## The Rotary Foundation's "Polio Plus" Program

This is RI's program to provide polio vaccines and mobilize community resources to support international efforts to immunize the children of the world against Polio. It is the Foundation's goal to eradicate poliomyelitis from the world entirely. For any approved national organization or regional immunization program, RI will provide polio vaccines for a five year period toward this objective.

Polio was selected by the Foundation for support because of the magnitude of the problem. This disease kills 20,000 children and permanently cripples another 200,000 each year worldwide!!! Ironically, the treatment for preventing the spread of Polio is relatively inexpensive...about only \$0.15 per immunization. RI works with major international organizations to carry out this work, including UNICEF, the World Health Organization and others to continue the work after RI's 5-year commitment has ended. In addition to financial support for the vaccines, Rotarians worldwide provide needed publicity, community education, transportation, storage, etc. in this effort.

So remember, your generous pledge of \$100.00 can provide enough vaccine to immunize over 600 children throughout the world!!!

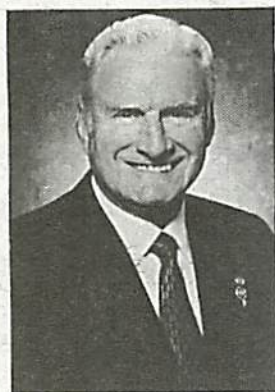

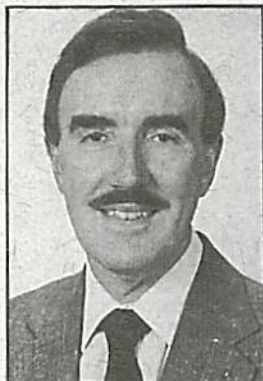

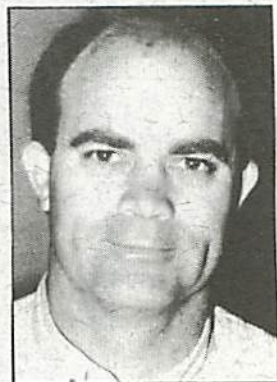

## **Rotary Foundation Month**

In recognition of this special month, this space will be dedicated to expanding on just a few of the key programs underwritten through your personal contributions to your Paul Harris Fund.

### **Special Matching Grants**

The Rotary Foundation makes available certain Special Matching Grants to co-fund projects which are charitable in nature or related to basic education and international scope. These grants are available for a wide range of activities, including: health, water, sanitation, agricultural and educational needs. The key theme is to leverage individual club resources with those of the Foundation, in order to address a critical need in a foreign country.

These grants can be applied for by any Rotary club for submission to Rotary Foundation for ultimate approval. A key requirement is that the sponsoring (applying) Rotary club must provide (at least) an equal amount of the total project funding from its own resources, and at least 50% of those (sponsor's) contributions must come from outside of the recipient's country. The maximum amount of a Special Matching Grant is \$50,000. RI maintains a World Community Service Projects Exchange list, which identifies numerous international projects underway qualifying for Special Matching Grants.

**An excellent example of the Special Matching Grant process is the project undertaken by the Sunrise Club for a hospital located in the former Soviet Republic. Our next installment will examine that project in detail...stay tuned!!!**

# Proposed Change to Article V of Santa Rosa Sunrise Rotary By-Laws

1. No Deletions from current text of Article V.
2. One addition to Article V to include Section 4 which would read as shown below:

## Article V

Section 4 - Each member shall be obligated to fund raise not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250 ) during each Rotary year. A record of each members fund raising effort will be maintained for each fiscal year. Any deficit will be assessed to the applicable member at the end of each fiscal year. Upon majority board approval, a member may be granted a one time exemption from adherence to this section.

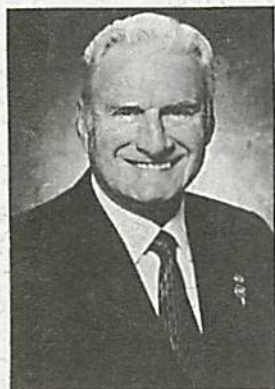

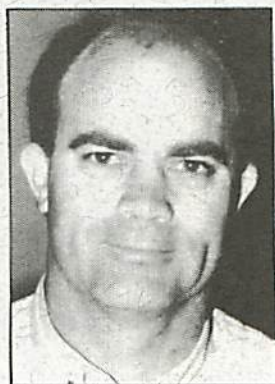
