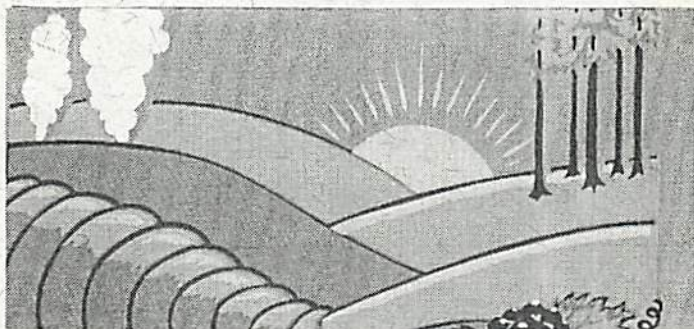

# President's corner

**The Cornerstone of Rotary** is attendance. Through attendance we experience what Rotary is all about: Helping others, making a difference in our community and in the world, and fellowship with others who come from a variety of backgrounds and careers.

Without attendance, Rotary would not be a very successful organization, nor would we accomplish what we have as a club.

As your president, I have been working diligently at trying to make Rotary enjoyable. If Rotary meetings and events are worthwhile -- meaningful enough that they're worth attending -- then everything else the club stands for will fit into place.

Our club is among the bottom 12 of 40 clubs in District 5130 in attendance. While our 78% attendance is adequate, the mid-80s are the norm. Our club attendance should be closer to 90%.

While most of us cannot attend every meeting, Rotary provides every opportunity.

**Making up is one of the Joys of Rotary:** Only about one-third of our club members have attended a meeting of another Rotary Club this year -- missing an opportunity to witness the strength of our worldwide organization.

Some of my most enjoyable moments in Rotary have been at other clubs. Hearing Jim Otto, a hall of famer from the Oakland Raiders, speak at a meeting in Sacramento, becoming the impromptu speaker at a meeting in Avalon, Catalina Island, being one of six Rotarians attending a club in Bali, sitting next to an Austrian business associate of Kent Seegmiller (our president at the time) while attending a meeting in Vienna, sampling fine French wines at a luncheon club in Paris. At each of these meetings, I was welcomed as if I was a next-door neighbor.

**Rotarians are instant friends** in any community.

Rotary's attendance requirements are not difficult. A Rotarian must attend 60 percent of meetings, with half of those in the home club. No more than three meetings can be missed consecutively. Makeup requirements are easy. You have two weeks before and two weeks after a missed meeting to attend another club.
