



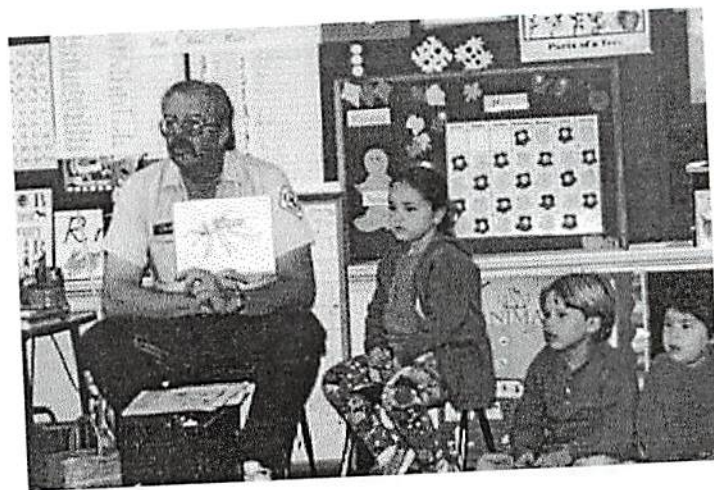

EYEGLASS PROJECT AIRS ON LOCAL TV

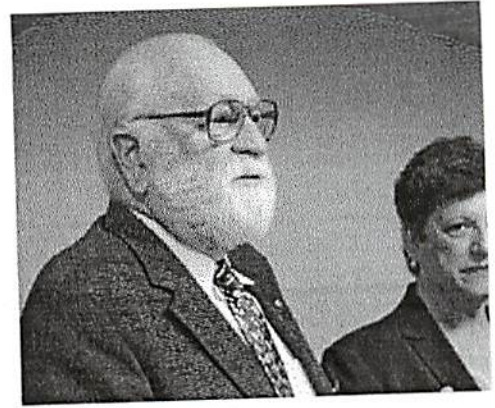
