. I'm also for allowing the courts to exercise discretion in meting out appropriate sentences to meet the circumstances of the crime and the defendant's history. But ultimately, as with any problem, the solution must come from addressing the causes rather than the symptoms. This means starting with young children, imparting good values and teaching them respect for authority.

Finally, consider the "three strikes" initiatives which we will soon see on the ballot. "Three strikes" legislation already in on the books in California. Why have an initiative? Backers answer that only by amending the state constitution can we be sure that legislators won't gut the law now contained in statutes. Unfortunately, for years now we have taken the constitutional amendment approach when "we, the people" have been moved to action. Sadly, this makes a joke of the significance of the constitution itself, which is supposed to be an organizational schematic for government setting forth fundamental PRINCIPLES - - not specific laws and penalties - - which that government is charged with upholding. Also, legislators' hands become tied, making a mockery of representative government. Both of these results undermine the very nature of the society we claim to be trying to preserve in enacting laws such as "three strikes and you're out."
