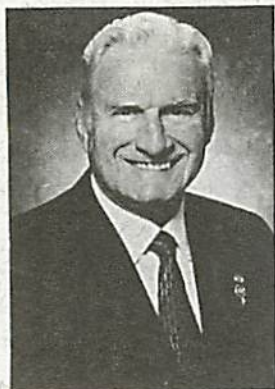

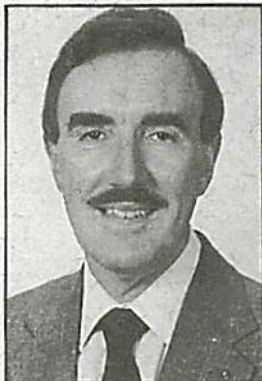

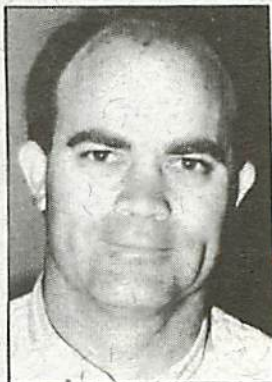

Daniel Brewer: "I felt like a guest wherever I went. When ordering food, asking for directions in Tokyo, or taking a taxi and getting recommendations for things to see in Kyoto, everyone was patient, helpful and remarkably skilled at overcoming the language barrier. When I lost my wallet in Tokyo, the police and guards at the hostel were actually concerned about my problem. Each new restaurant we went to had a waiter more friendly, or an owner more jolly than the last one. The most powerful experience for me was the Farewell Dinner as we left our host families in Kagoshima. It would be hard to explain if you weren't there. I am truly happy that I was."

Peter Kirsch: "When I stepped off the airplane at SFO (on return), I felt that something was missing...the countless friendships and experiences (of the trip). I can continue the friendships with correspondence, and the experiences will not be gone from my memory, but I long for the day-to-day adventures we were able to be a part of in Japan. Not once throughout Japan did I meet anyone harboring anything but goodwill. The best times happened at "home" in the living room, sitting and talking with my host brother, sisters, and parents. It did not matter if I was helping my sister with her homework or learning new words from my (host) Mom, there was always a sense of togetherness. It wasn't the big, bustling city of Tokyo that would win a place in my heart, but the country roads and friendly people of Kagoshima."
