Sonoma County Survivor Project

Essence of Acceptance

For the past 10 years, the Sonoma County Survivor Project has offered a way to confront prejudice and hatred, creating pathways to acceptance. Through photography, oral history and educational techniques, the Survivor Project has worked with the community to



present personal histories of those who lost human and/or civil rights. The Survivor Project has become a catalyst for positive change through introspection and application.

The Essence of Acceptance is a challenging, new community-based program that is focused on promoting understanding and acceptance of human diversity through education, oral history and the arts. The program joins efforts of the community and schools to create dynamic, transformational experiences for students, interviewees and community members at large. It is intended to teach people of all backgrounds to cross cultural barriers and come to know, understand and ultimately accept one another with the dignity and respect due all human beings.

The program teaches students about human rights, including the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and about rights granted by the constitutions of various countries. Students interview someone in their community who has suffered a loss of human rights. They are taught how to conduct oral history interviews and use artistic forms of communication. This program meets the state mandates to teach a "Holocaust and Genocide" curriculum.

Peter Hoberg also announced the Rotary





POLIO PLUS

Nearly 6 million Afghan children were administered the oral polio vaccine during National Immunization Days on 16-18 April. Participating in the house-to-house effort as vaccinators, mobilizers, supervisors and monitors, some 60,000 Afghan volunteers and health workers brought their country a step closer to the goal of polio eradication.

Since 1994, when the first vaccination days were launched in Afghanistan, Rotarians have assisted by contributing funds and, sometimes under the most difficult situations, participating in immunization activities. To date, The Rotary Foundation has contributed more than US\$5 million towards polio-eradication efforts in the country.



Currently, Potenza is developing large three dimensional art. The events of September 11th have brought a new focus to Potenza's artwork and she continues to prove that "One person can make a difference."




Last Week in Review - The Eagle Scouts of Troop 135
