The B-2 Stealth Bomber - 11/20

With the success of radar-evading, or stealth, aircraft in the Persian Gulf War, public interest in this revolutionary new technology has grown. In response to that interest, Northrop Grumman is offering a presentation that discusses the role bombers play in national security affairs, and the unique features of the B-2 bomber (pictured at right) - the latest generation in stealth aircraft.

The Stealth Bomber

Dennis C. "Doc" Beyma, our speaker Thursday, is with the B-2 Engineering Department, Northrop Grumman Corporation. He entered the United States Marine Corps in 1962, graduated from infantry officer training and Naval Flight Training in 1964 and received orders to Vietnam for a split tour flying the CH-46A Sea Knight helicopter and as an infantry company commander. Mr. Beyma also flew the A-4 Skyhawk while on active duty from 1962 to 1989. During his tour he was a Company, Squadron, Group and Battalion Commander. He was also the lead developer and instructor for the Marine Corps' Air Weapons and Tactics School at Yuma, Arizona. In 1989, he retired from the Corps with the rank of Colonel, and began working for Northrop Grumman Corporation in 1990 as a B-2 System Safety and Human Factors technical specialist. Mr. Beyma has a commercial pilots license for both helicopters and multi-engine aircraft.

Mr. Beyma received a bachelor's degree from Sacramento State University in 1962 and a Master Degree from Webster University, St. Louis, in 1980. He lives in Irvine, California with his wife, Juanita.

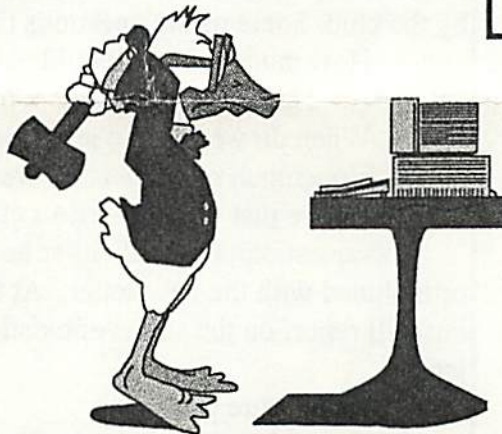

EDITOR'S COLUMN:

I have been reading with interest the discussions going on in the Press Democrat concerning the issue of noise at the airport. I guess the increasing traffic there has created increasing noise which has become an annoyance. Now they are trying to figure out what to do about it. That issue of course is not peculiar to Sonoma County. I was recently back in Ohio and it seems there is a similar controversy raging in Toledo.

Several years ago, the city made several concessions (tax abatements, facility improvements, etc.) to an air freight business that wanted to use the Toledo Airport as its hub. They flew many planes into the airport at night, sorted packages, and flew out again before dawn. Business was good which meant more and more flights every night. Of course more flights meant more noise and more noise meant less and less sleep for nearby residents. The debate raged. Since it was an election year, of course it became a political issue. The mayor of Toledo had the solution for reducing and ultimately eliminating all complaints. He proposed that the city would pay to relocate all of the deaf and hard of hearing residents into the homes around the airport. Certainly an unassailable logic is at work here, and I guess that proves that even logic can have its limits.
